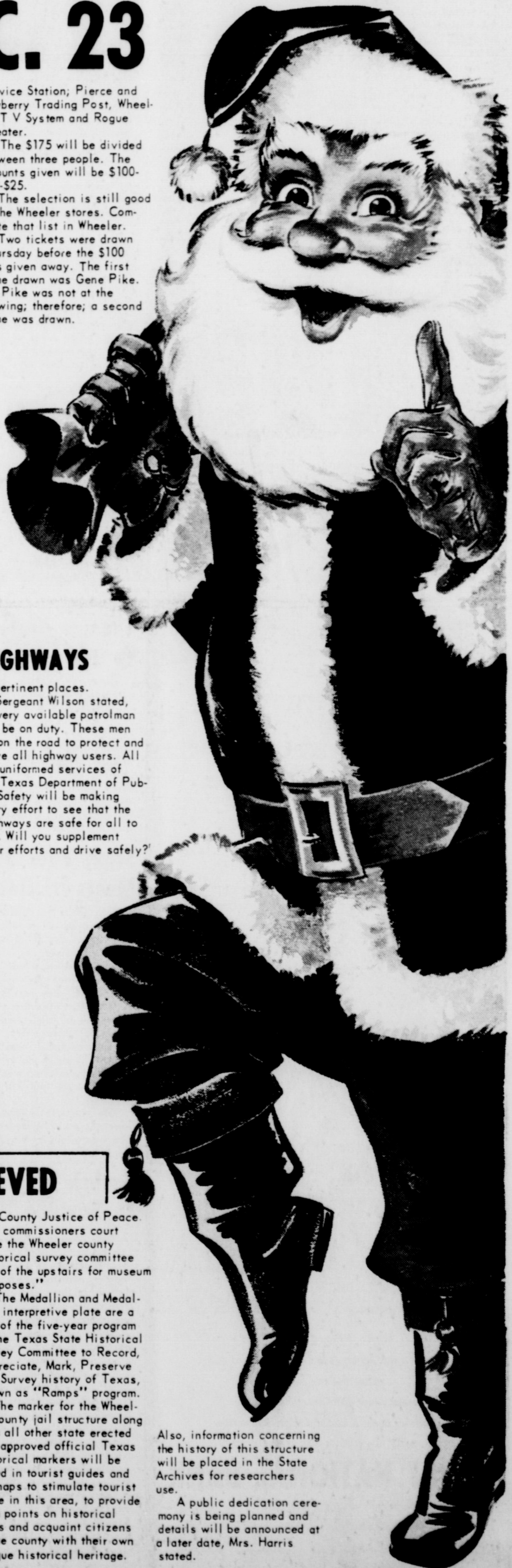

#### BRISCOE BRONCOS WIN MIAMI TOURNAMENT

The Briscoe Broncos captured the Miami tournament weekend with a 60-33 victory over Allison in the final game Saturday night.

The Atherton lead the Broncos with 18 points to lead the easy Briscoe win. This was the second straight time that the Briscoe boys brought home the first place trophy from Miami. The boys made their way into the final game by turning back stubborn Darrouzette 72-68 Thursday afternoon.

Atherton again proved too strong for the opponents by scoring 37 points with strong support from teammate Hays with 26 points.

In the semi-finals game, the Broncos met old foe, Hedden and soundly defeated

the Owls by a 56-36 score. Puryear paced the squad with 16 points followed by Atherton with 15 and David Zybach with 12 points.

The Briscoe girls lost their opening game to strong Darrouzette by a 51-36 score. The Bronettes had defeated the Darrouzette girls earlier this month but seemed unable to match the onslaught of the Darrouzette squad. Sophomore Helen Puryear hit 17 points for Briscoe but Kathy Hoelle had 23 for the opponents followed by Hansbee with 16 and Gensman with 12.

Going to the consolation bracket the girls played Hedley and beat them 41-21 with Lou Meadows scoring 20 points for Briscoe.

#### OLD JAIL MARKER RECEIVED

The official Texas Historical Building interpretive plate for the Wheeler county Jail has arrived from the foundry and will be placed beside the State Medallion already affixed to this structure, Mrs. Grady Harris, chairman of the Wheeler county Historical Survey committee of Mobeetie announced.

This interpretive plate, 14"x9" made of cast aluminum with Swedish Steel effect is sponsored by the Wheeler county historical survey committee.

The awarding of the Medallion plate signifies this structure is a Recorded Texas Historic landmark, worthy of recognition, appreciation, marking and preservation, John Ben Sheppard,

president of the Texas State Historical Survey committee stated. The sponsor will receive a beautiful Certificate signed by Governor John Connally of this designation by the State of Texas, he announced.

Other structures already named as Recorded Texas Historic Landmarks in Wheeler County include: Wheeler Co. Jail (first) Mobeetie; Mobeetie Rock House, on Harris Farm; Henry Frye home on Puryear ranch; David Britt Ranch Rock House; and Rock School on Britt Ranch.

We are extremely pleased that this plate interprets the history of this old historic jail, Mrs. Harris said, "particularly since the building presently houses the city library (downstairs part) and

the County Justice of Peace. The commissioners court gave the Wheeler county historical survey committee use of the upstairs for museum purposes."

The Medallion and Medallion interpretive plate are a part of the five-year program of the Texas State Historical Survey Committee to Record, Appreciate, Mark, Preserve and Survey history of Texas, known as "Ramps" program.

The marker for the Wheeler county jail structure along with all other state erected and approved official Texas historical markers will be listed in tourist guides and on maps to stimulate tourist trade in this area, to provide high points on historical tours and acquaint citizens of the county with their own unique historical heritage.

Also, information concerning the history of this structure will be placed in the State Archives for researchers use. A public dedication ceremony is being planned and details will be announced at a later date, Mrs. Harris stated.

As a service to farmers and ranchers, the Federal Land Bank Association of Shamrock will join in a national program of public information keyed to the 50th anniversary of the Federal Land Bank System. The Shamrock association, along with some 700 associations and the twelve Federal Land banks, will carry out the program to make all Americans aware of the importance of agriculture.

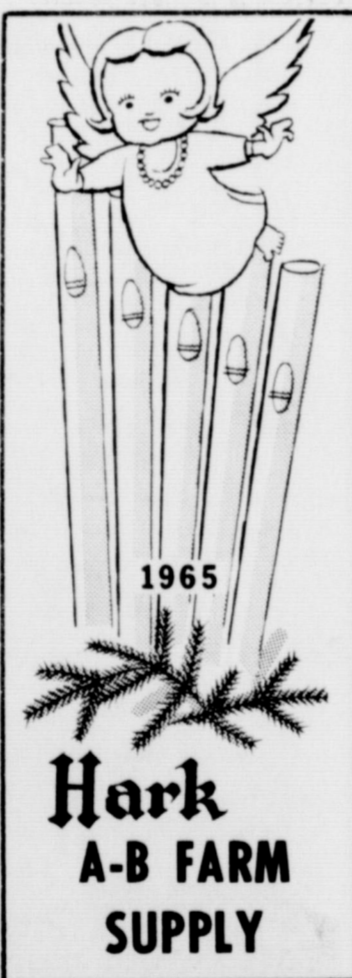


