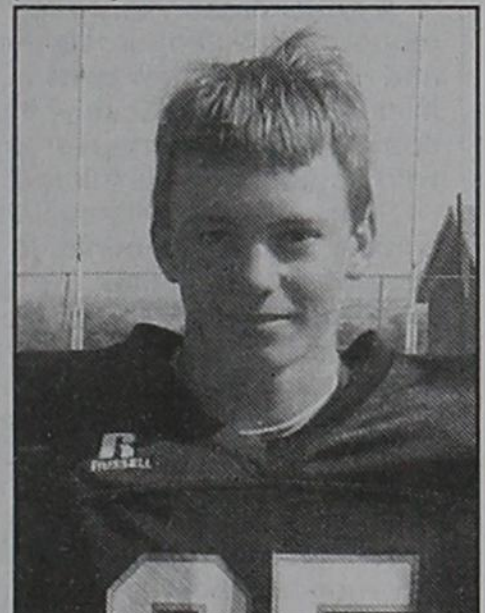
Playoffs Will Begin Saturday Mustangs Meet Booker Sat.

At the close of the regular season, the Mustangs were 5-5 for their season and 3-1 in district. Booker took third in their district with a record of 9-1 season and 2-1 district.

The Wheeler Mustangs forced a turnover on downs at their own 15-yard line with 10 seconds to play Friday, holding off the Memphis Cyclones in a District 2-IA

22 against Canterbury. ("I'm extremely proud of them, even though we lost," Cox said after the match. "I feel like it was a victory. It was the best we've ever done. Just for us to have the opportunity to play where we did and for us to play good. It was just a great season." (Four Lady Lions — Dorcie Gillette, Sarah Heaton, Bailey Wakefield and Abby Altom — were named to the all-tournament team. ("We've really become better and matured a lot," Cox added. "You can't ask for anything better for our seniors, ending out at the state championship. For the other girls to play at such a high level, they just did an amazing job this year. As we're all kind of getting ready to leave, everybody just didn't want it to end."

OLD TIMES NOT FORGOTTEN

DUCK HUNTIN'

Well, it's that time of year again. We'd have "frost on the pumpkin" some mornings, if there'd only been enough rain to plant them last spring.

Hunting season is just around the corner and for a lot of people, that starts them getting busy, trying to get time off from work. Some of the more industrious guys, spend quite a bit of time and money, building "duck blinds." Now, I've only been duck huntin' two times in my life...and that was a long time ago.

The first time was with two of my cousins, their brother-in-law, and my brother. This was kind of a "spur of the moment" huntin' trip. None of us were serious duck hunters. We just drove down to the creek where a beaver dam was, to see if any might be there. Sure enough, we jumped quite a bunch of them and got two or three. Since we were there more for the sport of it, instead of just hungry for duck, we gave them to a neighbor man. After about half of an hour, we decided to go back for another look. Some of the ducks had come back, and as luck would have it, we got two more. We went back to the neighbor's house to give him the last two. He saw us drive up and he came out

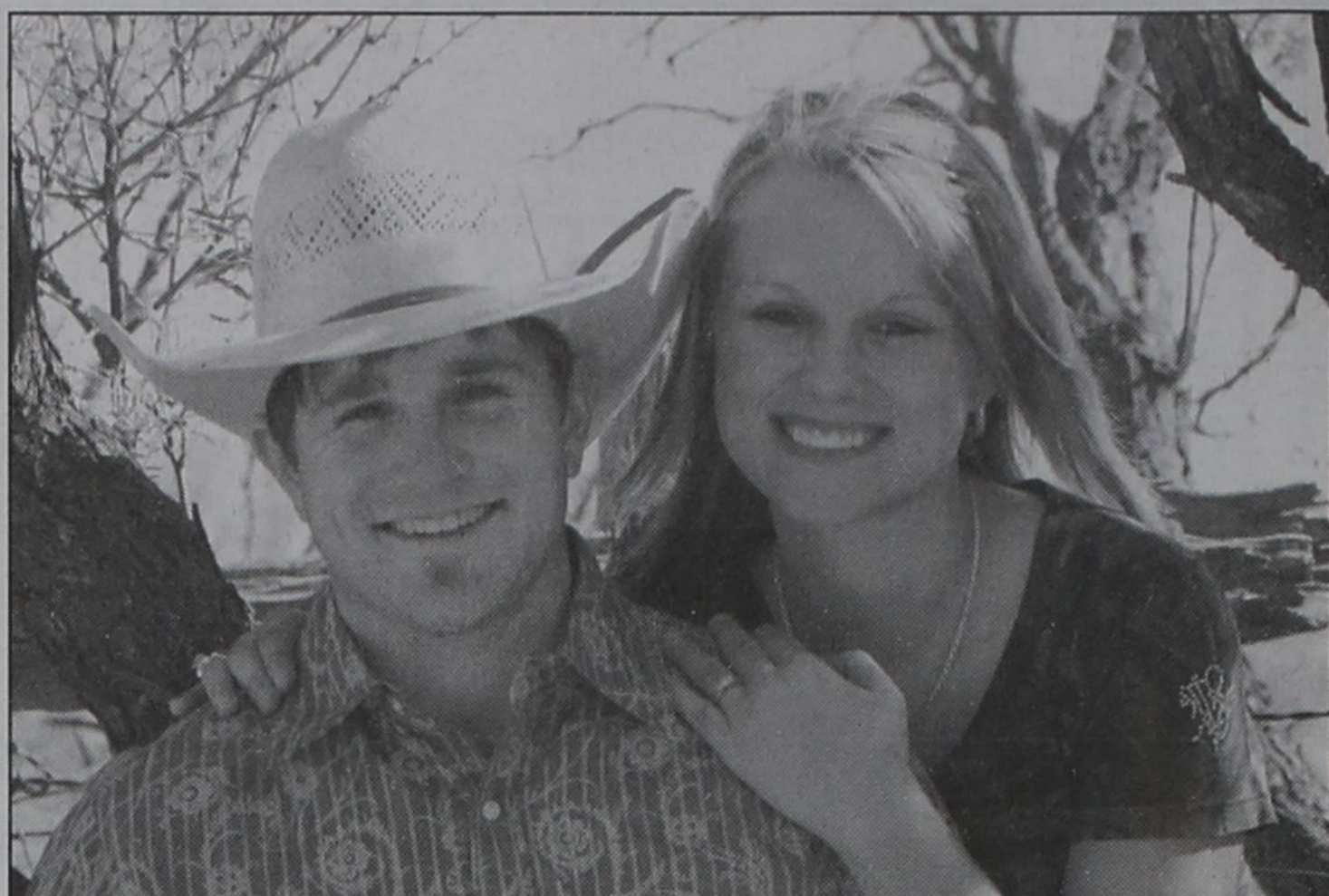
to meet us. I was surprised to hear him say, "My wife says, "No more ducks!"

Since we couldn't give them away, Charles kept one and I took the other. We went our separate ways with ducks in hand. When I got back to my in-laws house and took the duck in, I was real sure everyone would be real pleased with my hunt. (Funny, isn't it, how ungrateful our wives are sometimes?)

The second, "duck huntin' trip," was with a couple of guys who were "dead serious" about it. After I took them up on their invite, they told me, "We'll be by your house to pick you up at four-thirty, tomorrow morning." My first thought was, "These guys must be maniacs!" On well, a deal's a deal! After about a sixty mile trip, we finally arrived at the lake where their huntin' blind was. It was sort of a half-dugout, with a little roof on top. They'd even put in a comfortable seat to sit on...while you

were in the process of freezing to death! I figured that by the time the ducks showed up, they'd find three frosty-looking men, sitting in a half-dugout, unable to move a muscle, let alone pull a trigger.

One of the guys told me to hand him the coffee can. I wondered what was in it, so I took the lid off. "I'll be doggoned, it's got a roll of toilet paper in it; good idea!" He said, "It's to keep our hands and trigger fingers warm." I asked him how it was, that a roll of toilet paper was supposed to keep your hands warm. He told me that it was an "old Indian trick." You just put the roll in the can the night before you go huntin', then fill the can with alcohol. The next morning, pour out the excess alcohol and put the lid on the can. When you get in your blind, take off the lid and light the toilet paper roll. Only the alcohol burns, not the paper. It'll furnish enough heat to help keep you warm."

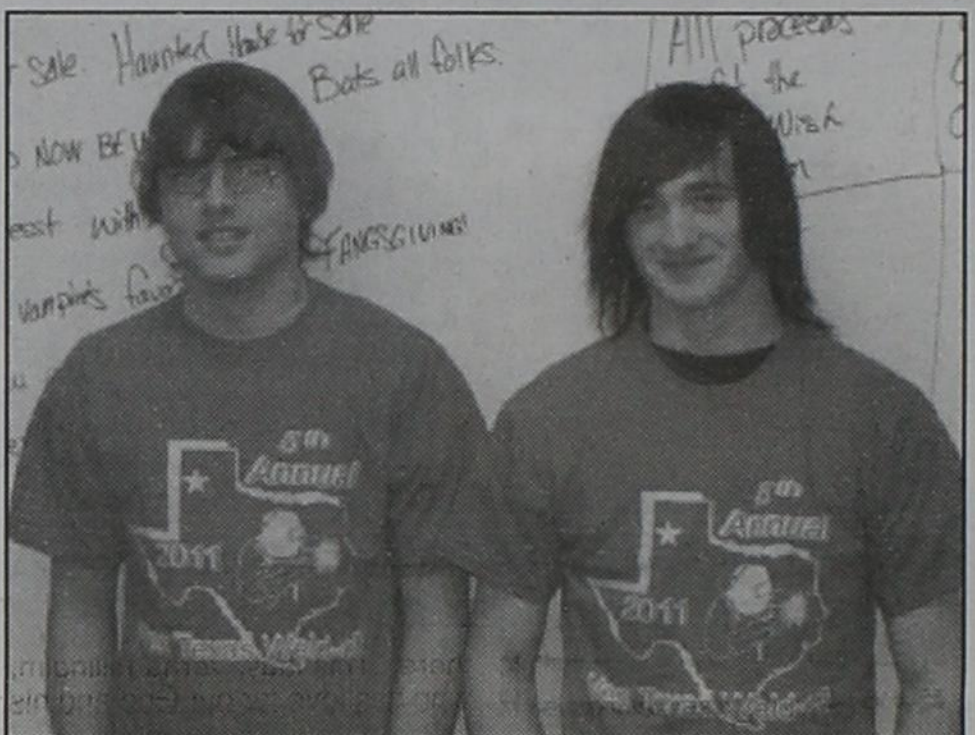

Why do people shrink?

When we say people shrink, we don't mean they become tiny enough to fit in your pocket! We just mean that it's common for people to become a little shorter over time. It isn't dramatic or sudden. It takes place over years and may add up to only an inch or so off of their adult height (maybe a little more, maybe less). This kind of shrinking can't be reversed, although people can slow or stop this process. But why does shrinking happen at all?

Gravity (that force that keeps your feet on the ground) takes hold, and the disks, or cushions between the bones in the spine, get compressed over time. The back bones, called vertebrae, end up pressing closer together, which makes a person lose a little height and become shorter.

Another reason why some people shrink is because of osteoporosis. Osteoporosis occurs when bone is broken down and not enough new bone material is made. Over time, bone is said to be lost because it's not being replaced. Bones become smaller and weaker and can easily break if someone with osteoporosis is injured.

Some people - especially women, who generally have smaller and lighter bones to begin with - are more likely to develop osteoporosis. As years go by, a person with osteoporosis can get small breaks in bones that are called compression fractures. These breaks cause collapse of the vertebrae and over time the person with osteoporosis can become hunched over or stooped.

Smoking and drinking alcohol can make this problem worse. Want to do something right now to build strong bones? Take these two steps. They're smart ideas for kids and adults.

1. Eat a well-balanced diet, especially with foods rich in the important bone-building mineral calcium (including milk, tofu, cheese, and yogurt; green leafy vegetables like broccoli and spinach; and drinks that are fortified with calcium like some kinds of orange juice)
2. Exercise regularly. Doing so, over time, helps bones stay strong.

Did you know that every day you shrink a little, too? You aren't as tall at the end of the day as you are at the beginning. That's because as the day goes on, water in the disks of the spine gets compressed (squeezed) due to gravity, making you just a tiny bit shorter. Don't worry, though. Once you get a good night's rest, your body recovers, and the next morning, you're standing tall again!

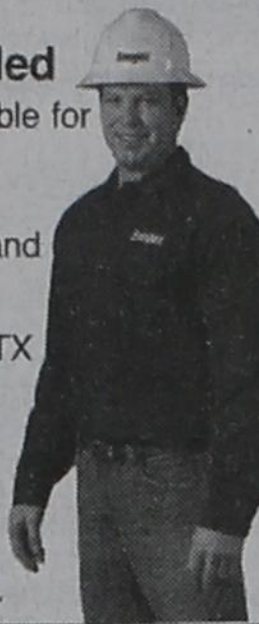

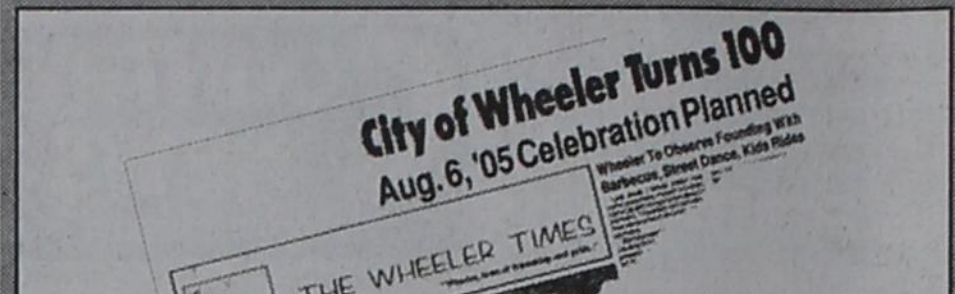

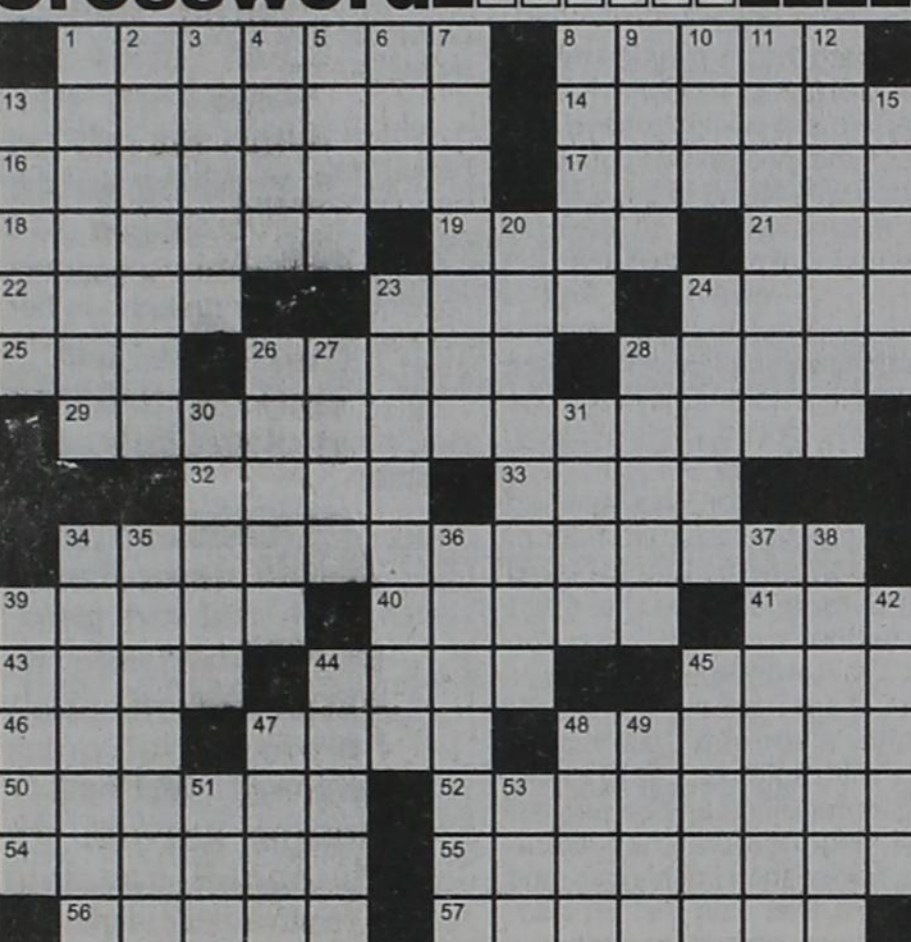

Southwestern Public Service Offers New Improved Service

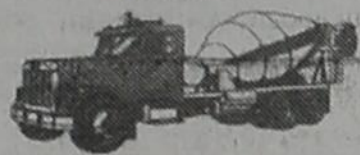
New, improved electric service as a result of extensive work done by Southwestern Public Service Company crews this summer is now a fact for Wheeler.

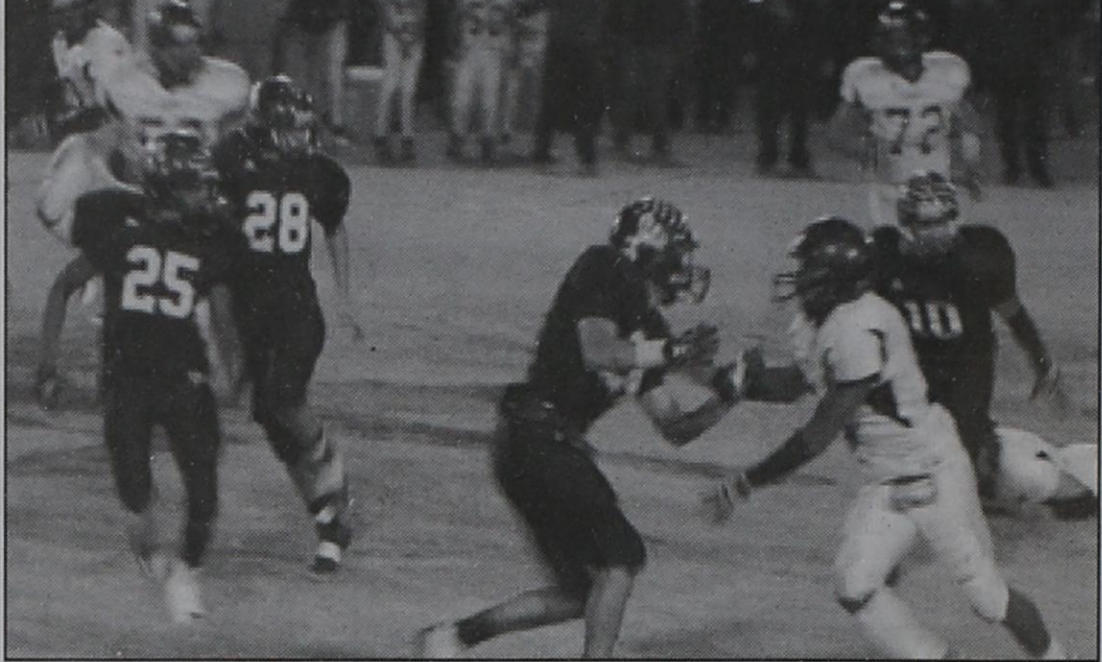
