Our neighbors to the north are not nearly so far along, however,

Richerson estimated the average yield of Wheeler County wheat at 20 bushels per acre with tests running about 60 with a moisture content of 12 to 14.

The present market price of wheat locally is \$1.70. Floyd Davidson, who lives east of Wheeler, was one of the first to cut his wheat. He brought a load into town Friday morning.

Some of the averages are running very high; Nelson Porter cut 15 acres of 42 bushel wheat; Harrison Hall got 32 bushels to the acre and the Mills Ranch was getting 22 bushels per acre and testing about 60.






