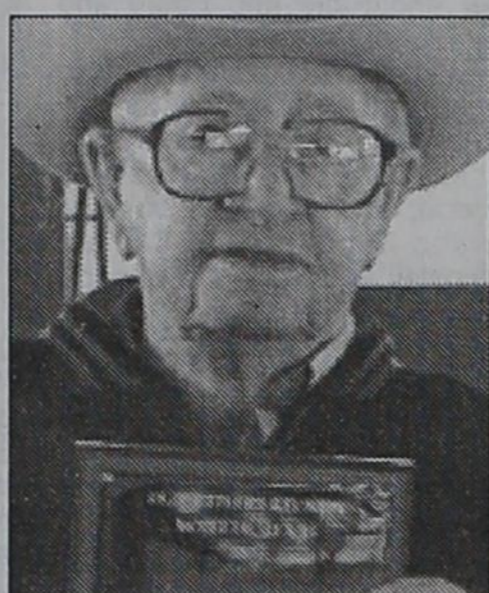

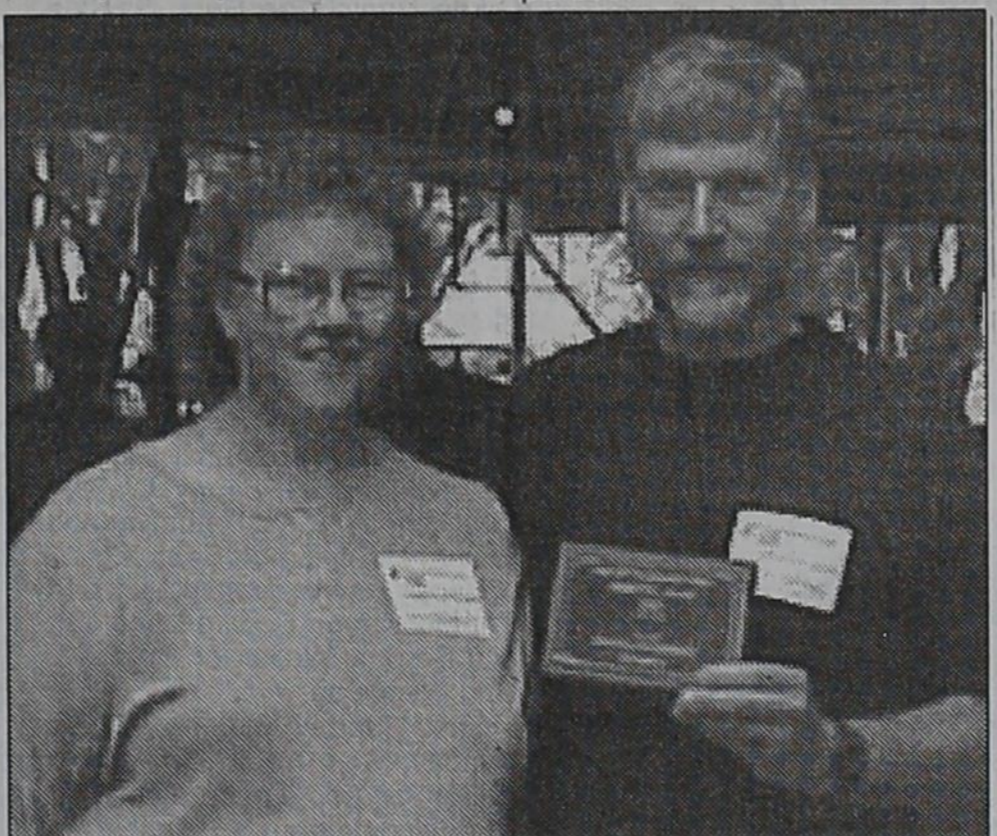

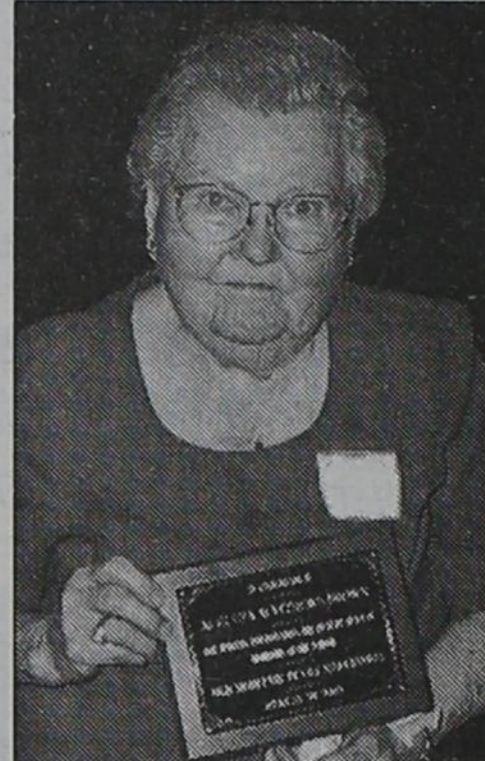

as treasurer. There were no nominations from the floor and these were elected.

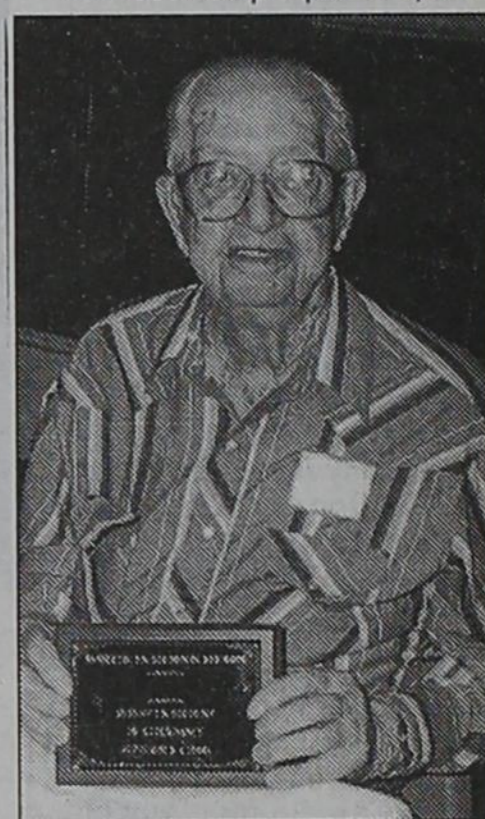

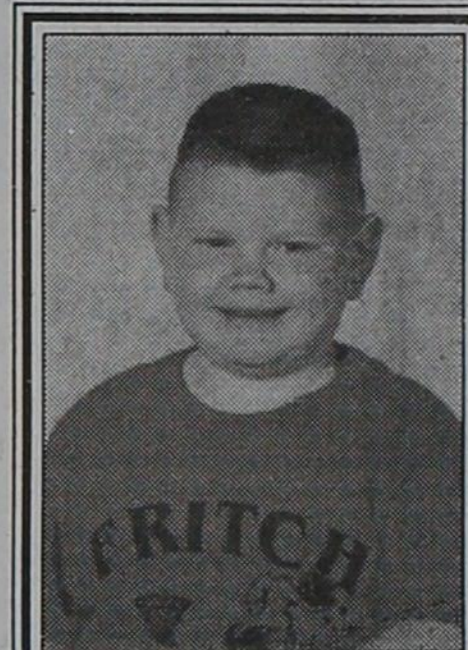

You shall not give false testimony against your neighbor. You shall not covet your neighbor's house. You shall not covet your neighbor's wife, or his maidservant or maidservant, his ox or donkey, or anything that belongs to your neighbor."
