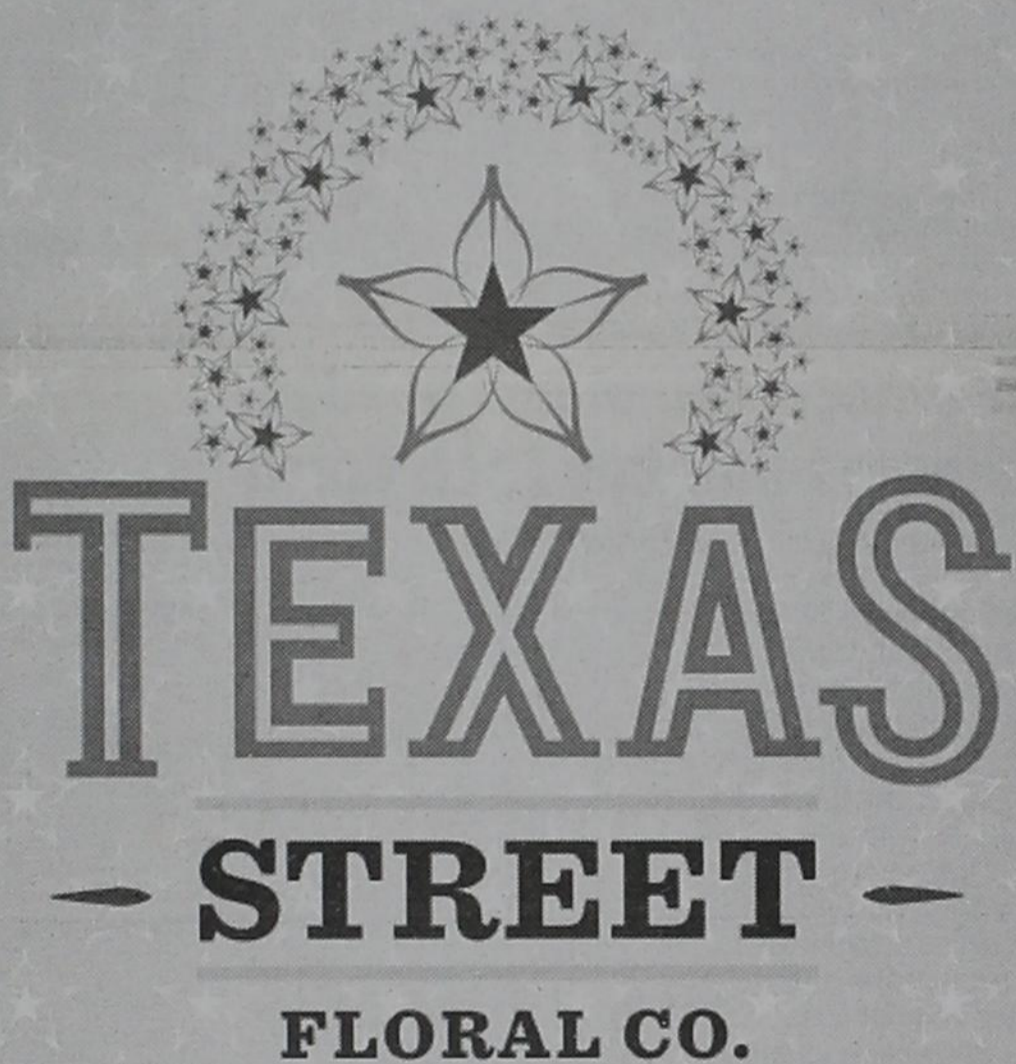

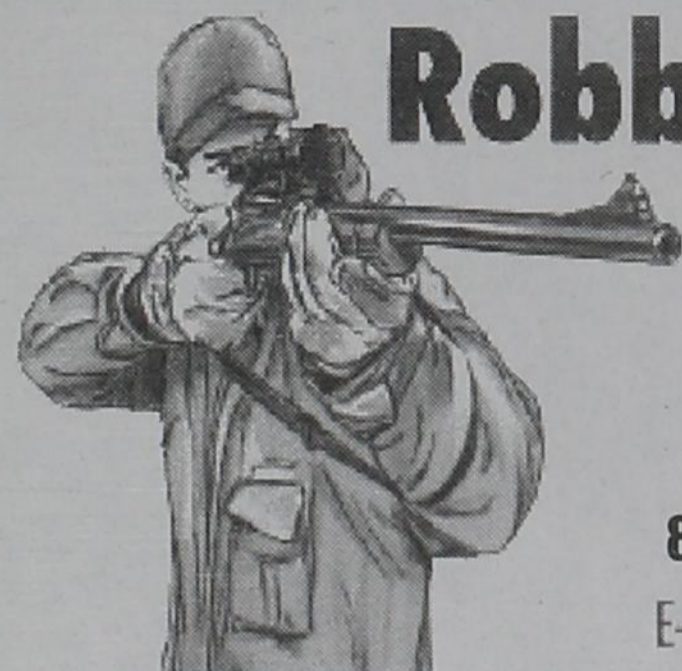

OLD TIMES NOT FORGOTTEN

BURMA SHAVE

Nowadays, riding in cars has got to be a lot safer, than it was when my generation was growing

up. With seatbelts being mandatory for everyone and having airbags for the front seat occupants, I'm sure safety has improved a lot. Also, kids have to ride in the back seat and buckle-up at all times. No sir, I sure can't argue against today's safety features and rules.

Now, with all that said and out of the way, it can't possibly be as much fun now, to go on a long car trip, as it was before all those rules. When my peers and I were kids, there weren't any of those rules, yet. We could ride anywhere in the car that we wanted to. One of my favorite places, was the ledge 'above and behind' the back seat. You could lay up there and look back at where you'd been; or look at the people coming up behind you. Now, that was fun.

For a couple of years, we had a '41 Ford "Club Coupe." It had a small, fold-up seat on each side of the back seat area. If you folded up the seats, the whole space was open, and you could sit of the floor; great fun! After about an hour into a three or four hour trip, most kids would start getting curious about how much farther it was to the planned destination. They would stand up on their knees, with their arms on top of the front seats and start asking the questions, "Are we there yet? How much farther? What's the next town?" This would be repeated about every fifteen minutes, or so.

A few kids would even resort to singing; and all the better, if mom and dad would sing along, too. A trip would be a lot less boring, if you had learned to read fairly well. Then you could read road signs to your parents; saved them from having to do it for themselves. Back then, there was a company that sold shaving products for men. (You'd probably have figured it out for yourselves, that it was for men.) The name of the company was, "Burma Shave." Alongside the highway, on fence posts, and highline posts, they would put up signs. On each post, there would be a small sign, with a few words on it. There were always five signs, about two or three hundred yards apart. These were a little bit challenging for a young reader, but something we really looked forward to. Our parents even seemed to enjoy them as much as we did. I'll list just a few of those I liked. They all ended with the sponsor's name... "Burma Shave" Angels
