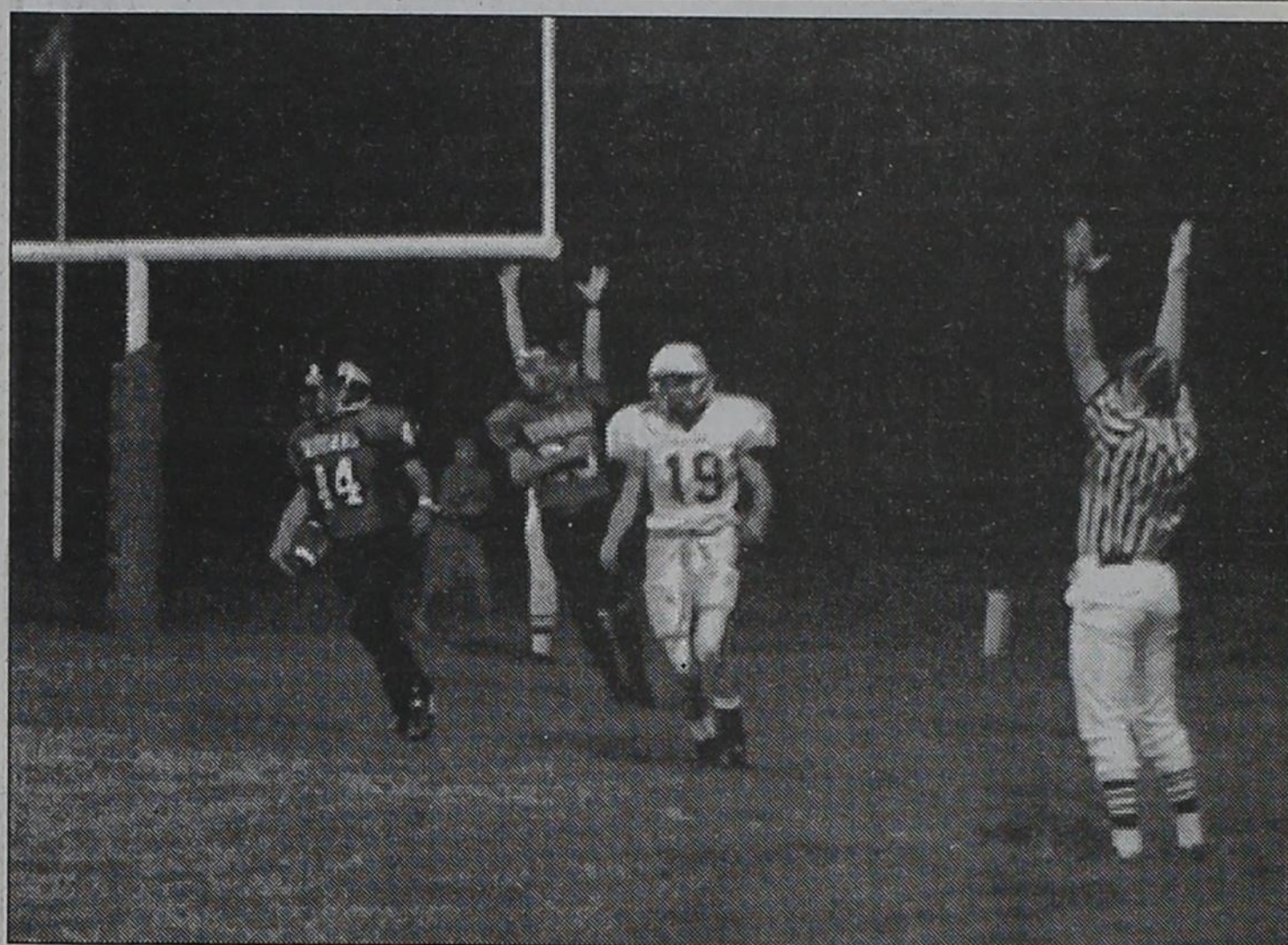

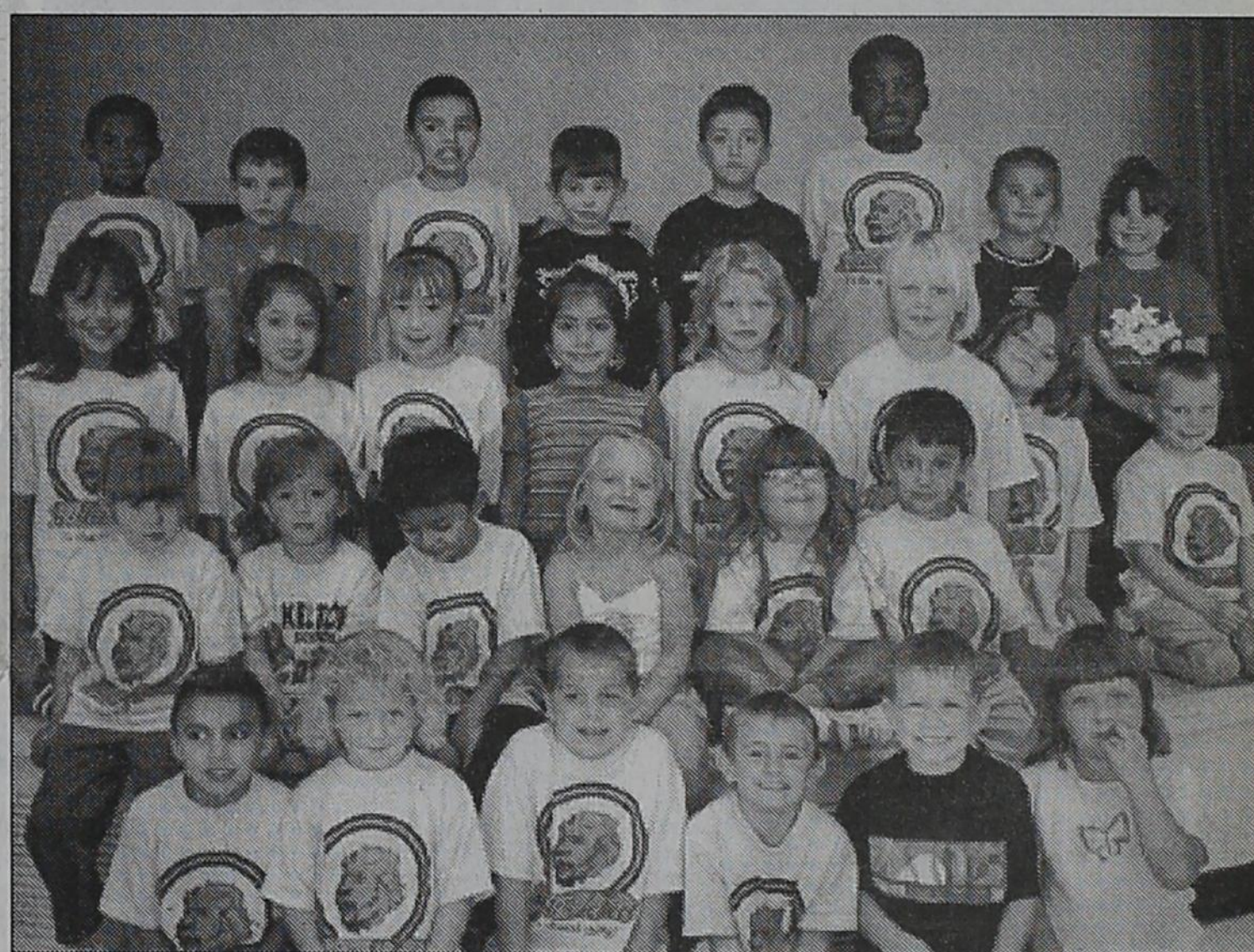
County Translator To Have Annual Meeting

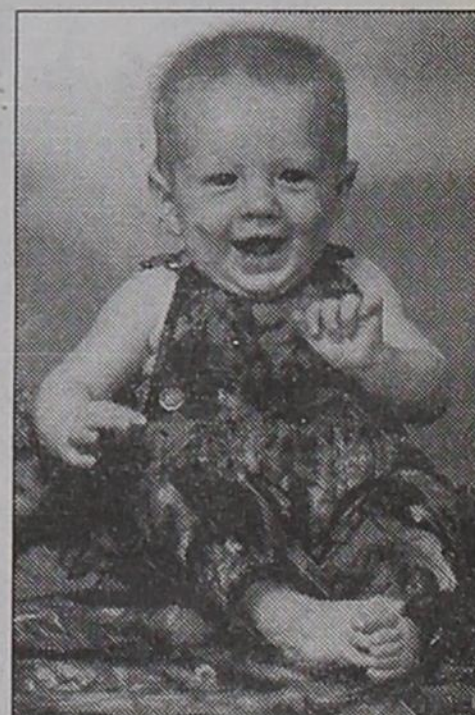

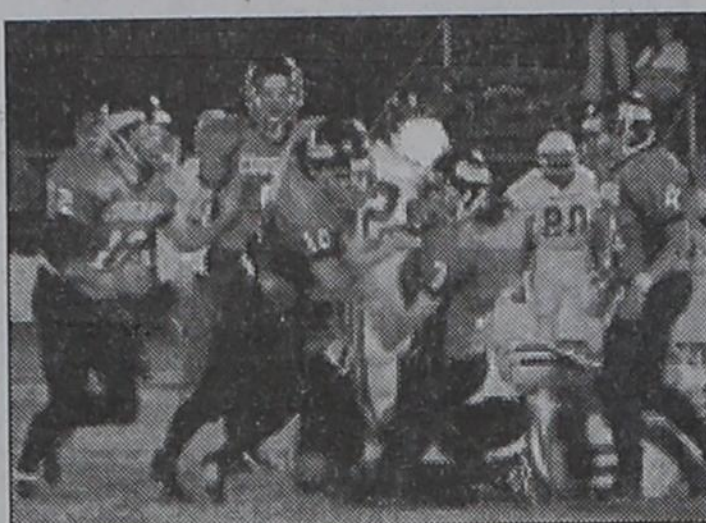

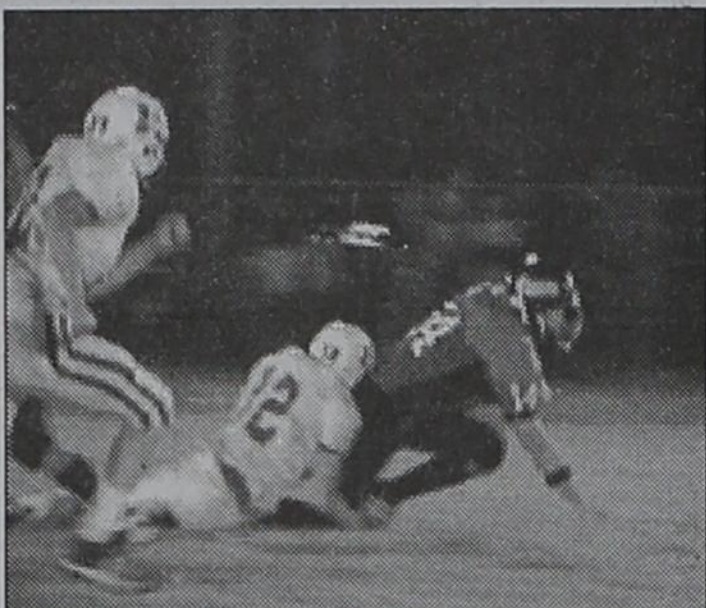

My daddy, Jack Guynes, was born and lived in Wheeler until he and my mother, Vergie Ashley Guynes, moved to Borger in 1948.

He read with interest a note that was in *The Wheeler Times* last week. The article talked about a gun that was used in Mobeetie by Henry "Hank" Flanagan to shoot a bank robber. (My daddy says that Mr. Flanagan got a \$5000.00 reward for killing the robber.) My daddy was a young man—probably about 16 at the time. He worked at Gaines Drugstore (now Hyland's Pharmacy). He remembers someone saying that across the street at Norwood McPhearson's filling station there was a car—sort of a station wagon/panel—with the dead bank robber in the back. Being a very curious guy, my daddy went across the street and did indeed see the dead man stretched out in the back of the car. He remembers that at the same time there was a bank robbery in Allison and rumors of a robbery at the bank in Wheeler. He says that the people in Wheeler were very nervous about this for a long time. The bank in Wheeler was not robbed.

It's fun to hear memories of Wheeler from my dad.

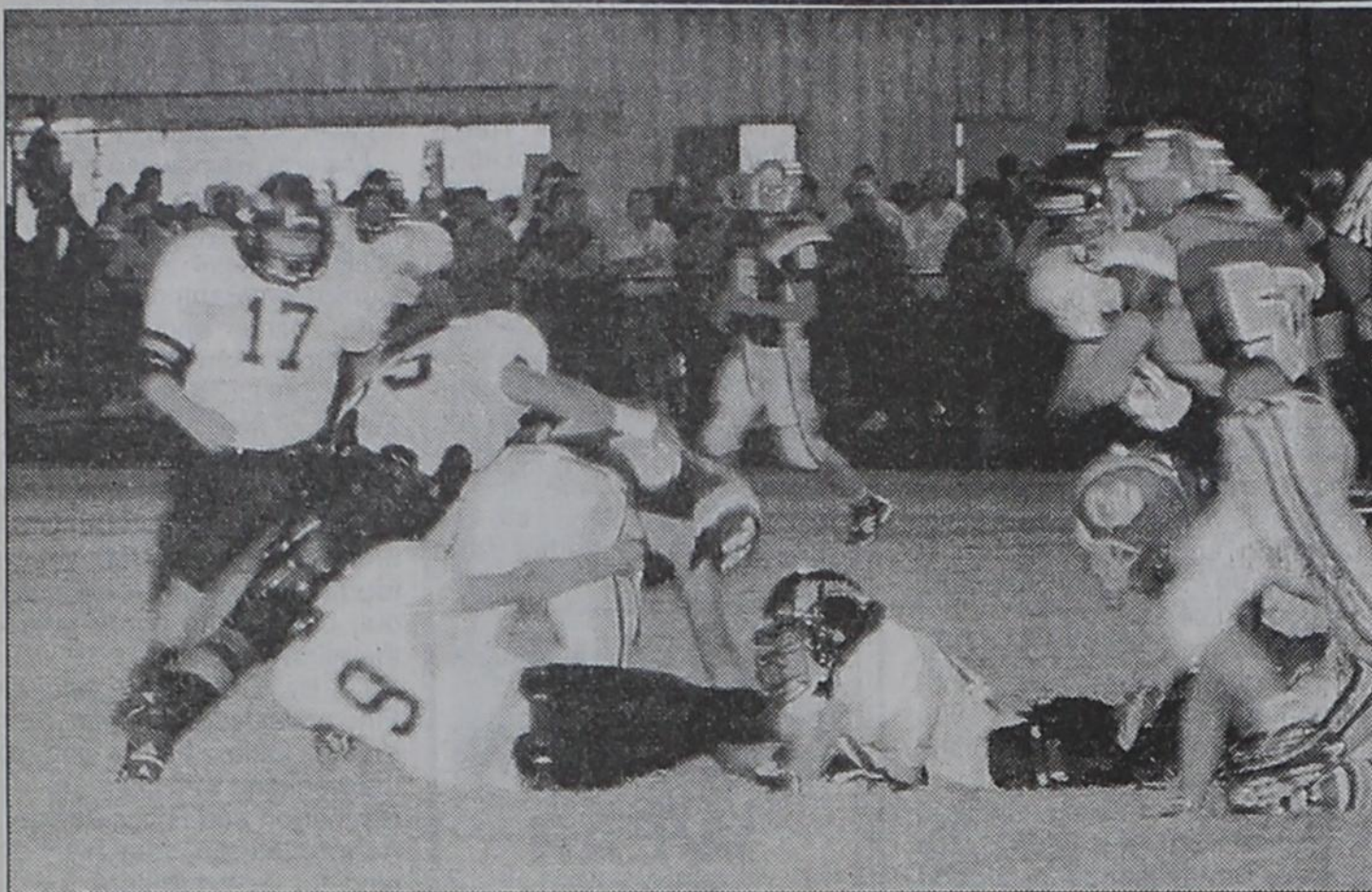

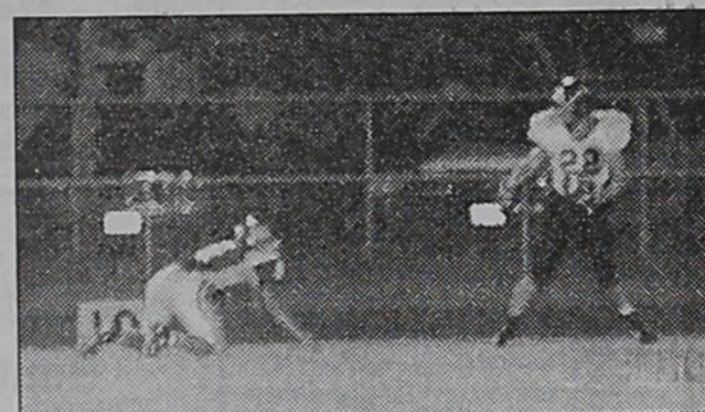

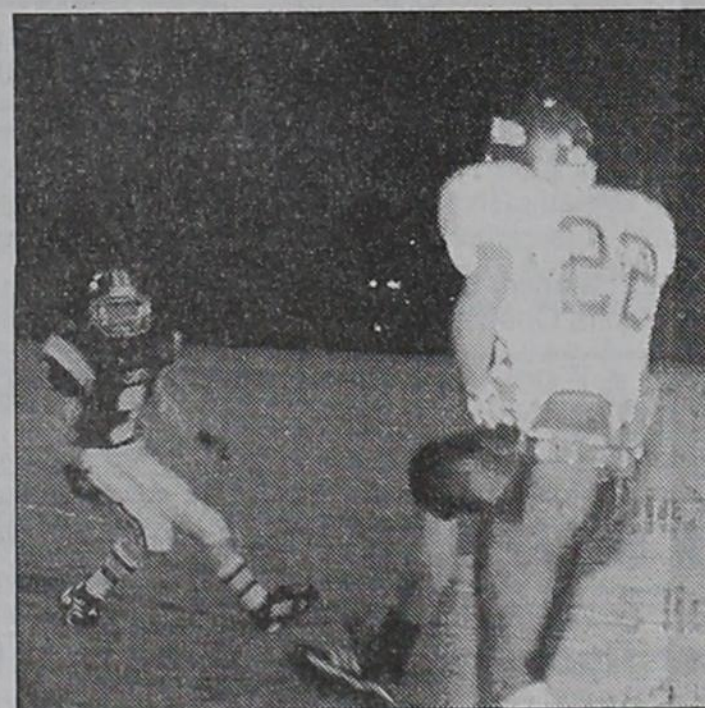

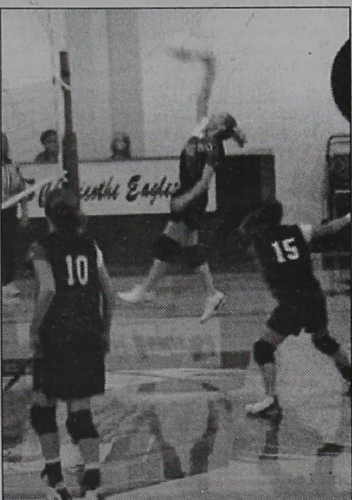
