MINUTES OF THE WHEELER CITY COUNCIL

JULY 18, 2011
7:00 P.M. AT CITY HALL

Council members present: Mayor, Bob McCain, Walter Simmons, Barbra Koelzer, Stacy McCasland, Don Rose, and Kendall Hefley. Also present: Kristi Petit, Paul Arganbright, Claudine Finsterwald, Frank Clymer, Charles Kuntz. Guests present: Scott Honeyfield and Marco Lopez w/Parkhill, Smith & Cooper, and Bill Stiles

Mayor, Bob McCain called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. Stacy McCasland made a motion to approve the June minutes as presented, seconded by Barbra Koelzer. 5 voting for and 0 against. Don Rose motioned to approve

the payment of bills, seconded by Walter Simmons. Motion carried with 5 voting for and 0 against.

Bill Stiles addressed the council about building a 60 x 60 hangar at the City airport. Walter Simmons motioned to allow Mr. Stiles to build the hangar and enter into a 99 yr lease with a one time fee of \$150.00. Barbra Koelzer seconded the motion. Motion carried with 5 for and 0 against.

The city financial statement was presented by Charles Kuntz.

Scott Honeyfield, city engineer, presented an evaluation of nitrate plumes studied in the Wheeler area and recommendations for future well development. His company, Parkhill, Smith, & Cooper will continue to work with Paul

Arganbright to contact landowners for more testing of possible well sites. He reported that we need to acquire the water rights of a 1/2 section of land in order to dig a well capable of pumping 300 gallons a minute. He recom-

mended “area A” in the evaluation memorandum. Area “A” is located approximately 4 miles west of Wheeler.

Paul Arganbright reported that the city pool passed state inspection.

Stacy McCasland made a motion to accept FSB of Mobeetie as the City depository bank. Barbra Koelzer seconded. The motion carried with 5 voting in favor of and 0 against.

Rites Are Read For Noah A. Horton, 91


Noah A. Horton, age 91, of Marshall, Arkansas passed from this life on Friday, July 22, 2011 at St. John's Health Systems in Springfield, Missouri. He was born in Bear Creek, Arkansas on June 17, 1920 to Andrew Horton and Maude (Wright) Horton.

Noah was drafted into the United States Army on February 2, 1942 at the age of 21. He trained as a surgical technician at Camp Gordon, GA where his first assignment was with the 4th Infantry Division, 12th Regiment Medical Detachment.

Noah arrived in Europe on January 29, 1944. He was involved in the following WWII major battles, engagements and



 - Place something that you will need at your next stop - for example, a purse, lunch, gym bag or briefcase - on the floor of the backseat where the child is sitting. This simple act could help prevent you from accidentally forgetting your child if he or she is sleeping.
 - Be especially careful if you change your routine for dropping off little kids at child care. Have a plan that, if your child is late for child care, you will be called within a few minutes.
 - Teach children not to play in any vehicle.
 - Always lock a vehicle's doors and trunk - especially at home.
 - Watch children closely around vehicles, particularly when loading and unloading. Check to ensure all children leave the vehicle when you reach your destination. Do not overlook sleeping children.

CASA Seeks Volunteer Help

CASA of the High Plains - Serving Donley, Gray, Hansford, Hemphill, Lipscomb, Ochiltree, Roberts, and Wheeler Counties.

CASA of the High Plains is exploring the communities of the surrounding counties for new volunteers. CASA exists to provide trained court-appointed volunteers to advocate for children who have been removed from their home and placed in the foster care system because of abuse and neglect.

Due to neglect and abuse, children are being removed from their homes at one of the highest rates we have seen since the existence of our program which started in 1991. Gray County has the greatest need at this time followed by Donley and Wheeler counties. A volunteer does not have to live in those counties to serve these children.

Through the volunteers work, that child's voice is heard in the court system in a way that it would not be heard if that child did not have a volunteer assigned to their case. A CASA volunteer can impact a child's life forever. They are the one consistent person in that child's life helping them to obtain that safe and permanent home.

CASA volunteer requirements:

- 21 years of age
- Submit an application
- Pass a five point and thorough criminal and CPS background check
- Provide three references
- Interview with CASA staff

After the applicant has passed this checklist, they will enter a 30 hour pre-service training program. This training consists of 24 hour classroom hours and 6 outside reading, homework, and

CASA volunteers serve to advocate for the best interest of the children that they are appointed to. Most CASA volunteers spend an average of 10 hours a month working each case. Volunteers are required to see their children once a month face to face. Communications with Child Protective Services, caseworkers, teachers, therapists, and placement providers (foster parents or relatives) can be done through phone and email communications. The CASA volunteer schedules the visits at a time that is convenient for them, they set their pace.

We have active CASA volun-




