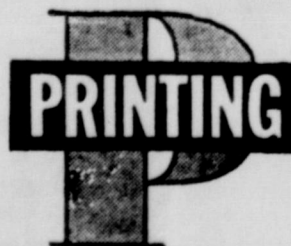

This is the first time the club has given this type of program but did real well as they had 100% of the members participating.

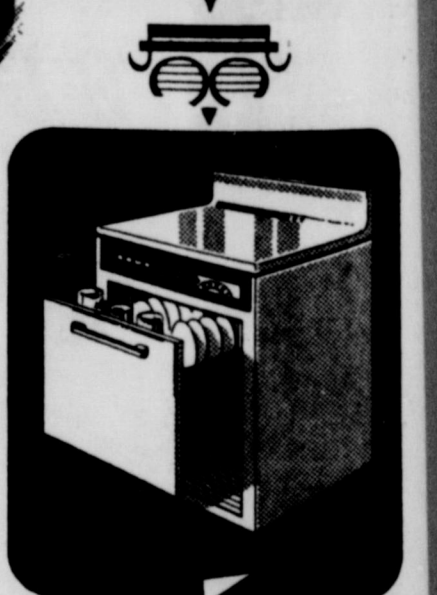
