## Scott Porter Named To Serve Term On Tax Appraisal Board

Wheeler County Commissioner's Court met in special session on Monday, November 3, 2003, 10:00 a.m. at the Courthouse Annex at 410 Main Street in Wheeler.

Three items were on the agenda. The court had received a bill from Phoenix I for work that has been done during the month of October. The bill was for \$244,503.95. The bill was approved for payment. This bill will now be sent for the county to receive payment from the Texas Historical Commission; they will get back 80.3 percent. The county's part for the repairs is \$49,000.

Wharry Engineering also presented a bill for \$10,000, for which the county's part will be \$1,930.

Scott Porter was re-appointed to the Wheeler County Tax Appraisal District board. The appointment is for two years, effective December 31, 2003.

Wheeler county had three buildings damaged in the hail storm earlier this year. The damage to the Sheriff's Department building was in the amount of \$7,377.25; old jail on the courthouse square was \$2,411.50; courthouse roof amounted to \$11,578.00. The commissioners accepted the insurance checks issued.

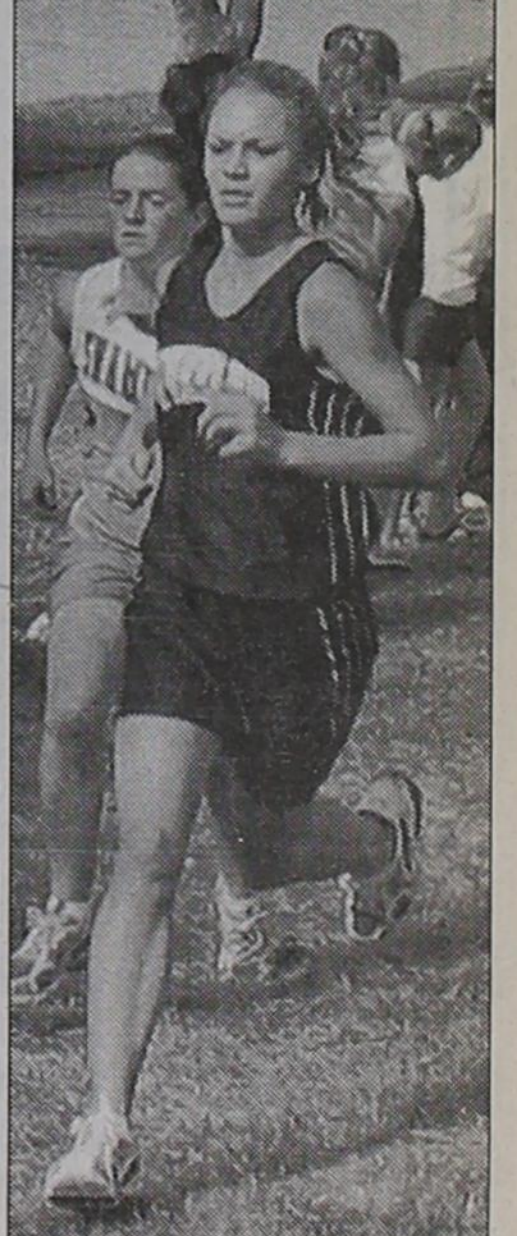

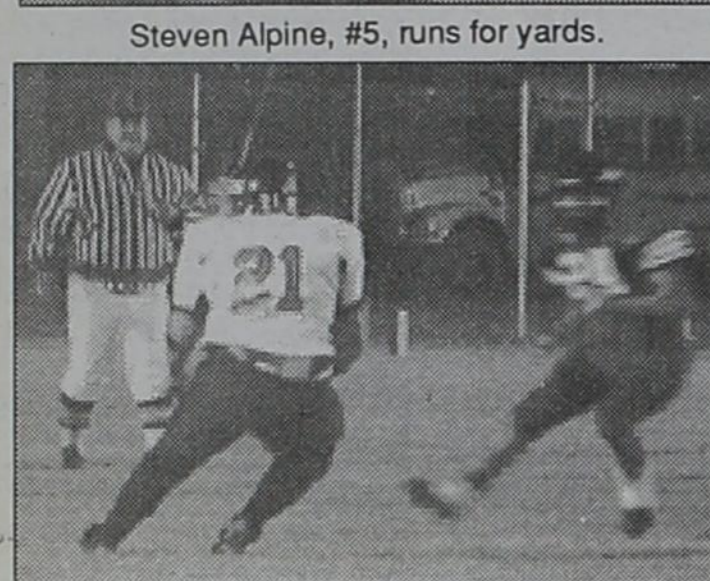

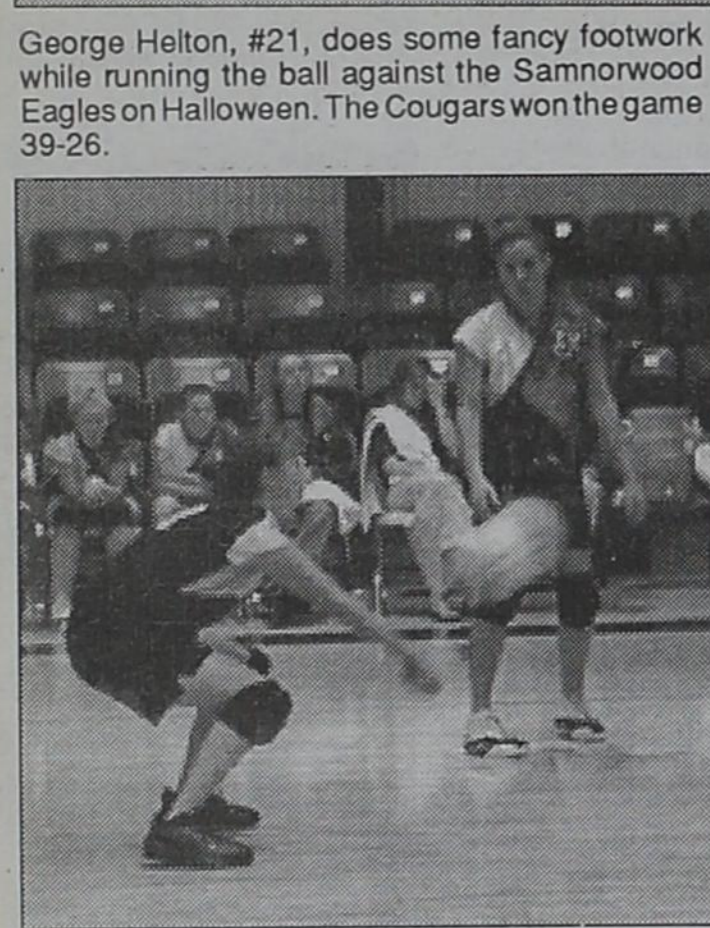

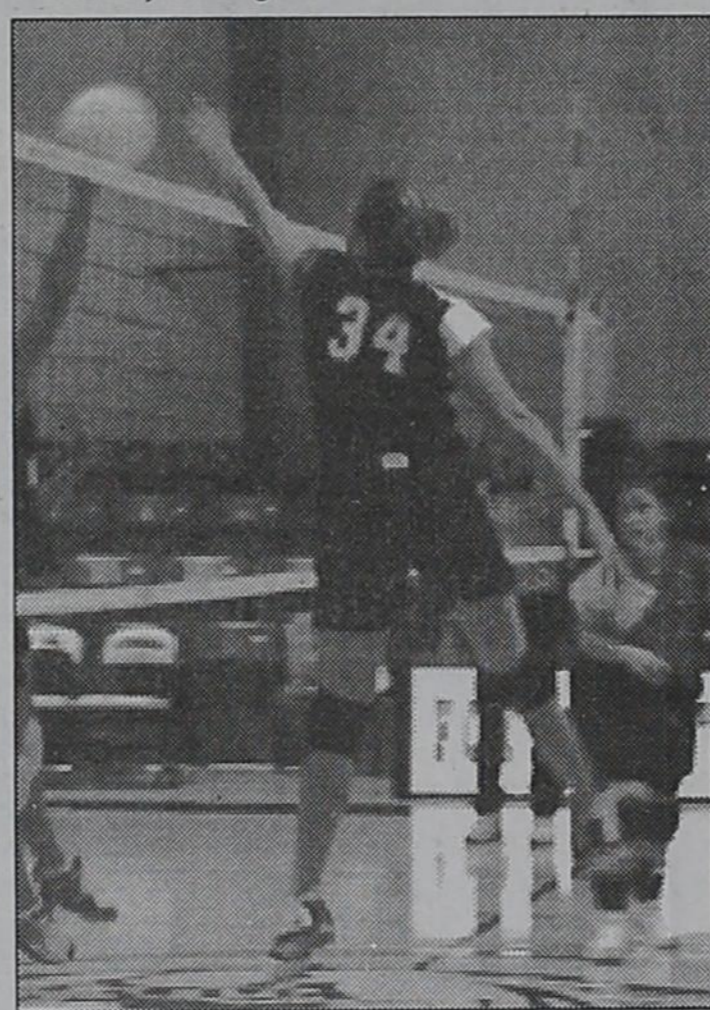

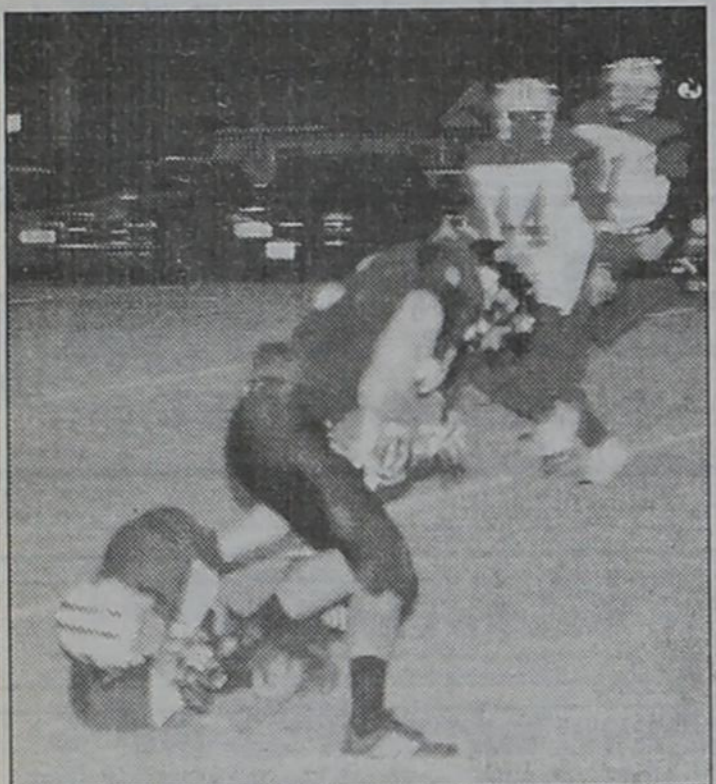

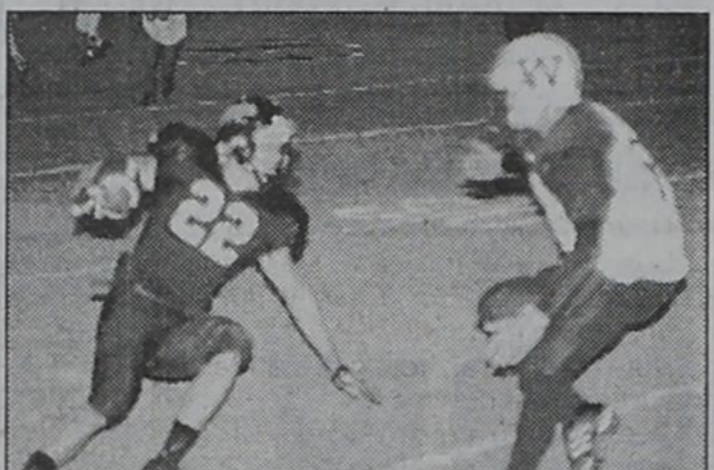

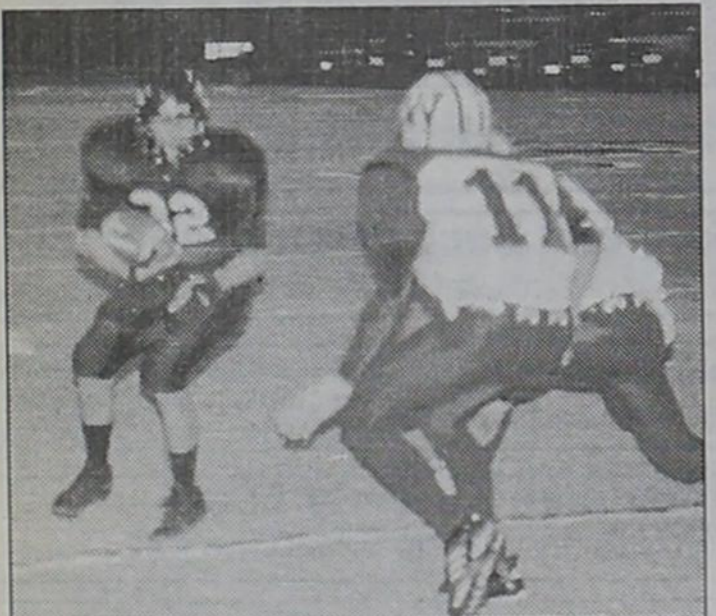

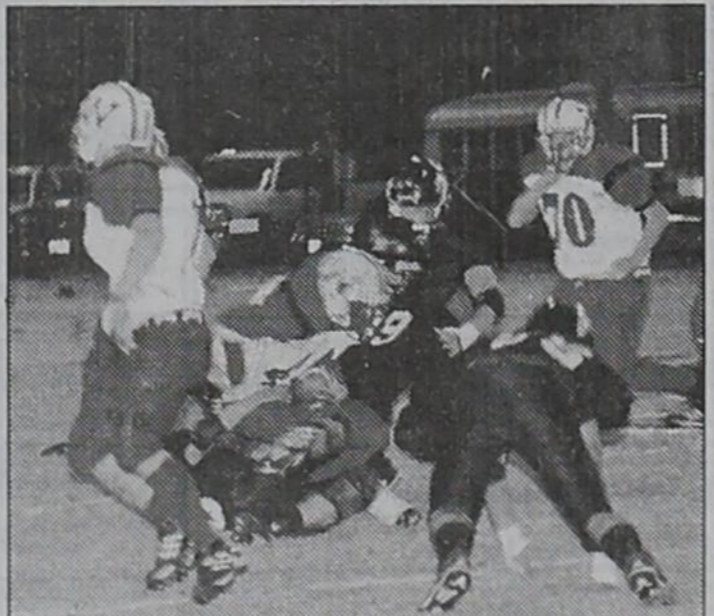

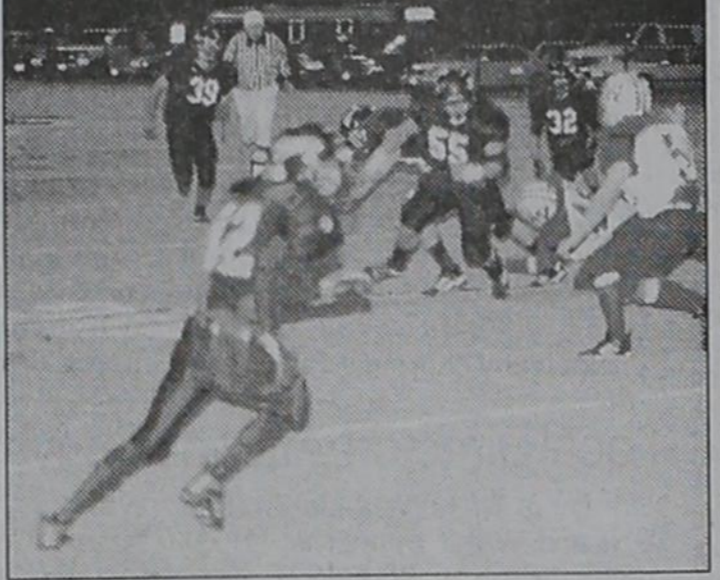

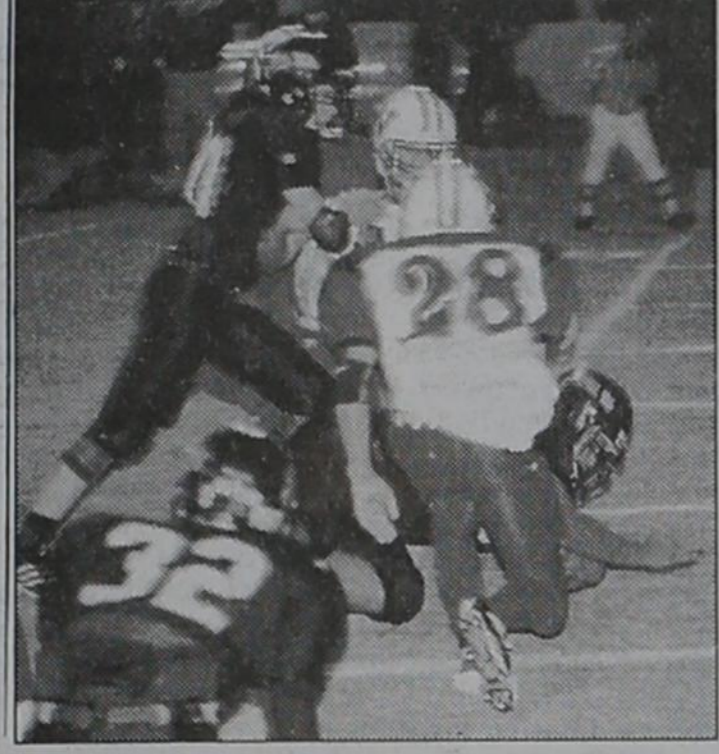

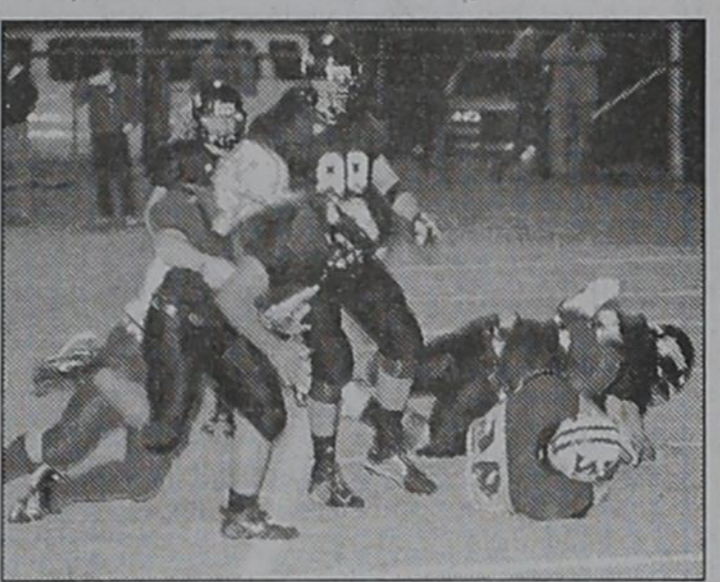

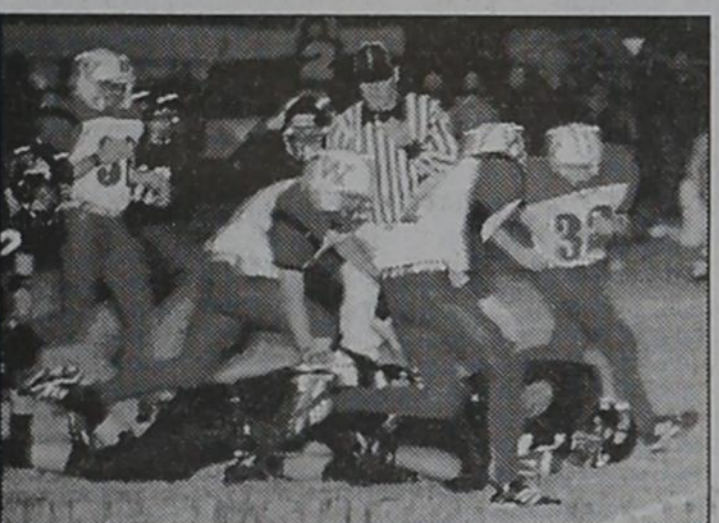

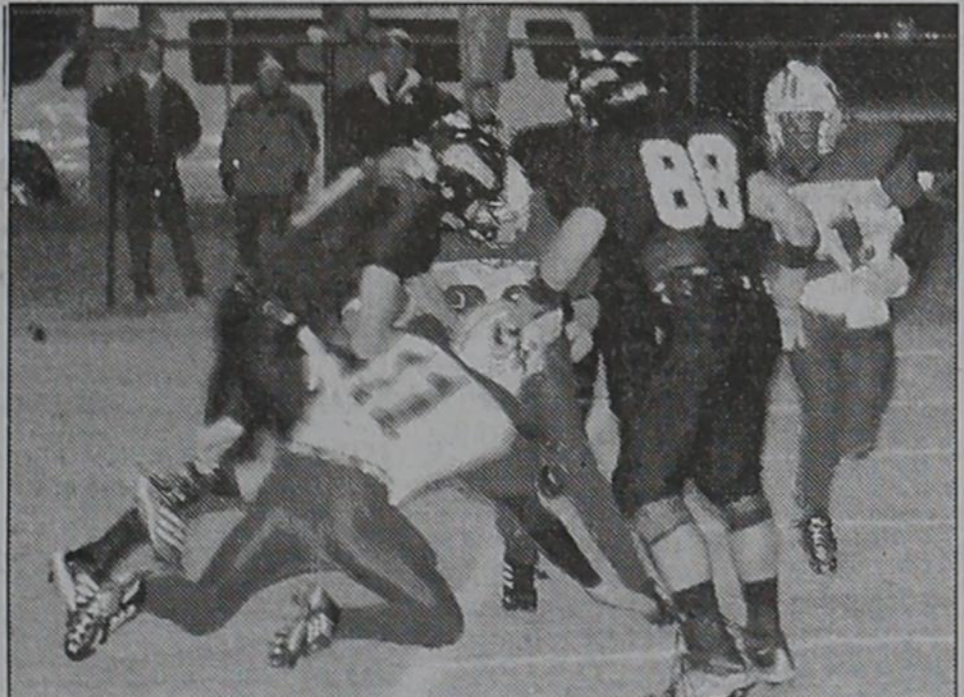

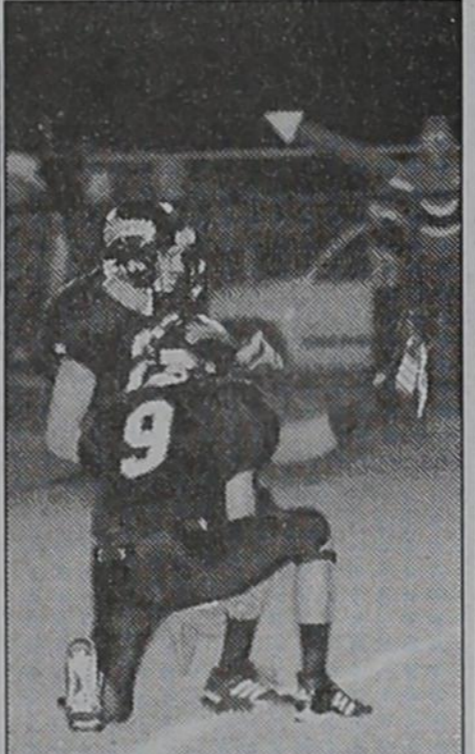

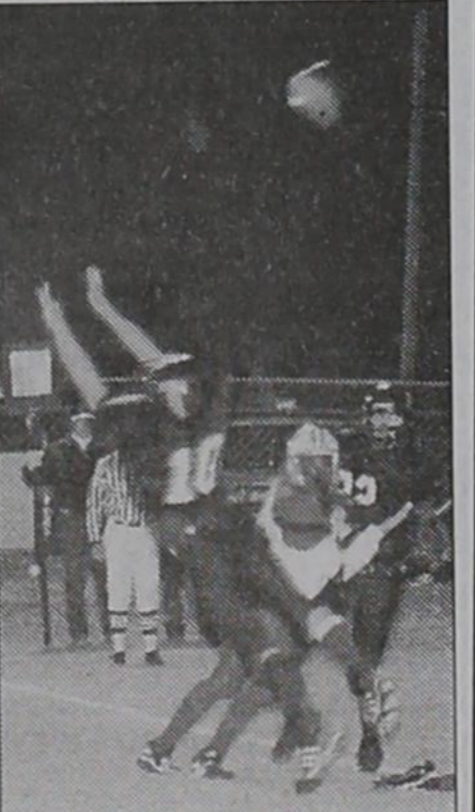

# A Letter From Mary K. Christner

I wanted to share with you my friendship with Toots & Lazelle South. Toots came to work for my grandfather Brainard at our ranch "Johns Creek" in the far north west part of Roberts county. His brother Corbin also worked for granddad. This was before I was born. My mother died in childbirth when I was born in 1936. My uncle (her brother) & his wife adopted me in 1938. So I went to live with them, their son & my 2 brothers at Johns Creek. I fell in love with Toots, he was my hero. Each morning Sally would fix me oatmeal which I still don't like. Toots said "Sis, you could never guess the bowls of oatmeal I threw in the fireplace when Sally left the room! I waited at the end of the lane each night so I could ride on his horse with him to the barn. My 3 brothers went to school, I think it was called Couch Creek School. A little school that sat in Woods King's parents meadow next to the Canadian River. Lazelle was hired to teach, replacing someone who left. It was just my 3 brothers & Lazelle had no place close to live, so she lived with us. Toots said "It was very hard to court Lazelle with 3 young boys around." But court her he did & then they married & continued to work for us on a place on the other side of the Canadian River. I'll never forget Toots or his happy smile. When the spring rains came

there were several creeks to cross to get to the school house. When the creeks were up the boys didn't get to skip school—Lazelle taught them at our big dining table! Lots of memories of those days. My 3 brothers are now dead leaving just me. My hand writing is poor due to nerve damage to my hand. This is from the ambulance wreck that Jon & I had. I am working very hard to try to learn to walk without

## Wheeler Baptists Help With Rebuilding Of Childress Church

(Editor Note: This article was taken from the Saturday, October 25, 2003 Amarillo Globe News.)

**CAREY CHURCH BACK AFTER FIRE**  
The Rev. Randy Wilson looks around the newly rebuilt Carey First Baptist Church and sees the future. Literally.  
Not many churches can boast a

worship and fellowship hall that can double as a basketball court — a draw for youngsters in another type of rebuilding for the church, destroyed in a fire a year ago.  
"The very first thing (the deacon chair) said was, 'If we don't build with youth in mind, we might as well not build at all,'" Wilson said.  
But the statement was academic. There was no question of

rebuilding.  
As Cloyce Holeman, a church deacon, said at the time of the fire, "The devil's trying to put us out of business, but he can't do it. Now we know what we've got to do. We've got to rebuild."  
That doesn't mean it took a little doing.  
The 1949 brick building lay in ruins after a heating vent got too hot and caught on fire.  
The insurance would only pay for about half of the expected \$432,000 reconstruction.  
And even after the plans were drawn up and the ground broken in December, church officials had no idea how they were going to finish the project.  
Then something happened. The planets aligned — what Wilson calls "a God thing."  
First Baptist Church in Wheeler came down and hung sheetrock, First Baptist Church in Van did all the inside painting.  
The Texas Baptist Men did all the interior woodwork, including cabinets for every classroom, Wilson's desk, and a work counter.  
"Every church that called up said, 'This is what we could do, and this is when we'd come,'" Wilson said. "And every date lined up when it needed to be."  
And the money came through as well.  
Wilson said the church received about \$110,000 in donations, helping the church stay out of debt.  
The final cost for reconstruction came in at about \$330,000, almost \$100,000 less than expected, Wilson said.  
"They tell us that even with volunteer help, you'll average \$50 a square foot," he said. "We did ours for just over \$30 a square foot."  
The church held a dedication Sunday for their new 9,000 square-foot building — now metal instead of brick and twice as big. Wilson is thankful his 110 members now have a church home — instead of temporary sanctuary in a city auditorium.  
"They're beside themselves," he said. "Everyone is thrilled to be back."

While visiting with Hernandez, Trooper Henderson, relying on years of experience and training, became suspicious of the defendant's behavior. In addition the Trooper found discrepancies in Hernandez's story. Trooper Henderson asked Hernandez for permission to search his vehicle. Hernandez refused.  
Trooper Henderson then contacted the Wheeler County Sheriff's Office and requested the assistance of Sheriff's Deputy Julian Torrez and his K-9, Carlos. Deputy Torrez and Officer Carlos made a pass of the vehicle at which time Carlos alerted to the presence of a controlled substance at the rear of the Montero Sport SUV belonging to Hernandez. An inspection of the vehicle revealed a hidden compartment, located under the false floor of the vehicle. The compartment held over 66 pounds of cocaine, with a street value of over 3 million dollars. Hernandez was arrested for possession of a controlled substance and booked into the Wheeler County Jail.  
After deliberating less than one hour the jury returned its guilty verdict. During the punishment phase, defense Attorney John Mann of Wheeler attempted to persuade the jury to be lenient with his client. Mann, asking the jury to give the defendant probation, repeatedly referred to his client as a "victim" and "just a mule" that had been deserted by the individuals who had hired him. Defense Attorney Mann compared his client to a rabbit caught in a trap, and asked the jury to have compassion for him as a human being.  
In response, Assistant District Attorney Lynn Switzer reminded the jury of the countless lives such a quantity of cocaine would impact and renounced Mann's plea for leniency for the defendant.  
"By putting the defendant in prison for a long time you are preventing the distribution of this white death, Switzer told the jury. I am asking you to deny the defendant's request for probation and to sentence him to the penitentiary for a term of at least 75 years. Your decision in this case will have national impact, not just locally."  
"I am very pleased with the resolve of the citizen's of Wheeler County to send the appropriate message to individuals who would engage in this type of activity, stated District Attorney Rick Roach. We hired Ms. Switzer (Assistant DA) because of her abilities in the courtroom and she has demonstrated once again what defendants who go to trial will likely face. This message will be heard loud and clear."  
When asked to comment about this week's trial Wheeler County Sheriff Jimmy Adams said, "I think this shows that the people of the Eastern Panhandle speak for the citizens of this Nation that this activity will not be tolerated."  
Hernandez will not be eligible for parole until the year 2018.
