JV, 7th & 8th Football Games Comments By Coach Dorris



Wheeler Cemetery Receives Historical Cemetery Designation

The Texas Historical Commission (THC) recently designated Wheeler Cemetery as a Historic Texas Cemetery on July 28, 2011. The distinction means the cemetery has been legally recorded through the THC's Historic Texas Cemetery Program, an important step in ensuring its preservation.

This designation is reserved for cemeteries that are at least 50 years old and documented through the Historic Texas Cemeteries process to record their historical association and significance.

"This designation is a tool that will increase public awareness of these important cultural resources," said Mark Wolfe, executive director of the THC. "Knowledge and education are among the best ways to guarantee the preservation of a historic cemetery."

After graduating from Mobeetie High School, Keith attended West Texas State University in Canyon, Texas. He enlisted in the Army at age 24 on April 5, 1966. Sgt. Rowell was killed in action in Vietnam on August 25, 1968 and laid to rest in Silverton, Texas.



Wes Crites Announces Republican Candidacy For Wheeler Co. Sheriff

Wes Crites, retired Commander of the Texas Department of Public Safety's Criminal Law Enforcement Narcotics Division, has officially announced his candidacy for the 2012 Wheeler County Sheriff's election.

Wes and his wife, Shelia, have been married for 36 years and moved to Wheeler County four years ago where they purchased a ranch east of Shamrock. They have four grown children and 10 grandchildren. They are actively involved in the Shamrock school system, raising two of their grandchildren that they have legally adopted as their own, Wesley, a freshman at Shamrock High School, and Sierra, a fourth grader at Shamrock Elementary. Wes is a member of the Shamrock Boosters Club and Shelia is active in the Shamrock Band Boosters.

Crites was raised in Pampa, and is a Gray County native. Crites began his 34 year law enforcement career as a Trooper in Dumas, Texas. For seven years he served as a Trooper, followed by three years as an undercover narcotics agent. Four years was spent as a Sergeant and later a Lieutenant for Narcotics Investigations and 17 years as a Captain, supervising 30 counties in the Dallas/Fort Worth area. He retired after three years of serving as Commander of the Narcotics Division headquartered in Austin. Crites is licensed as a Private Investigator by the State of Texas and is currently commissioned as a Special Texas Ranger for the Texas DPS. He also currently holds an Associates Degree in General Education with an emphasis on Criminal Justice and holds a Master Peace Officer Certificate from Texas Commission on Law Enforcement Officer Standards and Education.

"The reason I'm running for Sheriff is very simple, I believe Wheeler County deserves effective law enforcement. I want to instill a sense of the Sheriff's office being on the offensive when it comes to fighting a drug problem that currently exists in Wheeler County. I don't want to be a Sheriff that simply waits and responds to reported instances of illegal activity. I want to take the fight to them. Through my years of experience, I can plainly see that Wheeler County definitely has a drug problem. I believe effective law enforcement can curtail that problem and create a safer county for all of us," said Mr. Crites. "I believe that my unique qualifications and past experience amply qualifies me to be the best candidate for Wheeler County Sheriff."

"When I was with the Texas DPS, we had a program entitled 'Junior Trooper' that helped make a positive impact in children's lives. The program taught them that there's definitely right and wrong choices. This program encourages them to make the right choices, while giving law enforcement personnel the opportunity to interact with the children and gain their trust. Educating our youth is a priority in fighting criminal activity, especially drugs. If you choose to elect me Sheriff, I promise to do my best to protect the most important asset we have, our children."





Parents Play Big Role in Improving Teen Driving National Teen Driver Safety Week (NTDSW) - October 16-22, 2011

Motor vehicle crashes are the leading cause of death for teens. Statistics show that teens are most likely to have a crash during the first six months after getting their license, which is primarily due to their inexperience. Research shows that parents play an important role in increasing their teen's driving skills as they have the greatest influence over their teen's behavior. In fact, leading experts believe parents play a key role in preventing teen car crashes and deaths.

A study conducted by the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia shows that teens whose parents set rules, monitor their driving, and are supportive are half as likely to crash and twice as likely to use seat belts as teens with less involved parents. Parents can help by talking with their teens about safe driving practices. Spending as much time driving with your teen in many different driving situations can significantly impact your teen's future driving practices.

The Texas Graduated Driver's License Law provides parents with the controls to help keep their teen drivers safe. However, many parents are not aware of the provisions of this law. The law is divided into two phases. During phase one, the teen driver must always be accompanied by a person at least 21 years of age. During phase two, teens cannot operate a motor vehicle with more than one passenger who is younger than 21 unless the additional passengers are also family members. Driving is prohibited

between midnight and 5 a.m. unless the teen is driving to attend work or a school-related activity, or responding to an emergency situation. Cell phone use is also prohibited during this second phase. Making sure your teen follows the Graduated Driver's License Law can help get a teen safely through the most critical time when driver inexperience can lead to crashes.

Texas AgriLife Extension Service agent Wendy Hazzard reminds parents to follow these tips to keep teens driving safely:

- Practice driving with your teen as often as possible.
- Discuss your rules of the road, and create a Parent-Teen Driving Agreement.
- Model good driving behavior for your teen by always using seat belts and never using a cell phone while driving.
- Share your rules with other parents and teens.
- Parents can take advantage of the National Teen Driver Safety Week to talk to their teens about staying safe on the road.

Parkview Artery October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month

View from a personal side
As women we all know by now how important it is to do self exams and have our mammograms. And I can hear a lot of women saying to themselves, but I don't have time, those things are so darn uncomfortable, blah, blah.. We all have the same excuses, but we all also know friends, relatives, neighbors that have had breast cancer. And that have survived it. This is a personal testimony of someone that has done just that . . .

I always had regular mammograms, always knew I needed too. I had two sister and two grandmothers that had history of Breast Cancer. So every year like clockwork I had the usual, but one year it was not usual. That year 1997, the test came back positive a small lump on left side of the breast, so they did a lumpectomy, (also removed 9 lymph nodes) inserting a small wire to remove the lump. It came back cancer, cancer such a word. So I went through 6 weeks of radiation, 5 days a week, 200 miles every day, back and forth for treatments. It was quiet an ordeal. Well, I would return for frequent checks, you know every 3 months then every 6 months, then finally once a year. Then 7 years after the diagnosis, in 2004 I was declared cancer free.

After a 2007 check-up I mentioned to my gynecologist that one of my breasts seems to be shrinking (not bad news to some of us). He said we will just keep an eye on it. Many months later I had to have an emergency appendectomy. While I was at home recovery from that, I found a lump on the underside of the left breast. Keep in mind I have had a mammogram every year since I can remember. Well after testing it came back stage 2 cancer and because of previous history and family history the Doctor recommended and proceeded to do a radical bilateral mastectomy. it was done on Feb 15th 2008; the chemo did not start till May of that year, with one treatment every 3 weeks. Well the first two went well it was the 3rd one that the hair started to go and then go some more. Oh well (It was cooler in summer anyway), then there was more side effects, an increased weakness, mouth sores and so on. But here it is 3 years later, and I am still cancer free, recovered and renewed. I think God and my family and friends who were there with me and to all the Doctors and nurses who helped in my recovery.

Contributor of this testimony is Debbie Kinnaman. One in 8 women will be touched with the news of Breast Cancer.

Cancer is a word, but it doesn't have to be a word of death or defeat...You can come through the other side. We lift up those survivors and the ones still going through the journey. 

A family representative states, "We look forward to seeing those we have already had the pleasure of meeting and visiting with and other new friends we will be making."

To our family, forgive us if we have left anyone out and please consider this your invitation. It is important to get an RSVP.

Keith W. Rowell from a small Texas Panhandle town called Mobeetie who went off to the Vietnam War in 1967 with the 506th 101st Airborne. Unknown to his family he distinguished himself as a hero to his squad and platoon. Really he was just trying to get home but during that year in Vietnam he experienced some of the worst fighting of the war. These

men trained together at Ft. Campbell, KY and went over together on a ship in September 1967. He was wounded and sent to the rear with only a month left on his tour he wanted to get back to his squad who depended on him so he went back. Three weeks before he was to come home he was killed. The men of his company to this day have not gotten over losing him so close to making it home.

It was a tragedy to his family but as many families we buried him and tried to go on with our lives. One of the guys Ed Bassista who lives in New York tried to get in touch with the family for years. When contacted by the family, he said never a day goes by that he does not think of Keith. He told of the Keith's heroism and how he was called "Sgt. Rock" by his men.

Judy Tibbs (sister of Blairsville, GA, and Gary Rowell (brother) of Amarillo went to a reunion of the 101st Airborne about 3 year ago and the outpouring of love for their brother was almost overwhelming. One guy came up and told that he would not be here if it were not for my brother.

The 506th 101st Airborne group always puts flowers on Keith's grave Memorial Weekend. This year one of the soldiers - Ray Mayfield delivered them personally. He contacted the family and

made them aware of the need for a military marker for his grave. That started the process and thanks to Larry Whithar with Veterans Services in Amarillo the dedication of the Military Marker will take place October 22. Seven of the guys are coming to Amarillo for the dedication.

After 43 years, eight of the guys in Rowell's unit are coming from all over the US to be there for the dedication of the stone, which has turned out to be a big event. There will be 21 gun salute, bag-

pipes and maybe a hundred motorcycle riders coming from all over the area.




