LICENSE PLAN: Economy forces are taking a good look at whether or not the state's licensing practices might be unnecessarily expensive

Historically the state has issued licenses annually. There's now some thinking that a lot of the licenses could just as easily be issued permanently, subject to cancellation for cause. Fees would still be collected annually, but a lot of time and money possibly could be saved by not having to type out and mail a new document each year.

Such a procedure was authorized by the Legislature in regular sussion for insurance companies. Some licenses probably could

not be adapted to the permanent policy. Among these would be drivers licenses, hunting and fish-




