Jimmy placed 4th with a barrow at the Pampa Livestock Show and had a breed champion at Wheeler. He played basketball, football and baseball.

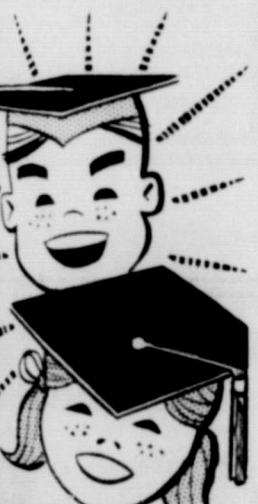
He plans to attend college at Clarendon and Texas Tech majoring in physical education.

Scoop out the insides and place in bowl, being sure the potato shells are intact. Combine sour cre: m, seasonings, hard cooked eggs and milk. Add to potatoes and mix until fluffy. Spoon lightly into potato shells. Serve hot at once with a pat of margarine. Serves 6.

## ACROSS THE FENCE

BY MAX HATTER, CAA

We've got the moisture now. Farmers were all smiles as the rains set in last week. Wheat will be helped and maize and cotton'll get off to a better start.

The time for planting maize is here and farmers should consider certain cultural practices which can improve overall production and production efficiency.

Best results are usually obtained when maize is planted between May 1 and May 15. By this time the soil temperature should be 60 degrees F. or higher. Planting in colder soil often results in poor, skippy stands and weak seedlings. Optimum planting depth is about two inches.

Since midge damage is usually more severe in late-planted sorghum, planting should be not later than May 20, depending on the maturing characteristic of the variety. Sorghum planted so as to be in bloom or blooming by August 1, will escape most midge damage.

Proper planting rates are also an important consideration. On irrigated acreage, planting at the rate of eight pounds per seed per acre is sufficient to produce maximum yields. Hybrids vary some in seed size but this amounts to about eight seed per foot of 40 inch row. With limited irrigation, five to six pounds per acre is normally sufficient.

About two and one-half pounds of seed per acre is adequate for dryland conditions.

Narrow row planting can increase yields as much as 20 percent. This means planting double rows 10 to 18 to 20 inches apart on a 40 inch bed or on single beds 26, 28 or 30 inches apart. In this case, planting rates should be kept the same or increased not more than 25 percent. To obtain the most benefit from narrow-row spacing, adequate fertilizer and moisture levels must be maintained.

However, regardless of row spacing, good yields

can be realized only if weed control and other management practices are observed. Excessive planting rates on both irrigated and dryland grain sorghum should be avoided.

Adjustments in planting dates of sorghum and cotton with the main emphasis on timing of irrigation can greatly improve overall production efficiency. In some cases, a medium maturing hybrid such as RS 626 can be planted early in the season and irrigated twice before cotton requires any irrigation. The two irrigations are sufficient to carry this hybrid to maturity.

## TRUE FACTS ABOUT FARM TO MARKET ROAD

Since so many people have asked all the Commissioners and also the judge, why the selection of F.M. Road of 5.2 miles at its location, I shall endeavor to list the facts.

It was agreed that Precinct No. 1 would be allowed the next road.

So in the first meeting, I asked for the Gageby Road, which the district engineer told us there was no chance for, because of its being two miles parallel to the one in Hemphill County. He asked me to pick two locations on the county map.

So I picked No. 1, starting from State Highway 152 north from the feedlot, 5.1 miles across Sweetwater Creek, including the bridge, by the Boy Scout Camp and connect with F.M. 1046, east of Mobeetie.

Next No. 2 choice, beginning at the first county road east of Mobeetie, connecting to F.M. 1046, then 5 1/2 miles north by the "Largest Gas Well in the World," then tie into F.M. road 1268 in Hemphill County.

The engineer turned them both down, which means I chose three for the north part of precinct 1, which he refused.

The engineer said he would pick a location at the north end of Magic City F.M. road no. 2473, then 3 1/2 miles north to State Highway 152, after some discussion about the main gas line being on the west side of this location. Also, two miles of double pole highline, 69,000 volts, which double shields on the east side.

This was conditionally accepted, until we received the itemized statement of expense to the county which would have been approximately \$26,928.00, which we refused.

Another meeting was called. Then we were offered another location. Beginning at the feedlot on Highway 152, south three miles to F.M. 2473. (We refused this one.)

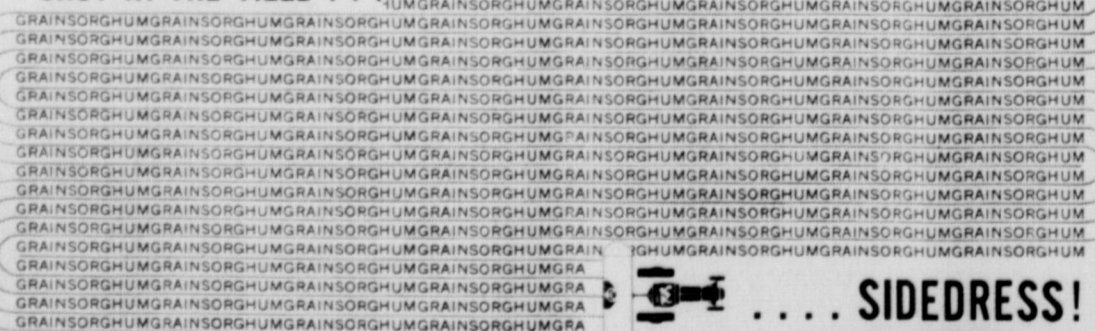
Then the district engineer asked if Wheeler County was going to let some other County have our Farm to Market Road money. My answer was "Not if Possible."

Then our choice was north end of Magic City F.M. 2473 - 1 mile or 2 miles west then north. But, I was told "No" not two miles, but the engineer said they might accept one mile west, then 4.2 miles north and tie into State Highway 152 and this means the 5.2 miles we were allowed.

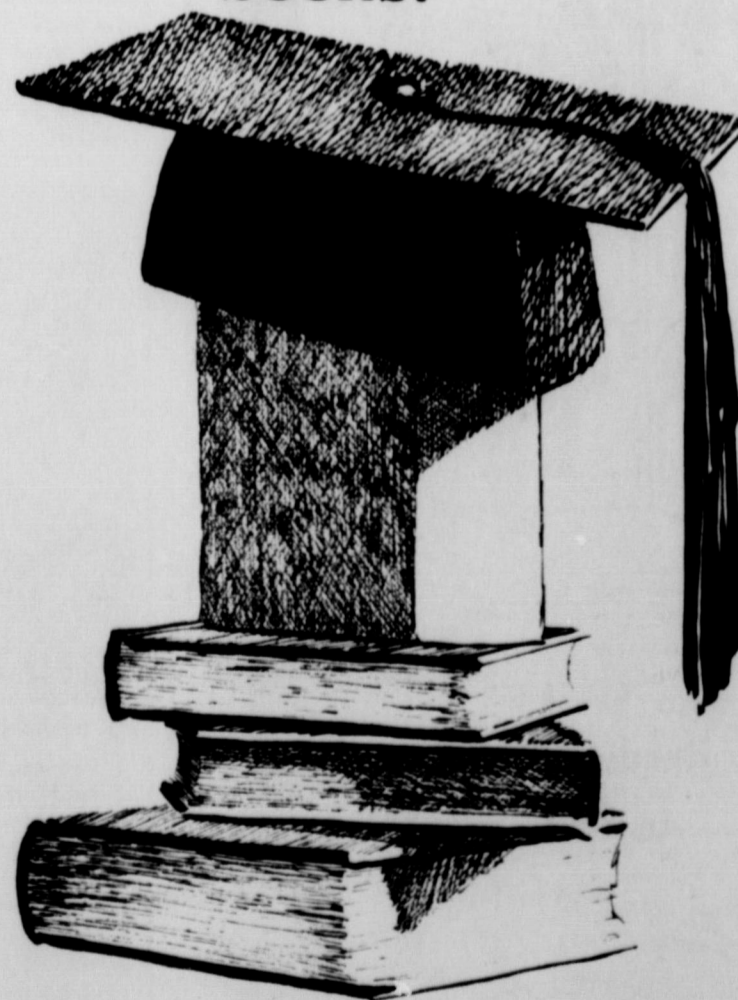

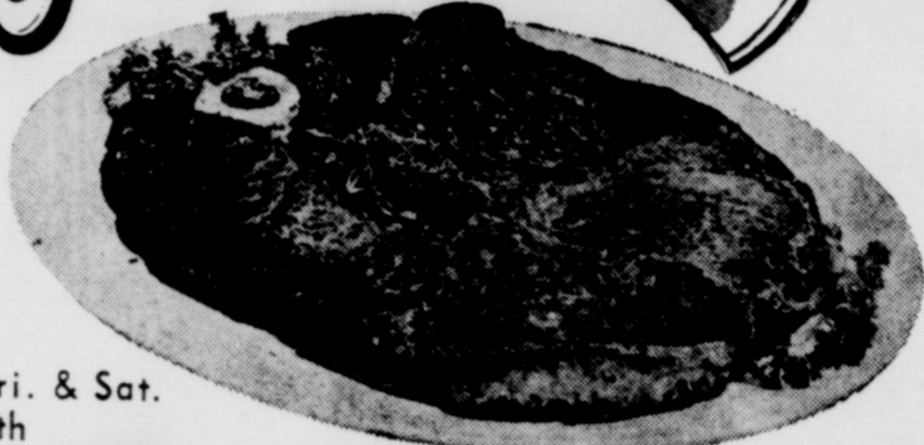
