Albert McWhorter led the Mustangs with 15 on six field goals and three free tosses and Hollis Adams put in 10 points.

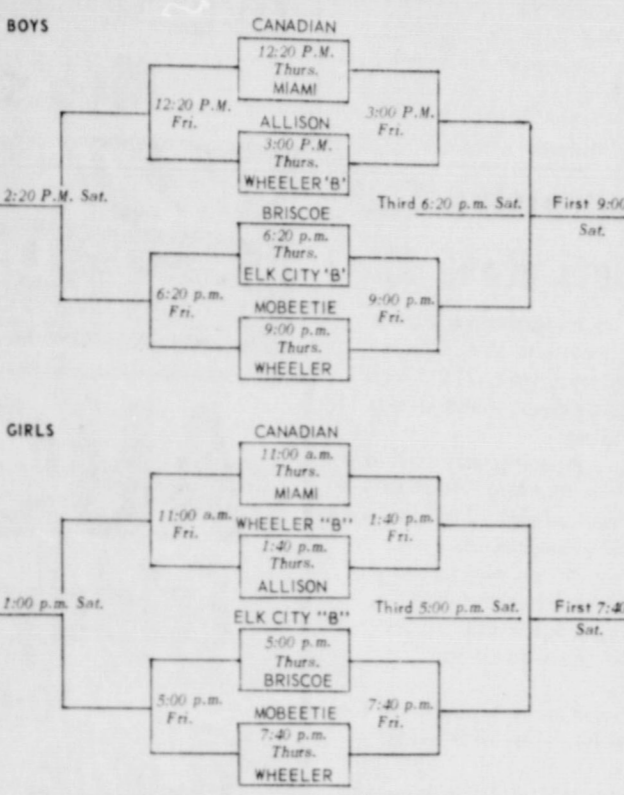

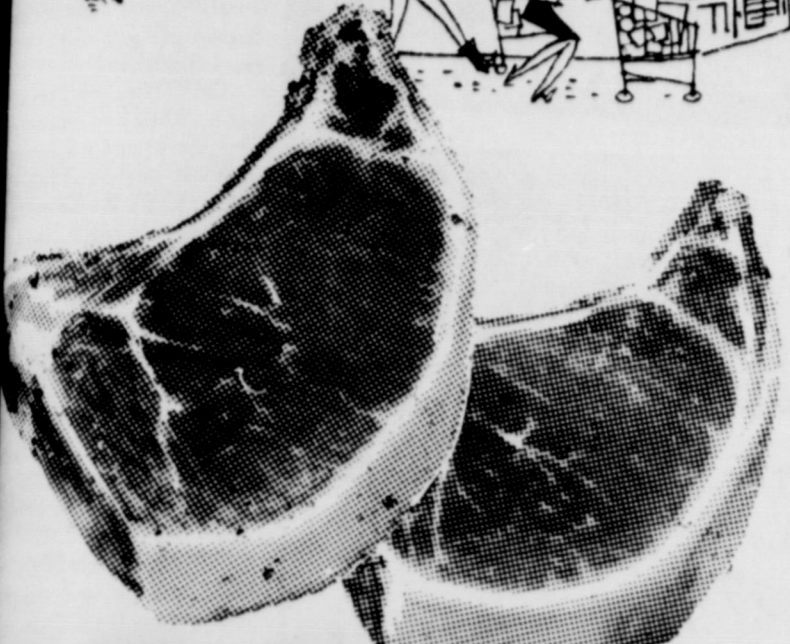

These Candy Candle Rings are easy enough that little folks can help and pretty enough to give to a favorite teacher or a Brownie Leader. A puffed rice-marshmallow mixture is shopped in rings and a colorful candle is placed in the center of each as a "permanent" remembrance. (Also - a recipe for Sour Cream Yule Cake.)
CANDY CANDLE RINGS
5 cups puffed rice
6 cup miniature marshmallows
candied red cherries
1/2 cup butter
candied green cherries
Heat puffed rice in large shallow pan in 350° oven for 10 min. Pour into greased large bowl. Melt marshmallows and butter in the top of a double boiler, stirring occasionally until smooth.
Pour marshmallow mixture over puffed rice, stirring until evenly coated. With greased hands shape mixture to form 4 round candle holders about 5 inches in diameter, placing candle (no larger than 1 1/2 inches around) in center of each. Decorate with red and green candied cherries. Cool.
SOUR CREAM YULE CAKE
3/4 cup boiling water
3/4 cup corn meal
2 2/3 cup sugar
1 cup butter
1/4 tsp. soda
6 eggs
3/4 tsp. almond extract
2 1/3 cup allpurpose flour
1/2 tsp. salt
1 cup dairy sour cream
Pour boiling water over corn meal; set aside. In mixing bowl beat together sugar and butter until light and fluffy. Add eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition. Add softened corn meal and almond extract. Sift together flour, salt and soda; add to creamed mixture alternately with sour cream, beating after each addition. Pour batter into greased and floured bundt pan or 10 inch tube pan. Bake at 350° for 1 1/2 hours or until done. Cool 15 min. remove from pan. Cool thoroughly; sprinkle with confectioner sugar.

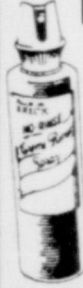
