



An excessive number of alcohol-consumption violations have been recorded at Palo Duro State Park in the Texas Panhandle by parks personnel.


"A total of 28 citations for consumption of alcohol in public in a state park have been issued within the last three weeks," said Billy Baker, assistant parks superintendant.
