Increases Rates

Charles Hix, administrator of Parkview Hospital, announced today that room rates will be increased effective November 1.

It was the decision of the Board of Trustees at their regular meeting October 10, 1977 that this increase would be necessary to offset the increase in the cost of operations for the incoming year. It was noted at this time that even with the room rate increase Parkview Hospital is still from \$10.00 to \$20.00 per day under the daily room rate charge in most of our surrounding hospitals.

The rate changes as approved by the Board of Trustees and Blue Cross, the Medicare intermediary, will be: intensive care unit \$85.00, private room \$52.00, semi-private room \$47.00 and nursery \$22.00.
