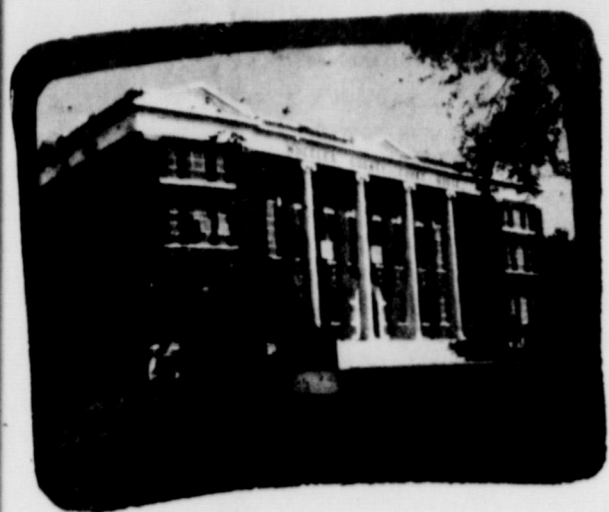

EX-STUDENT REUNION SAT. PLANE CRASH IS FATAL TO D. E. HOLT OF PAMPA

SERIOUS INJURIES RECEIVED AS HORSE FALLS ON YOUTH 9:00 — BARBECUE AT 6:00



Bradley Trout

John Bradley Trout, 18, was injured Sunday morning when a blind steer charged his horse. The horse fell on Bradley when it was struck and fell on him a second time after attempting to get on its feet. Bradley, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Trout of Mobeetie was working cattle on Dr. Montgomery's ranch 6 miles northwest of Mobeetie with his father, Dr. Montgomery and several hands at the time of the accident. Mr. Trout saw the accident and rushed to his son's aid. Bradley did not appear to be breathing and received mouth to mouth resuscitation from his father.

Wright-Denson Ambulance Service of Wheeler was called at 9:30 to take the 1965 graduate of Mobeetie high school to a hospital in Pampa. Later Sunday Bradley was taken to Northwest Texas hospital in Amarillo. The doctors report that Trout has a brain injury, a blood clot on his brain and two fractured vertebrae. He had not regained consciousness at the time of this writing. He has received a tracheotomy and doctors stated he has a good chance to live if he can survive the first 72 hours. Bradley was a skilled horseman as he had been riding horses and working cattle all his life. He has two brothers and three sisters. His grandmother Mrs. J. H. Bradley also lives in Mobeetie.

Final plans are in the making for the ex-student reunion set for Saturday August 14. The program for the day's activities was completed this week.

D. E. Holt

Damaris E. Holt was killed in a plane crash near Douglas Wyoming August 9. He was piloting the aircraft in which he and two other men lost their lives. They were returning home from a fishing trip to Canada when the fatal crash occurred. It is thought that there may have been engine failure.

Mr. Holt, was born Sept. 18, 1918 in Wheeler. He was partner in the Holt Bros. Drilling Co., Price Rd.

Mr. Holt was a graduate of Wheeler high school and studied engineering at Texas A and M College. He was married to Margaret Melton in 1939 and moved to Pampa in 1945.

The decedent was a member of the Top O' Texas Masonic Lodge 1381, Masonic Consistory of El Paso, Oriental Guide of Amarillo, Khiva Temple Shrine, Past Master of Pampa Masonic Lodge. A former member of the Pampa Independent school board, member of Perry Lefors Airport board and a member of the Pampa County Club.

Mr. Holt is survived by his wife, Margaret of the home, one son, David of Houston, three daughters, Mrs. Barbara Ingle of Pampa, Mrs. Linda Reid of Amarillo and Frances Holt of Pampa. Other survivors include a brother Robert Holt of Wheeler, a sister, Miss Clarice Holt of Fort Worth and one granddaughter.

Funeral arrangements are being handled by Carmichael-Whately Funeral directors.

Yeoman third Class James L. Jolly, USN, son of Mr. and Mrs. W. L. Jolly of Wheeler, Texas, was recently awarded the Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal for participation in operations at DaNang, South Viet Nam.

He was aboard the attack transport USS Bayfield during the period June 1-10 while the ship off loaded Marine Corps equipment and supplies urgently needed by US forces ashore.

Bayfield is the flagship of Amphibious Squadron Seven and is home ported at Long Beach, Calif. It is currently assigned to the powerful U. S. Seventh Fleet in the Pacific.

Information From County Agent

Ornamental Insects:
Many calls have been received lately concerning bagworms on ornamentals and elm leaf beetles on elm trees. Both of these insects may be controlled with the insecticide Sevin. Toxaphene may also be used to control both of these insects; however, Sevin is safer to use around pastures and gardens.

Protein Analysis of Hay and Silage:
More interest is being shown concerning testing of forage for protein. Necessary forms and information concerning the service may be obtained at my office. Cost for protein analysis is only \$2 for hay and \$3 for silage. Complete analysis is \$6 for hay and \$7 for silage. If requested, balanced feeding recommendations, based on forage tested for complete

analysis, will be provided at no extra cost. This information may be obtained for beef or dairy cattle.

All farmers and ranchers are reminded that claims for refund on federal tax on gasoline used on a farm must be mailed in before September 30.

The 1965 forms are available at the county agents office.

Hayland Management
 Hayland management is concerned with the management of hayland in such a manner so as to get the most production out of the crop. This includes proper management to maintain the plant in a good state of vigor until frost and to maintain sufficient residues through the dormant season to prevent wind erosion.
 Alfalfa should be cut when the blooms first appear and color just begins to show up. At this time the plant will leave its maximum state of protein content, which will decrease with further maturity. The plants should never be cut below a 4 inch height. This will leave enough leaf manufacturing material to keep from drawing from the root reserves which would reduce the plant vigor.
 Biennial grasses should be cut in the boot stage during the last cutting and then allowed to go into frost with an 8-12" height to allow replenishing of root reserves and to prevent wind erosion.
 Annual grasses should be managed so as to remove the most forage annually and to leave sufficient residues without danger of wind erosion.
 There are several supplemental aspects of hayland management such as correct irrigation application, proper fertilization, weed control, insect control, etc., which needs to be considered in hayland. For further information concerning hayland management contact your local Soil Conservation Service.

Rotational Deferred Grazing
 Deferred grazing is a means by which a pasture can be rested from grazing during an entire or part of a growing season. This allows the plants to increase in vigor and allows seedset occasionally.
 By rotational deferred grazing, we mean rotating grazing in such a way that all the pastures concerned will be deferred from grazing during the growing season one or more years. By this system we are able to obtain as much total forage and at the same time allow the grass plants to increase in vigor.
 Rotating the cattle in such a way that each pasture is deferred from grazing 4-6 months every 2 years during the growing season, usually allows sufficient deferment. The stacking rate can be doubled up on the pastures being grazed in order to allow for the total carrying capacity to be maintained.

He also intends to build a cross fence for better grass management. The City of Wheeler and Joe Wheately representing the Wheeler Chamber of Commerce have requested technical assistance with some erosion problems on the City park. These problems are being analyzed at this time. A concrete chute and controlled inlets for outside water are being considered as a way to handle the problem. The problem at the park would be greatly eased if the landowners on the watershed above would apply good conservation practices. It would help them also as it would stop the loss of valuable top soil from their fields.


