#### APRIL 15 DEADLINE FOR CAR INSPECTION IS FAST APPROACHING

Time is running out to have those inspection stickers put on your car. This year's requirements have been changed to include checking the wheels and steering. Also seat belts will have to be installed on all cars with seatbelt anchors.

There are 5,517 registered vehicles in Wheeler County. As of March 1, 36% or 1,986 vehicles had been inspected. This leaves 3,531 cars to be inspected before the April 15 deadline.

Persons owning cars which will require the installation of seatbelts are reminded that the supply of seatbelts might run out close to the deadline. Seatbelts will also be required on pickups and trucks with seatbelt anchors.

**IRISH COFFEE**

March is a busy time for Wheeler County, but it is particularly busy for the town of Shamrock. Soon Shamrock will be celebrating St. Patrick's Day with its annual celebration. I hope the whole county will visit and join Shamrock in this celebration. In honor of the St. Patrick's Day celebration I would like to share with you some Irish recipes straight from Ireland.

**Plum Pudding**  
1/2 c. light molasses  
1/2 c. brown sugar  
1/4 c. butter 1 t. salt  
1 t. soda 3 c. flour  
1 c. milk 2 c. dates  
1 t. cloves 2 c. raisins  
2 t. cinnamon 1/2 c. peel

Mix fruit together. Mix sugar, fat, molasses, soda. Add and blend in milk. Add flour mixture and fruit mixture alternately. Grease three 1 pound shortening cans (with lids) Half fill cans with dough. Place in canner or rack above water-bath and steam for 4-5 hours. To store, refrigerate or freeze in container. Heat before using, serve with lemon sauce. Serves 12-15 people.

**Irish Coffee**  
Fine granulated sugar  
Strong black coffee, Irish Whiskey (if wanted) whipped cream

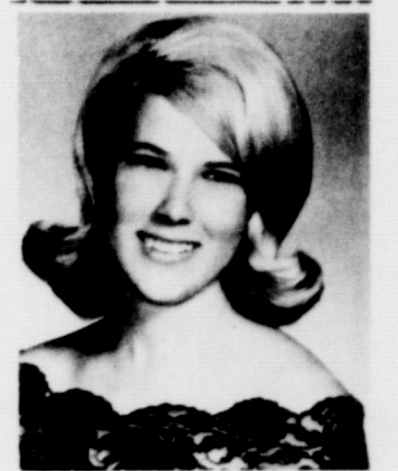
Into a warmed cup, place two teaspoons of sugar and fill glass about 2/3 full with hot coffee. Mix Add about 2 T. of Irish Whiskey (if wanted) and top with whipped cream. Makes one serving.
