last Friday night and the Bronchos left Nicholson Field with a 37-7 victory under their belts and in a three way deadlock for the District 2-A Championship.

Saturday morning the representatives of Memphis, Claude and Clarendon met in Clarendon for the coin toss to see who would represent District 2-A in the bi-district clash with the powerful Stinnett Rattlers of 1-A. On the third toss, the Bronchos were successful and will play the Rattlers in Panhandle Friday night at 7:30.

It wouldn't be hard to convince the Mustangs that their district will be well represented after the Mustang went down to their third district defeat.

The Mustangs fought the Bronchos to a standstill for the first half and saw their 7-7 first quarter standoff evaporate under the flying, and churning feet of Kenneth King, the great 175 lb. running back of the Bronchos.

The fired up Mustangs gave no quarter in the contest and it was a sad ending for the careers of 10 Mustang footballers who saw their day

in the black and gold on the gridiron come to an end.

Clarendon, knowing they had to win, didn't waste much time and got on the scoreboard just 2:23 after receiving the opening kickoff.

Five plays got the Bronchos out to their 42 and then Kenneth Reese turned the corner at the Mustangs left side and behind perfect blocking, broke into the clear at the Wheeler 45 and just outran his pursuers for a 58 yard scoring jaunt.

King split the uprights for the Bronchos and the Bronchos were never headed although the Mustangs came back to tie late in the first period.

The Mustangs didn't draw a yard in fines in the game and didn't lose the pigskin via the fumble route but five fumbles did hurt their cause.

Lewis Britt fumbled for a yard loss on the Mustangs first play from scrimmage but came right back to pick up 12 in two carries for a first down at the Mustang 41. Kent Ware fumbled a pitch on the next play but recovered for a loss of 7 and the Mustangs had to punt three plays later.

From the Broncho 46, Randy Croslin fumbled on the option after Lonnie Whitenner applied a hit to him and Larry Rives recovered for Wheeler at the 43. Britt got 3 and 1 before Mark Bateman found Whitenner all alone in the Clarendon secondary and hit the Mustang end with a 14 pass for a first and ten at the 25.

A climb at right guard by Britt picked up 6 and he added 3 more at right tackle.

Breaking a tackle just beyond the line of scrimmage, Britt veered to the outside and was knocked out of bounds at the Broncho 3.

Trying left tackle, Britt got 1 and then the Bronchos were offside the next play and that put the ball at the one. Britt plunged over for the Mustangs lone TD with 2:21 left in the first quarter. Jim Verden tied the game up with his sixth extra point kick of the year.

From this stage of the game, the Bronchos began to shut down the Mustangs running game and forced them into obvious passing situations and the hard rushing visitors harassed quarterback Bateman into incompletions and sacked the young signal caller five times.

Trailing 14-7 after a 60 yard, 10 play drive with King scoring for the Bronchos the Mustangs valiantly tried to get back on the scoreboard.

From his 23, Bateman passed to Rives at the mid-field stripe and Rives fell to the ground with the ball and Johnny Gerner on top of him. It was to no avail as one official ruled an in-completion and the Mustangs had to punt and the momentum changed.

Fumbling the snap on the kick attempt, Verden was unable to get the kick away and the Bronchos took over at the Wheeler 19.

Three plays got five and the Bronchos elected to go for the field goal but King's attempt was wide to the left at 2:41.

Wheeler got seven yards in three plays with Britt getting 6 on two tries and Ware adding one and Verden booted out of bounds at the 50.

King got 14 on a draw before Whitenner, Dale Helton, Verden and Hardcastle downed Croslin for a loss of four.

The Bronchos called on King again on the draw and he rolled for 19 down to the 21 where the Bronchos called time.

Faking a field goal, the Bronchos went to the air but Gerner's pass was too tall and 6 ticks remained in the half. Gerner placed the ball down at the 28 and King booted the 38 yard three pointer for the 17-7 Clarendon halftime lead.

Facing the wind and the tough Clarendon defense in the third quarter kept the Mustangs in poor field position.

Reese returned Verden's second kick of the period 19 yards to the Wheeler 33 to set up the Bronchos third touchdown.

Alternating King and Jerry Holland on the rushing chores, the Bronchos drove into the end zone in eight plays with King punching it over from the one. King added another one pointer and the Bronchos were out of reach at 24-7.

Bateman passed to Whitenner for 17 for the only sizable Mustang gain in the final half but it only got the ball back to line of scrimmage following two losses for 17.

Midway in the fourth quarter, the Mustangs were forced to kick from their 46 and it turned out that it would have been better to give up the ball on downs.

At least four Bronchos swarmed through on the snap and Rodney Hicks belted the ball off of Verden's toe toward the Mustang end zone.

King picked the ball up and raced for the Bronchos fourth touchdown. King booted the 31st point at 5:30.

With 1:05 remaining in the game, Reese passed 17 yards to Scott Hamilton for the final scoring after the Bronchos had taken over on the Mustangs 29 when the Mustangs were still trying to move the football.

"Clarendon is real tough and will be a good representative for our district," Coach Jim Bateman said this week. "We are real proud of the way our kids played against Clarendon and they put out good effort. We got into a hole in the third quarter and couldn't get out and that ruined us in the last half."

"The coaching staff and the kids all feel like we could have had a better season if things had gone our way a little more but that is football," the head mentor of the

Mustangs said.

"Our seniors gave it all they had and the Mustangs will miss their play next year," Bateman added.

The ground oriented Mustangs played on an even basis with their opponents statistically wise for the ten game season and were led in their rushing attack by senior tailback Lewis Britt, who gained 1169 yards, and junior fullback Kent Ware, who picked up 424 yards.

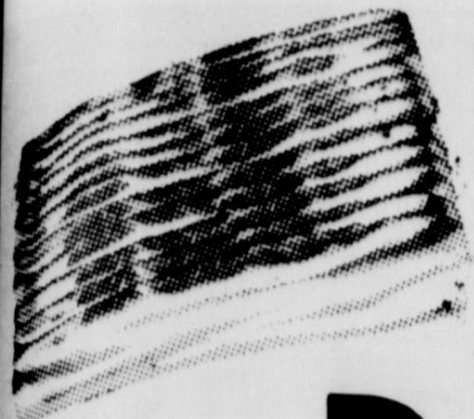

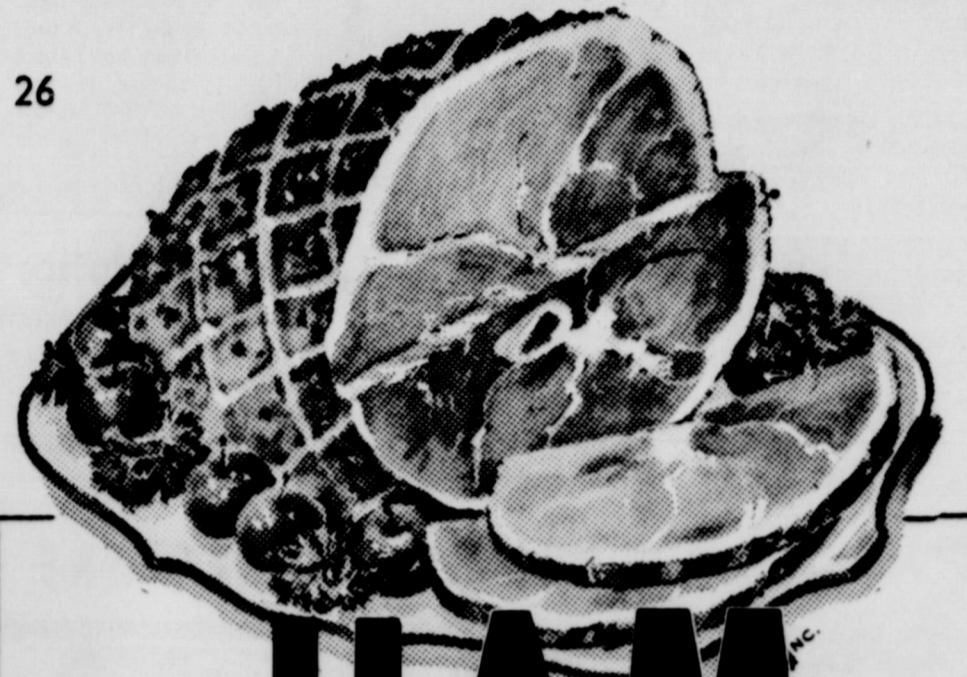

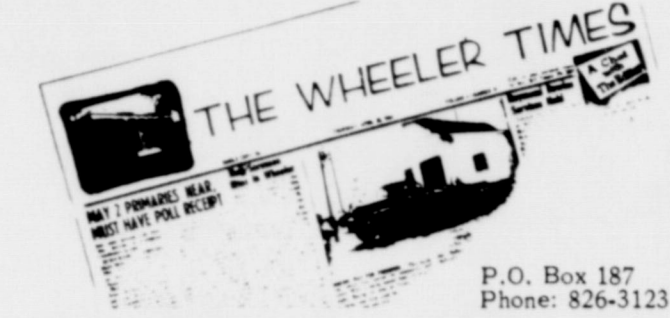
