## TEXAS POLITICS

Rep. Malouf Abraham did you ever see \$71 billion go down the drain? It's what happened in the Cavness plan ruled unconstitutional this week by the Attorney General. This was a proposal to use 72 1/2% of the money coming into the Permanent School Fund for General Revenue. The fund now has about \$1 billion in it and is increasing by about \$50 million a year. While some are opposed to using this money I felt that had a lot of merit to it. Governor Smith was saying that the plan would hold down the increased revenue necessary for other sources to fund appropriation proposals. His figure was we would need to come up with \$150-\$175 million additional for the biennium. When you add the \$1 billion back on, you are looking at a whopping \$25-\$250 million increase.

We are going to have to take some real hard looking at both increased spending and where the money will come from. Hopefully, the harder we look the better it will be for you - the long-suffering taxpayer.

We have a new Republican member, Joyn Paerner, from Honda of all places, which now gives us 9 members. We were very pleased today that Speaker Mutschler called the 9 of us in for a meeting with the Chairmen of several important committees. He outlined some of the overall plans and wanted our views on both spending and taxes. I think that our time was well spent.

We have a little less than 90 days to go in this session and they will be jam-packed with excitement, blood, sweat, and tears. I was a little surprised that I only had two people write me in response to my column about the liquor-by-the-drink proposition.

We have about 800 bills in the hopper now and our Committees are holding hearings day and night. Know all of you are happy about the good moisture.

## 6-Cent Stamp Honors Veterans

America's largest veterans organization and its many members will receive a handsome tribute from Uncle Sam next week when the United States Post Office issues a new 6-cent commemorative stamp honoring the American Legion in its observance of its 50th Anniversary.

In issuing this new stamp, the Post Office Department is saluting the founding of The American Legion, March 15-17, 1919, in Paris, France. The Legion was established on that date during a caucus of representatives of the various outfits of the World War I American Expeditionary Force. Today, American Legion membership totals more than 2.6 million veterans of World Wars I & II, Korea and Vietnam. West-Postions Post No. 138 of Wheeler is one of more than 16,000 community organizations of the Legion throughout the United States and in several overseas countries and territories.

## FHA NEWS

The hundreds of small rural water companies set up on a nonprofit base to provide water for rural homes all over Texas would be exempt from taxation under a pair of proposals by Senator Murray Watson, Jr. of Mart.

SJR 6 is a proposal to let the voters of Texas decide whether they want to amend the constitution to give the nonprofit water supply companies an exemption from taxes on their lines and water systems. SB 54 would carry the constitutional provision into effect if it is voted.

Under a program of the Farmers Home Administration, hundreds of loans have been made for construction of water systems in rural areas. The loans are being repaid out of water sales.

Organizers used the voluntary water company system rather than creating water districts which would have been exempt from property taxes because they are governmental agencies. They found that organizing costs were simpler, and not necessary to have elections and issue bonds.

But Watson said that in some areas, county tax assessors are levying taxes on the water systems.

Lt. Governor Ben Barnes referred the proposed constitutional amendment to the Senate Constitutional Amendments Committee, and the enabling bill to the State Affairs Committee.

Public Notice OF THE REQUIREMENT FOR RECORDATION AND LIMITATION OF CERTAIN CLAIMS OF WATER RIGHTS

Notice is here given as required by Section 4 of the Water Rights Adjudication Act of 1967 (Article 7542a, Vernon's Civil Statutes) that all claims of riparian water rights, all claims under Article 7500a, Revises Civil Statutes of Texas, 1925, to impound, divert or use public waters for other than domestic and livestock purposes for which no permit has been issued, all claims of water rights under the Irrigation Acts of 1889 and 1895 which were not filed with the State Board of Water Engineers in accordance with the Irrigation Act of 1913, as amended, and all other claims of water rights other than claims under permits and certified filings, must be recorded with the Texas Water Rights Commission. Section 4 does not apply to use of water for domestic and livestock purposes as the same is defined by Commission Rules. On or before September 1, 1969, every person claiming any water right to which Section 4 applies shall file with the Commission a sworn statement setting forth the nature of the claim of water right. Claims to which the Section applies shall be recognized only if valid under existing law and only to the extent of actual application of water to beneficial use without waste during any calendar year from 1963 to 1967, inclusive. However, in any case where any claimant of a riparian right has prior to August 28, 1967, commenced or completed the construction of works designed to apply a greater quantity of water to beneficial use, such right shall be recognized to the extent of the maximum amount of water actually applied to beneficial use without waste during any calendar year from 1963 to 1970, inclusive; provided an additional sworn statement is filed on or before July 1, 1971. Failure to file the sworn statement or statements in substantial compliance with Section 4 shall extinguish and bar any claim of water right to which the Section applies. 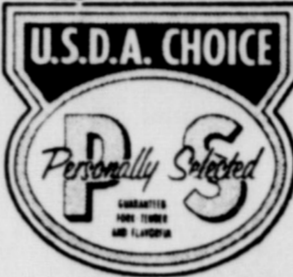

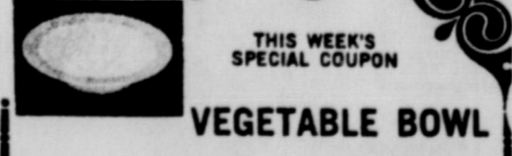
