

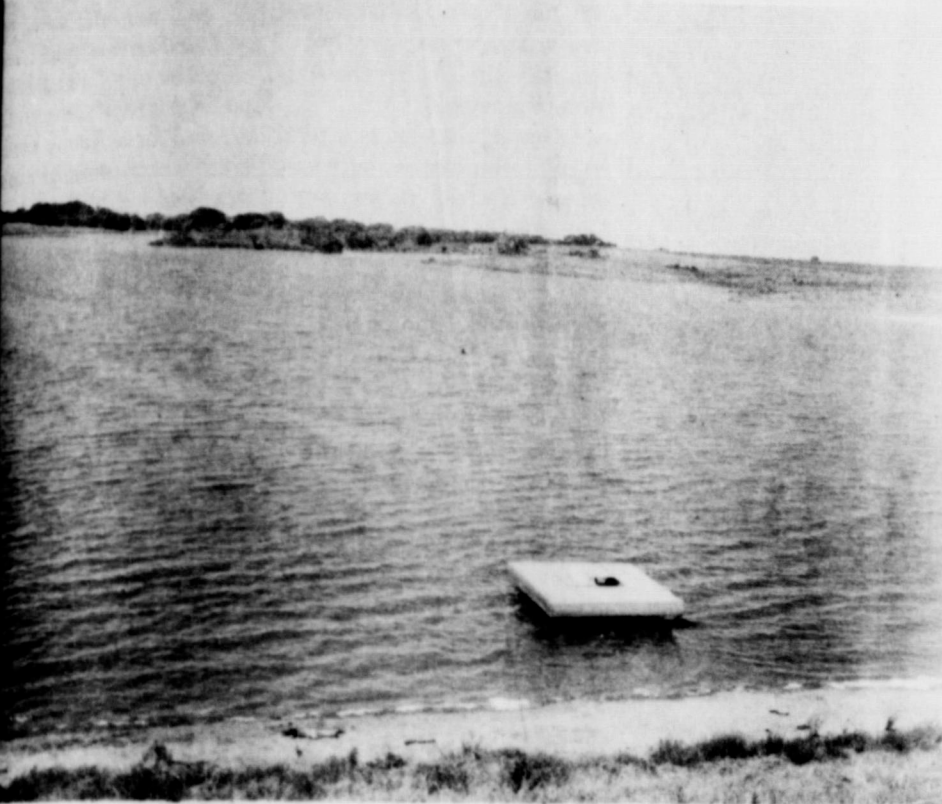

OLD SETTLERS MOBEETIE REUNION SEPT 5



Mobeetie residents are preparing 1200 lbs. of beef in expectation of a large crowd for the Old Settlers Reunion at the Old Jail in Old Mobeetie set for Labor Day, Sept. 5. The annual event was first held in 1952 at which Harry Wofford served as master of ceremonies for the crowd of over 1000 people.

In addition to the annual events of the reunion a historical marker has been erected at the Fort Elliott Flag Pole and a dedication ceremony will be held at 11:30 a.m. Esther Sorensen will make the dedication speech. Miss Sorensen lives on the place formerly owned by her parents and Wheeler County's first judge, Emanuel Dubbs. Miss Sorensen with a great interest in

the history of Wheeler County is in the process of restoring her home to its original appearance.

Douglas Corse is in charge of reunion activities. He announced Wednesday that Chuck Hogan and Harry Wofford will share the work as emcee for the day. The barbecue will be prepared under the direction of Dick Wright. Dick prepared the meat for the first barbecue and has served in this capacity each year.

Registration will begin at 9:00 a.m. Maurita Stribling will be in charge of registering the guests. Everyone must register in the Old Jail in order to be served the noon meal.

Plans for the day call for an Old Fiddlers contest recognition of the oldest

person, oldest settler and the person traveling the longest distance. As has been the policy in the past years a memorial service will be held to remember those who passed away during the past year.

The American Legion will be on hand to sell cokes. The Mobeetie Juniors and Seniors will have homemade ice cream on sale.

Dee Miller, Democratic candidate for U.S. Representative will be on hand to meet everyone along with Seibert Worley, Democratic candidate for State Representative.

Make plans now to attend the big celebration. This is a good opportunity to renew old acquaintances and make new friends.

Funeral services were held for James William Durham, 79, in the First Methodist Church in Wheeler, Wednesday, August 31, 1966 at 2:00 p.m.

James William Durham passed away in Parkview hospital Monday August 29, 1966 after a lengthy illness.

He was born in Jackson County, Alabama on March 31, 1887 to Irvin and Rebecca Durham. He was mar-

ried to Lillie May Brashear on January 31, 1910 in Montague County, Texas.

Mr. Durham was a retired farmer and had lived in Wheeler County since 1922. He had lived in Wheeler since 1947. Mr. Durham was a member of the First Methodist Church of Wheeler.

Surviving are his wife, Lillie May of Wheeler; two daughters, Mrs. Charlotte Coward of Mobeetie, Miss Gene Durham of Wichita Falls; also Miss Agnes Oliver of Wichita Falls; one brother, John Durham of Bowie; 6 grandchildren; 9 great grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by one son and one daughter.

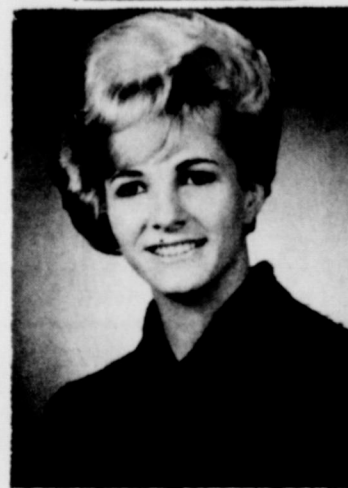

MARKER DEDICATION

According to John Ben Shepperd, President of Texas State Historical Survey Committee, the marker for the original Fort Elliott Flag Pole will be erected in Mobeetie, Labor Day on Monday Sept. 5, 1966.

This cast aluminum marker with Swedish steel effect for durability and appearance measures 18"x28" and is being erected by "State Matching Funds," Shepperd stated.

This is the 7th official Texas Historical Marker to be erected in Wheeler County. Others previously erected in Wheeler County include: Old Rock House on Harris farm, 1875; Mobeetie Jail, 1886; Frye Rock House, 1884; Bailly Rock House on David Britt's 1884; Rock School on T.M. Britt 1884; Jail in Wheeler, 1909, according to Mrs. Grady Harris of Wheeler, County Historical Survey Committee Chairman.

The public is invited to attend the dedication of this marker.

The inscription on the marker reads:

"Fort Elliott Flagpole, first stood about a mile to the northwest, at Fort Elliott, established 1875 to protect the Texas Panhandle from Indians.

J.J. Long, teamster-merchant, who arrived with the soldiers, was hired to provide a flagpole for the fort. In Cedar Breaks near Antelope Hills, 30 miles away, he cut two huge trees and hauled them here by wagon to build this 50 foot pole. After Fort Elliott closed in 1890, Long bought the pole and placed it in front of his store. Later at Mobeetie school for 20 years; it was erected here 1949."

PESTICIDE USE

By Vivian Warminski People who work industriously to keep their yard or large garden in top condition probably have use for more extension pesticide equipment and products, says Vivian Warminski, County Home Demonstration Agent.

Larger pesticide application equipment and containers of pesticide products may need more storage space than a homemade container can take care of, explains Miss Warminski.

If you already have a tool chest in the garage, partition off part of it so you can padlock the products and equipment.

If this is not possible, large multiple shelf metal cabinets are available. One of the lower shelves can be removed for tall equipment. Buy the type of cabinet with two doors and double door pulls. Use a long bicycle-type padlock to secure the doors. An enclosed table-box arrangement can double as a storage unit and a workbench at the same time.

Each pesticide applicator comes with cleaning and operating instructions. If more than a few days elapse between uses, follow these instructions--particularly the directions for cleaning. Application equipment may give off smelly and dangerous fumes, so provide for adequate ventilation in the storage area and follow the cleaning instructions. Make sure your equipment is not leaking or leaving drip spots in the storage area. A minor hose repair or slight adjustment to tighten a loose connection may be all that's needed.

It is a good idea to have separate application equipment for herbicides and for insecticides. If you do, mark them for their intended use and do not mix the two pesticides by mistake. You might end up with dead potato pests and plants as well. Never store a chemical that has lost its label.
