





Fire Department Answers Calls

The Wheeler Volunteer Fire Department was call out Monday and Tuesday afternoons to the Mack Seitz residence six miles south of Wheeler. Monday a small trailer house and a truck were destroyed. A barn at that location was partially burned. The contents of the barn smoldered for about 24 hours before the fire department was again called to extinguish the blaze. The fire was orginally caused by fire crackers.

The local fire department closed out the month of June with three vehicle fires. The first of the three was caused by a welder; this fire was located north of town. The wiring in the Larry Finsterwald automobile caused a fire and the local firemen were called to the 500 . block of Seventh. The third in the series was the pickup belonging to J. C. Moore, Jr.; a butane leak caused the vehicle to catch fire in the 900 block of Canadian St.

The increase in the number of water fatalities is climbing at a faster rate than the number of registered boats and PW&D wardens will be out in full force during the holiday period.

The most flagrant violation noted by the wardens has been the insufficient number or entire lack of Cost Guard-approved life vests for each person on board. State laws requires these CG-

approved vests on all public waters and persons 12 years of age and younger are required to wear the CG-approved vest at all times while underway.

Local lakes might have more restrictive rules concerning life vests and boaters are remined to check these local regulations Outside County \$5.75 before putting afloat.


