## Commissioners' Court Meets

# County Sheriff's Deputies To Receive Uniforms

The Commissioner's Court of Wheeler County met in regular session on Monday, September 12, 2011, at 9:00 a.m. in the Commissioners' Courtroom of the

Wheeler County Courthouse at 401 Main Street, Wheeler, Texas, to consider prior bills and discuss matters of mutual concerns. At 10:00 a.m. action was taken

on the seventeen items on the agenda.

The minutes of the previous meetings were approved as presented.

The Justices of the Peace, 1 & 2, monthly reports were accepted as well as those from the County Tax Assessor, Treasurer, County Clerk and District Clerk

The court voted to pay the hourly payroll time sheets as presented.

The bills for the month were approved for payment.

Daryl Snelgrooves, Commissioner Pct. 1, moved \$35,000 from Road and Bridge Equipment to Lateral Road, Parts & Supply.

A Full Burn Ban will be in effect, beginning Thursday, Sept. 15. Anyone welding for the purpose of work will have to have a 200 gallon pressurized tank at the scene of the work.

The notice appears on Page 4 of this edition of the Times.

The court voted to go into contract with Doshier, Pickens & Francis, LLC to prepare their yearly audit at a cost not to exceed \$16,400.

Nancy Emmert, County Treasurer, informed the court of a health insurance rebate of \$4,405. This rebate is being made because the county employees had no illness claims for the past year.

Margaret Dorman, County Clerk, requested the court remove Lynn Brooks from the payroll as full time employee as of August 25.

Rowdy Clark, Wheeler County Deputy verified with the court that the Sheriff's Department had permission to hire three deputies and a dispatch/jailer.

The Wheeler County Sheriff's Department added Jayme Schlabs to their payroll as full time employee (deputy) effective September 5, at an annual salary of \$28,066.88.

Clark also reported that the uniforms for the Wheeler County Deputies will cost \$3,001.50. There are presently 6 deputies. The court voted to leave the

Sheriffs' and Constables' fees the same for the year 2012.

Kenny Brdecko, Texas AgriLife Extension Service Agent, requested the purchase of a stock trailer at a cost of \$20,300.00 for use by county 4-H'ers. The present trailer is old, worn, bulky and more difficult to maneuver. The county presently has 125 youngsters involved in 4-H with hopes of increasing the numbers to 150-175. The program brought in \$200,000 last year and \$51,000 in scholarships from the Houston Stock Show.

Daryl Snelgrooves requested permission to purchase a fuel storage tank with a capacity of 10,000 gallon. The tank will cost more than \$5,000 and will result in a savings in the cost of fuel.

Bob Hink, Commissioner, Pct. 2, was given the "go ahead" to purchase a John Deere 135hp tractor with frontend loader at a cost of \$95,769.90.

Chesapeake Midstream Gas Services LLC was given permission to bore under CR 18 for the installation of an oil and gas pipeline.

## One Fatality Sept. 10 9Mi. E. of Wheeler

On the 10th of September at 5:30 AM 20 year old Joshua Kinney of Ozark, AR, was killed in a two vehicle crash on state highway 152. The accident occurred 9.4 miles east of Wheeler.

Kinney was traveling east on highway 152 in a 2004 GMC Envoy. The driver of vehicle two Jason Trammell of McAlester, Ok was driving a 2012 Peterbilt truck tractor semi-trailer. Trammell was west bound on 152 when he observed Kinney's GMC crossing the center line into his lane. Trammell corrected to the right shoulder and Kinney's GMC struck the trucks trailer on the left front causing Kinney's GMC to roll onto its roof.

Kinney was pronounced dead at the scene. Kinney did not have his safety belt on. A passenger in the GMC William Flanary, 35 of Ozark, AR was taken to the hospital in Wheeler and treated for injuries.

A massive overhaul of the vehicle registration fee structure is about to get underway, and it's important WHEELER residents understand what's happening and why.

Beginning Sept. 1, more than 1,700 registration fee categories are reduced to nine weight classifications that create a more equitable, standardized, and simpler registration fee system.

These changes impact what WHEELER residents will pay to register cars, light and heavy-duty trucks, motor homes (RVs), and

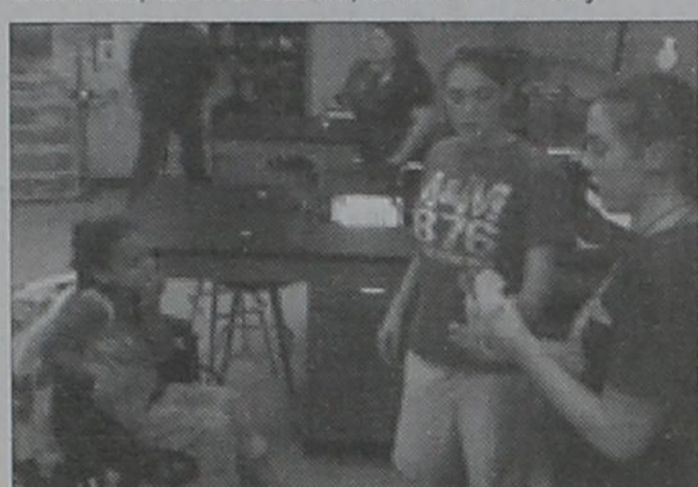

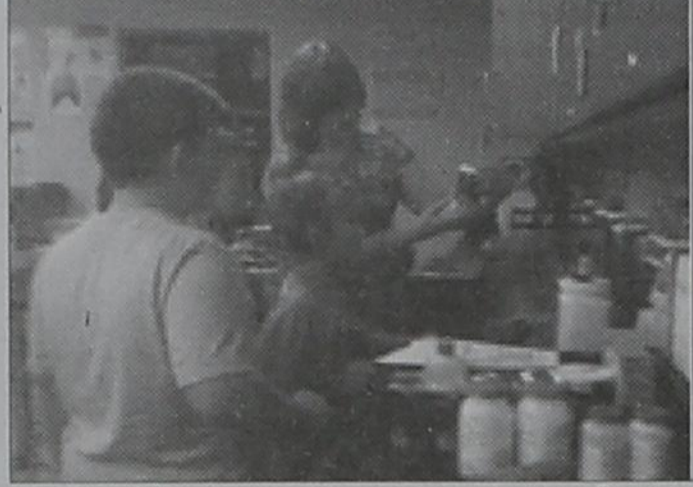

### Parkview Artery Flu Season and what You Can Do

Take everyday preventive actions to stop the spread of germs.

- Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when you cough or sneeze. Throw the tissue in the trash after you use it.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water. If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand rub.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth. Germs spread this way.

• Try to avoid close contact with sick people.

• If you are sick with flu-like illness, CDC recommends that you stay home for at least 24 hours after your fever is gone except to get medical care or for other necessities. (Your fever should be gone without the use of a fever-reducing medicine.)

• While sick, limit contact with others as much as possible to keep from infecting them

Take flu antiviral drugs if your doctor prescribes them.

• If you get the flu, antiviral drugs can treat your illness.

• Antiviral drugs are different from antibiotics. They are prescription medicines (pills, liquid or an inhaled powder) and are not available over-the-counter.

• Antiviral drugs can make illness milder and shorten the time you are sick. They may also prevent serious flu complications.

• It's very important that antiviral drugs be used early (within the first 2 days of symptoms) to treat people who are very sick (such as those who are hospitalized) or people who are sick with flu symptoms and who are at increased risk of severe flu illness, such as pregnant women, young children, people 65 and older and people with certain chronic health conditions.

• Flu-like symptoms include fever, cough, sore throat, runny or stuffy nose, body aches, headache, chills and fatigue. Some people also may have vomiting and diarrhea. People may be infected with the flu, and have respiratory symptoms without a fever.

Stay tuned to your local newspaper and the news reports to get the latest on the Flu season, and the times and dates that the flu shot will be available through your local hospitals and clinics.

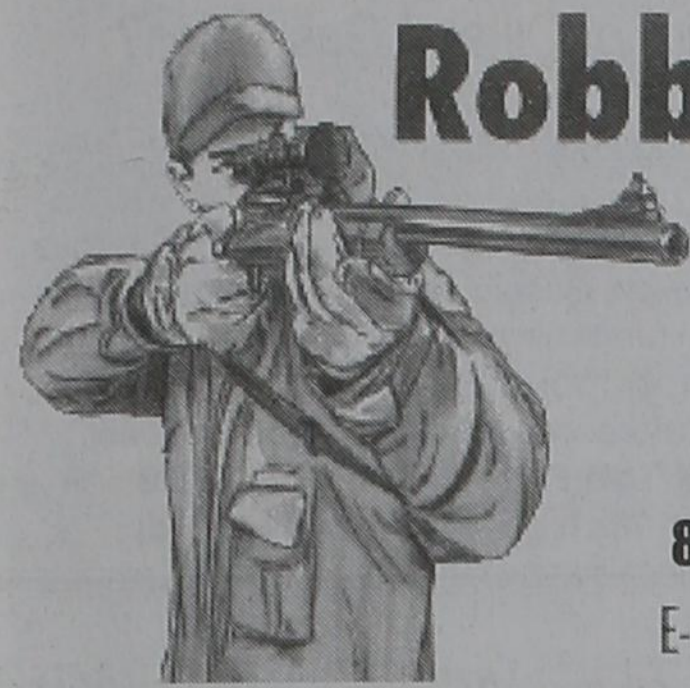

trailers, including travel trailers. Because registration is paid forward, those of you with registrations that end in August 2011 already are seeing the new fees on your renewal notices.

The good news is some fees are being completely eliminated, and some residents will see a cost reduction.

The new fee simplification law, which was passed by the legislature in 2009, provides many benefits to taxpayers, including:

- A fixed fee means you'll always know what you owe.
- Weight classifications make the fees more equitable for everyone because what you pay is based on how much impact your vehicle has on Texas' roads.
- Vehicle dealers can accurately calculate registration fees for customers.
- Trucking companies can better determine their own registration costs.
- The Texas Department of Motor Vehicles will no longer have to spend tax dollars to maintain and program the complex fee structure in its database.

Freeing up resources at our tax offices so representatives have more time to spend with you. If you have an older car or light truck (6,000 pounds or less), be aware that you will see a small increase — around \$10 — to your registration fee. There are two reasons for this: The state determined the new annual base registration fee on the amount of wear and tear the vehicle's weight does to our roadways instead of vehicle age, and the new, annual base rate of \$50.75 creates a fixed fee that will not adversely impact the current collection of registration revenue. (For those buying new cars, the new fee is about an \$8 reduction.)

Everyone continues to pay the \$1 Department of Public Safety fee for TexasSure, the automated insurance verification program, and there is a \$1 automation fee for improvements to the state registration and titling computer systems. (Continued Page 7)

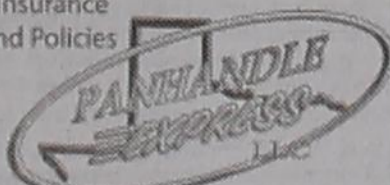

### ORDER PROHIBITING OR RESTRICTING OUTDOOR BURNING

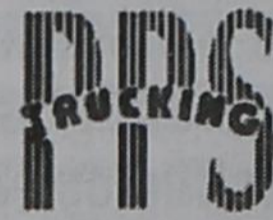

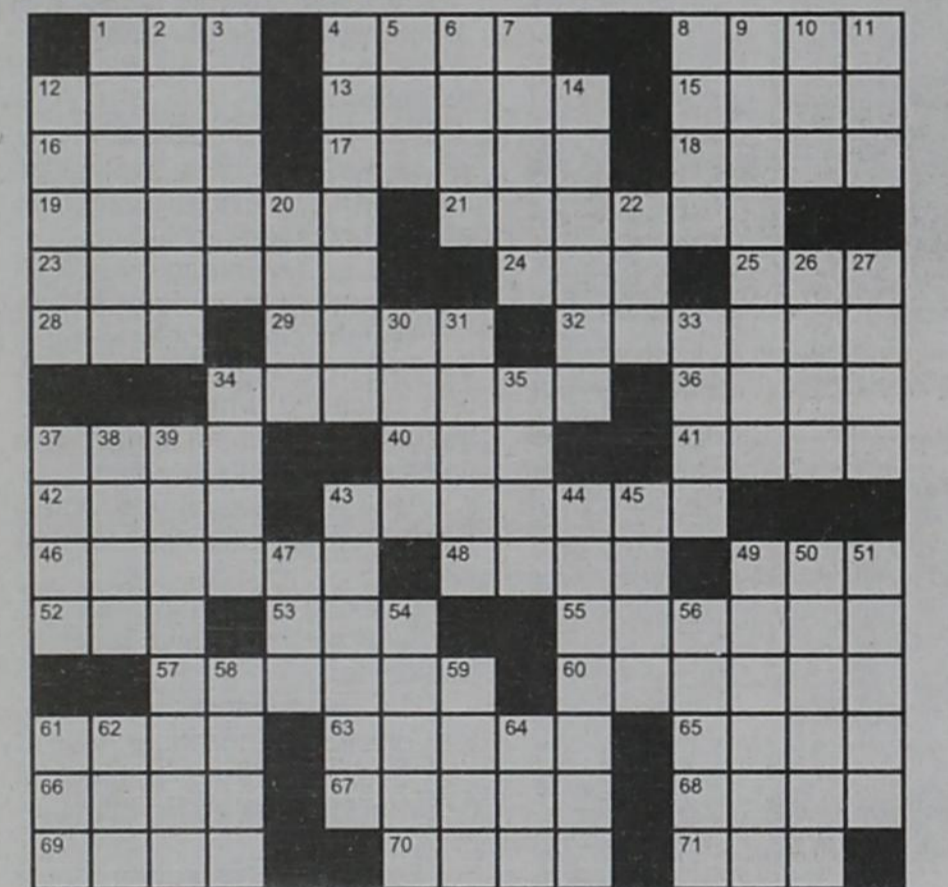

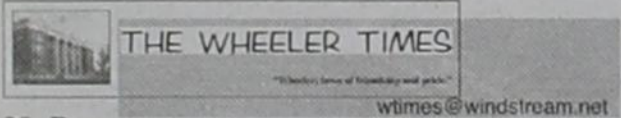

are the 1,600 fee categories that these heavy vehicle owners had to use to determine what they owed. Instead there are seven weight classifications, which should make it easy for fleet owners and individuals to determine their costs.

Car dealers, too, often had difficulty determining the proper registration fee for customers because there were so many variables in the formula. Now, it's standardized.

County fees may still vary throughout the state because they are set by our commissioners. In WHEELER vehicle registrants pay \$5.00.

We're glad to help all our customers, but we also know most Texans would prefer to handle it themselves. The new, simplified fee structure is going to help everyone to do just that. For those of you who need our in-office assistance, we're always here for you.

This standardized fee structure

term. The new law requires all counties to charge each vehicle owner \$1 for automation. Previously, this fee was only assessed in the state's largest counties but now our residents will also contribute, and the revenue will be used by the Texas Department of Motor Vehicles to automate more of its processes — including the development of more online services to consumers.

One fee eliminated is the 30-cent reflectorization fee. It was on everyone's registration renewal to help buy the reflective sheeting for license plates.

Also eliminated is the \$5 license plate transfer fee that was charged when you took off the license plates on a car or truck you traded in or sold and put them on the new vehicle you bought. Every time you sell or trade in a vehicle there are two important steps you must take to protect yourself: File the Vehicle Transfer Notification, which you can do online at [www.TxDmv.gov](http://www.TxDmv.gov), and transfer the license plates.

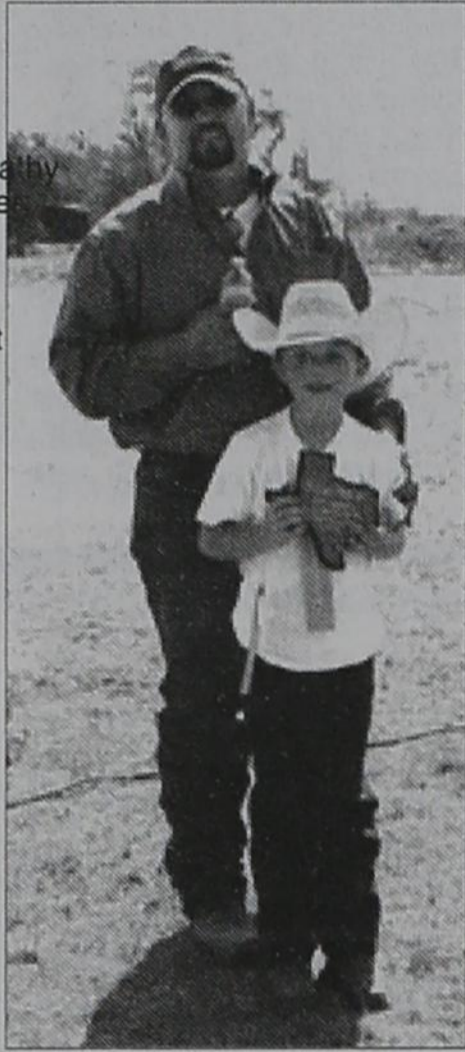
The notification removes your liability from anything the new owner may do with the vehicle and the license plate transfer protects your good name.

You need to think of your license plates as a personal identification number, and turning them over to someone else means that person can run up toll charges and even commit a criminal act that points to you as the culprit. Now that transferring your plates is free, I encourage everyone to take advantage of this service.

The new law standardizes the license plate replacement fee at \$6, and does away with the fee for classic, cotton, forestry, volunteer firefighter, tow truck, and radio operator license plates.

WHEELER residents who own trailers under 6,000 pounds will be pleased to know that the 75 registration fee categories for trailers are reduced to a fixed annual cost of \$45. And this includes travel trailers.

Truckers, trucking companies and those of you with other vehicles over 6,000 pounds, such as RVs, should no longer have to worry about whether you are paying the right registration fee. Gone

is not designed to make more money for the state or county. Its purpose is to apply common sense and fairness to what was a very complicated and complex fee structuring system that was difficult for many customers to understand and expensive for the state to maintain.

Plus the new categories set up to standardize registration fees are done in a way to ensure the state doesn't lose any registration revenue for building and maintaining Texas' roads and bridges. So now more than ever you can be proud to "Check the date, Love your state" and "Put Texas in your corner."

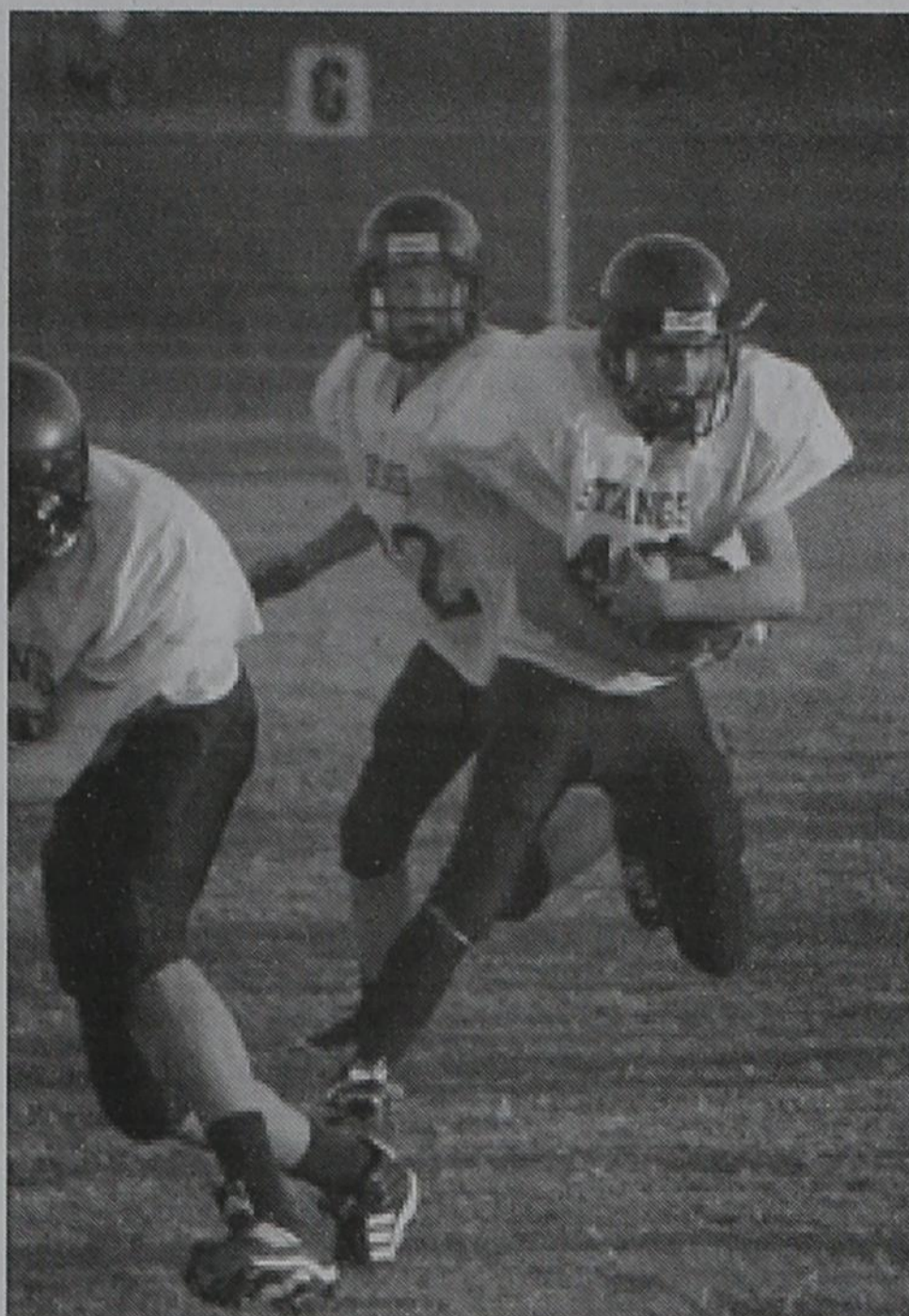
