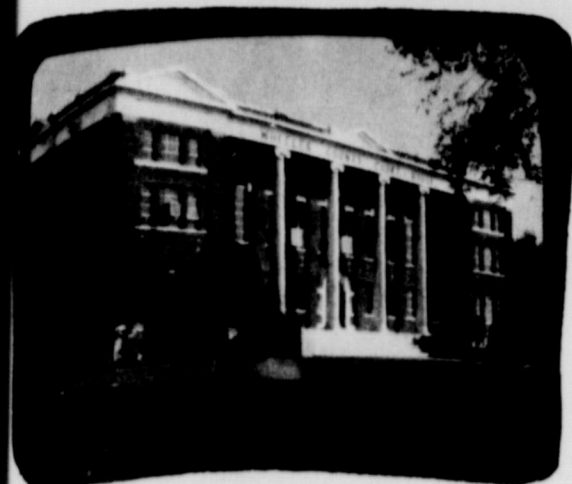

EXPLOSION INJURES THREE

Darville Atherton and two sons, Arville Dean, 19, and Rusty 15, received second and third degree burns Friday in a butane explosion. The men were attempting to clean out a radiator on a caterpillar on the Atherton farm, 12 miles east of Wheeler.

The explosion is attributed to a spark, however the exact cause is not known. The caterpillar was not hot, as it had not off for over an hour. Arville Dean was holding the hose at the time of the explosion; he turned the butane off and rolled on the ground, "As I had been trained to do."

The trio got into their pickup and drove a mile to the trailer house parked at the farm. Darville Atherton "took the wheel" and started to the hospital with the injured. They had traveled only a few miles when a tire blew out.

"The noon hour" traffic was not very heavy. Mrs. Atherton tried to stop one car and was unsuccessful. A

second car occupied by two women from Oklahoma did stop and bring them to Parkview Hospital.

The three received second degree burns over 60% of their bodies. Arville Dean

had third degree burns on his hands. The men are reported to be in satisfactory condition Wednesday.

Darville stated, "It's the same thing I've done a thousand times."

FHA Extends LOAN Service

John L. Manning, Chairman of the Wheeler County Technical Action Panel said today the Department of Agriculture had instructed its rural development specialists to "end the migration of rural people to large cities by helping small communities revitalize themselves."

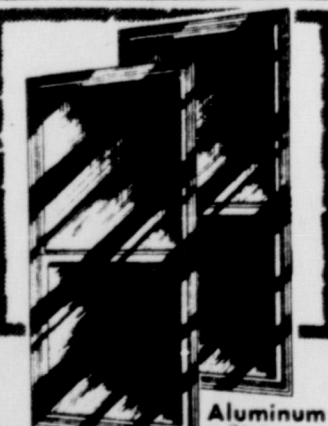

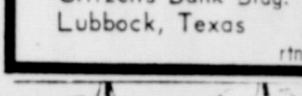

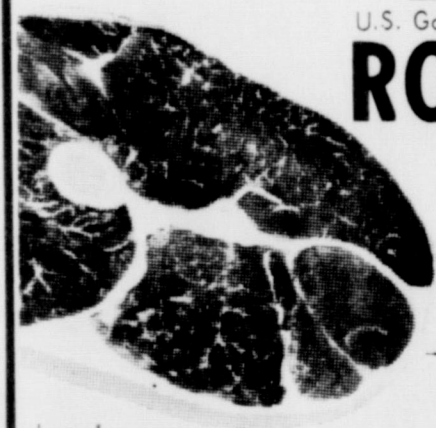
