

Zybach Cemetery Receives Historic Texas Cemetery Designation

The Texas Historical Commission (THC) recently designated Zybach as a Historic Texas Cemetery. The distinction means the cemetery has been legally recorded through the THC's Historic Texas Cemetery Program, an all-important step in ensuring its preservation.

This designation is reserved for cemeteries that are at least 50 years old and documented through the Historic Texas Cemeteries process to record their historic association and significance.

"This designation is a tool that will increase public awareness of these important cultural resources," said Mark Wolfe, executive

director of the THC. "Knowledge and education are among the best ways to guarantee the preservation of a historic cemetery."

Suzanne Lohberger, member of the Wheeler County Historical Commission, wishes to thank all those involved in the designation process.

Cemeteries hold valuable historic information and they are often the last reminders of early settlements' historical events, religious beliefs, lifestyles and genealogy. While the Historic Texas Cemetery designation encourages cemetery preservation, it cannot guarantee that a historic cemetery will avoid destruction. Threats to historic cemeteries include urban expansion and development, vandalism, grazing animals and long-term deterioration from weather and uncontrolled vegetation.

The THC developed the Historic Texas Cemetery designation to address the destruction of historic cemeteries and the illegal removal of cemetery fixtures. Any individual or organization is eli

County's Census Report Shows Wheeler At 1,592

Wheeler County's census data was made available to the Times by Wheeler County Clerk, Margaret Dorman. The figures for 2010 show Wheeler County population to have grown 102% with the City of Wheeler growing 15.53%; while the cities of Shamrock and Mobeetie decreased in population 5.86% and 5.61%, respectively.

Population for the City of Wheeler has both increased and decreased for the past 50 years. In 1960, the census showed Wheeler to have 1,174 citizens. There was a decrease in the 1970 census to 1,116. Then, in 1980, the population reached 1,584 with a loss of 206 for 1990. In the '90 and '00 census, Wheeler had 1,378 both years. The population is presently the highest in the 50-year period at 1,592.

Mobeetie had 291 residents in 1980, according to the records available to the Times. In the census taking for the years '90/'00 and '10, the population continually dropped. The 1990 records showed the greatest loss of nearly half its population to 169. There was a drop of 62 people in 2000 and in '10 the count was 101.

The census takers marked down Shamrock to have had 3,113 in 1960; the books show the 2010 population to be 1,910. In the 10 years before 1970, there

was a drop of 469 individuals. Our southern neighbors regained 190 of those people by 1980, but 548 were gone in 1990. The totals dropped in both 2000 and 2010.

The 2010 race/ethnicity for our town were also interesting. Wheeler shows 892 White, 665 Hispanic, 9 Black, 7 Asian and 19 other. Mobeetie shows 93 White, 47 Hispanic, 0 Black, 1 Asian and 8 other. Shamrock shows 1,365 White, 401 Hispanic, 86 Black, 11 Asian and 47 other.

John Paul Harris, 36, died Sunday, September 4, 2011, after a four-year battle with ALS.



OLD WHITE MEN CAN'T JUMP?

By now, most of you have probably come to the conclusion that I used to be young and dumb. Well, I'm here to tell you; it took a long time, but I got over being young. After spending forty-five years of being a welder and living most of those years in Amarillo, I retired. One good thing about being an ex-professional welder is...you can go right into being a "hobby" welder. I started doing things that I'd never done before and didn't know much about. For about a year or so, I just piddled around in the garage making a lot of noise and dust. I did accomplish making two pairs of spurs and a few more minor items. I'm surprised the neighbors never complained, or turned me in to the city for the noise.

A few years after Shirley's parents passed away, we quit leasing their farm out and decided to

start cleaning it up and refurbish it a little. One thing led to another, so we sold our house in Amarillo and had one built on a spot we considered perfect...on the farm. Our kids even moved down here, too. Living in the country again, I got the notion I'd really like to have a few cows to kind of help keep the place grazed down. After working off and on, for about five years, I finally got most of our dilapidated fences patched up and knew I wouldn't have any trouble keeping them in. Last January, I bought ten old cows and a couple of calves; hasn't rained "two-cents worth," since.

In order to maximize the pasture on this home place and since I still don't have all the permanent fence built; I just put a hot wire around part of it.

One of my friends had given me an old fence charger he didn't need and I put it near the barn where I have electricity available. Since it was old, I guess I didn't believe it had full power anymore. I'd thought about buying an electric fence tester, but figured that would be a waste of money. A real man like me, could just touch the wire with the back of his hand. How bad could that be, anyway? So, I gritted my teeth and put my hand against it. It barely tickled. Just what I suspicioned... it's not working right; it's weak! For some really dumb reason, I turned my hand around and got hold of the wire with my fingers. Still, almost nothing. That's when things took a turn for the worse...

Without thinking, I reached over with my other hand and touched the grounding rod I'd driven about four feet deep into the ground. It felt like I'd just about blown my arm off. When you go from a "hunker," like I was, I think you can jump a lot higher than if you were just standing up.

I probably jumped three feet straight up and "holered" out loud. This isn't the best way to get your aerobic exercise. The next time I went to town, I dropped by the feed store and bought a fence tester. Those things are really worth the money!

Sunday September 11th, 2011, will be the 10th anniversary of 9/11. In observance of this seminal moment in American history, millions of people in all 50 states and many others throughout the world will engage in solemn remembrance and reflection on an attack on American soil that claimed thousands of lives and changed the fabric of the nation. High winds and dry conditions are causing extreme wildfire danger across the state. Broadcast media can greatly assist the Texas public by using these Public Service Announcements.

WILDFIRE DANGER AND OUTDOOR ACTIVITIES

Texans face extreme wildfire danger. Avoid parking vehicles in tall, dry grass and weeds. Weeds and grass could be ignited by hot catalytic converters. Crush cigarettes in an ashtray and make sure they are really out. Be cautious about outdoor activities that might cause sparks or fires. Sparks can easily escape from burning trash. Avoid using welding or grinding equipment near dry weeds and grass.

DON'T DRIVE INTO SMOKE ON THE ROAD

Wind driven wildfire can move as fast as 60 miles per hour. When you see thick smoke across a highway, do not drive into it. Slow down. Prepare to stop and turn around. Activate your emergency flashers to warn vehicles following you. Check for oncoming traffic. Make sure you can turn around safely. Remember, when there is dense smoke on the road; do not drive in to it.

STAY ALERT TO WILDFIRE DANGER WHEN TRAVELING

Texans face extreme wildfire danger. Check fire and weather conditions before you get on the road. Monitor radio broadcasts while traveling. In areas where there may be wildfire, watch for highway signs, traffic control per-

sonnel and fire fighters. Slow down and prepare to stop when they signal you to do so. Remember, wind driven wildfire can move as fast as 60 miles per hour. If you see dense smoke on the road, do not drive into it.

WILDFIRE DANGER TO RURAL HOMES AND SUBURBS

Whether you live in a rural or suburban area, you can protect your home from the dangers of wildfire. Protect your property by clearing brush and grass away from your home and buildings. Clear out brush between trees. Prune lower branches. Make sure areas under utility lines are clear of brush, tall grass and trees so that utility service will continue. Create a fire break by clearing vegetation from areas between your house and nearby fields or woodland areas.

NOTICE OF DRINKING WATER NITRATE VIOLATION

The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) has notified the WHEELER MUNICIPAL WATER SYSTEM that the drinking water being supplied to customers had exceeded the Maximum Contaminant Level (MCL) for nitrate. The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (U.S. EPA) has established the MCL for nitrate at 10 milligrams per liter (mg/L) based on a single sample, and has determined that it is a health concern at levels above the MCL. Analysis of the drinking water in your community for nitrate indicates a compliance value of 14 mg/L for the monitoring period 01/01/2011 - 03/30/2011 and a compliance value of 19 mg/L for the monitoring period of 04/01/2011 - 06/30/2011.

Infants below the age of six months who drink water containing nitrate in excess of the MCL could become seriously ill and, if untreated, may die. Symptoms include shortness of breath and blue baby syndrome. If your child is under the age of six months, the child must be given an alternative water supply for any consumption. The effective treatment for nitrate removal.

Most consumers do not need to use an alternative water supply. However, if you have health concerns, you may want to talk to your doctor to get more information about how this may affect you. At this time, the health effects to fetuses of pregnant women is unclear. If you are pregnant, you may choose to use an alternative source of water for drinking and cooking purposes.

We are working to correct the problem. Bottled water is available at no cost for the affected populations at City Hall. We are working with the City Engineer and hydrologists seeking to improve our water supply. We are also getting technical support from TCEQ for an alternative water supply. Please share this information with

all people who drink this water, especially those who may not receive this notice directly (i.e., people in apartments, nursing homes, schools, and businesses).
