Speaker for the evening will be William Taylor "Spike" Dykes, head coach of the Texas Tech Red Raiders. Dykes is known for his humor and is a well known speaker in demand over the area.

To know Spike is to know the Will Rogers of the world. Forget egos and career ladders. His priorities start and end with people. Everything else is secondary. "Where I come from, if somebody says hello to you going to the post office, you don't just keep

walking, you say 'Hello, how ya doin'?' Dykes says. "To me, that's just natural. That's just being a person."

Spike is just as much at home giving an acceptance speech for his induction into the Texas High School Coaches Association's Hall of Honor (a 1991 inductee) as he is sipping coffee and spinning yarns at some diner off the beaten path. His philosophies of life have proven successful in the football arena, stretching from many different ends of the spectrum. After a dozen different coaching stops, Dykes and wife, Sharon, have packed and unpacked for the last time—at least until next century.

Wanting only what's best for his

players is a big deal to Spike, and that's why academics always is foremost on his mind. "We can never forget why these young men are here," said Dykes, in reference to his players. "We want them to receive the type of education that will make it easier for them to advance in society after they leave."

The highlight of the banquet each year is the presentation of the "Outstanding Individual" awards.

Area Students Participate In Houston Livestock Show

Eleven 4-H members and 27 FFA members from Wheeler County will be joining other 4-H and FFA members from throughout Texas for show ring competition at the upcoming Houston Livestock Show, Feb. 15 through March 1 at the Astrodome in Houston, Texas.

These FFA and 4-H exhibitors compete in one of two divisions of the

Houston Livestock Show the junior show division. The other division, the open show, attracts its exhibitors from the world's agricultural industry, primarily professional breeders and ranchers.

Entries in both the open and junior shows combine with horse show entries to make the Houston Livestock Show the world's largest.

Representing 886 Texas 4-H clubs and FFA chapters, the junior show is expected to exceed 13,000 entries this year. A variety of animals are shown in the junior show division: market steers, market swine, market sheep, market poultry, beef and dairy heifers, breeding sheep, goats, commercial steers and breeding rabbits.

The four market animal categories represent animals raised by the exhibitor as food sources. Top animals in each of these categories are eligible for their individual market auctions. Total money paid in 1991 at the four junior show auctions exceeded \$3 million.

NEW PIPELINE: Customers of Wheeler Gas Co. can expect lower gas prices after the new pipeline under construction north of Wheeler is completed. The line will connect the main line of High Plains Natural Gas with Wheeler and allow High Plains to furnish the additional gas for Wheeler instead of having to buy it. High Plains owns Wheeler Gas and has had to purchase gas from Natural Gas Pipeline's line. The new line will stretch 6 miles from a Wheeler Gas connection 1 1/2 miles north of Wheeler to a point 6 miles west of Wheeler. The 6" line will be at a depth of 36" with digging of the ditch to have begun Wednesday and the pipe to be strung Friday. Charles Moorehead of Canadian, a High Plains representative, states the cost will be approximately \$300,000. The bulldozer is in the process of leveling the 40' path for the ditcher.

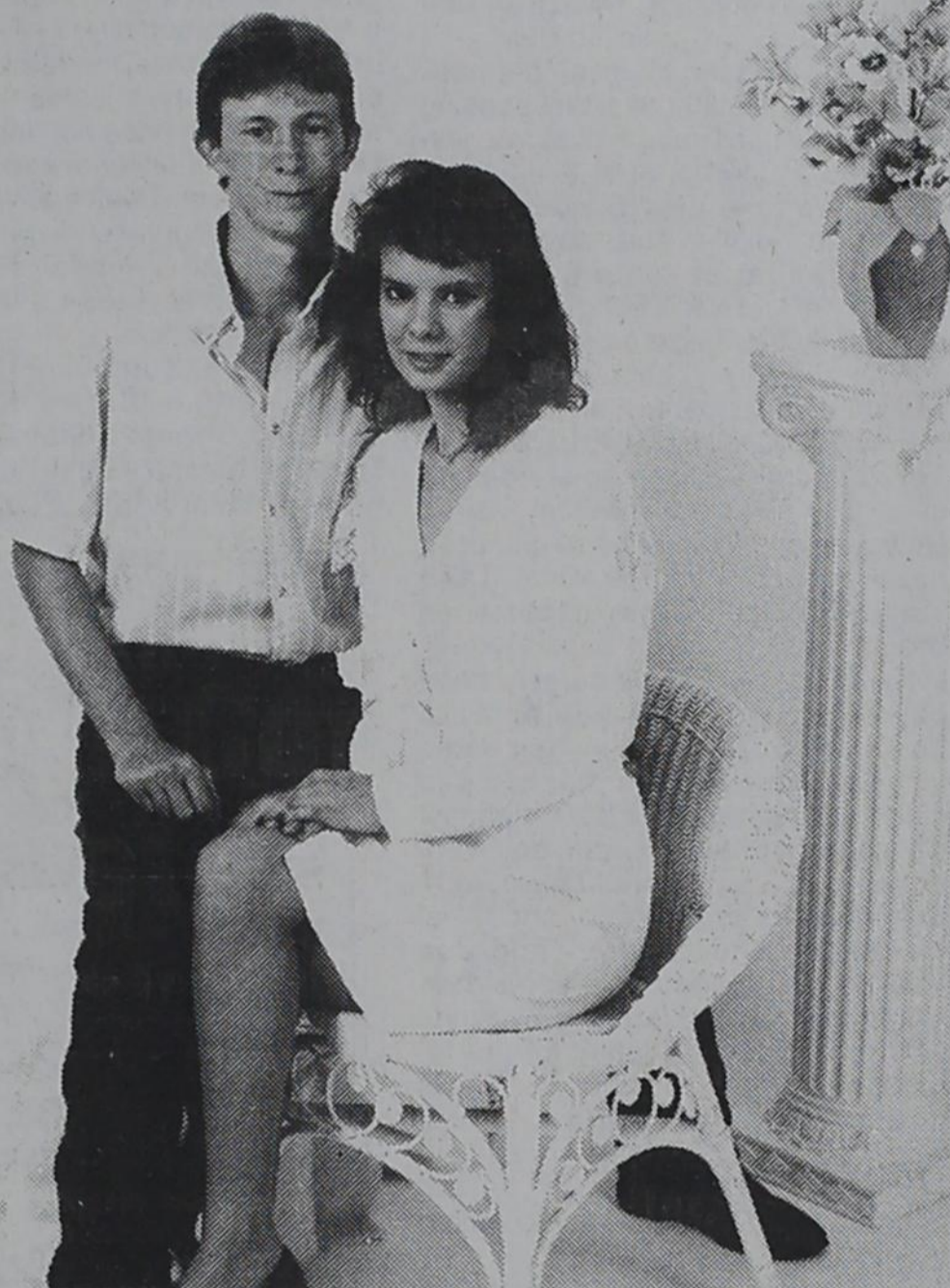
Pre-Wedding Festivities

A special meeting will be held 2/13/92 at 7:00 for the purpose of programming new radios.

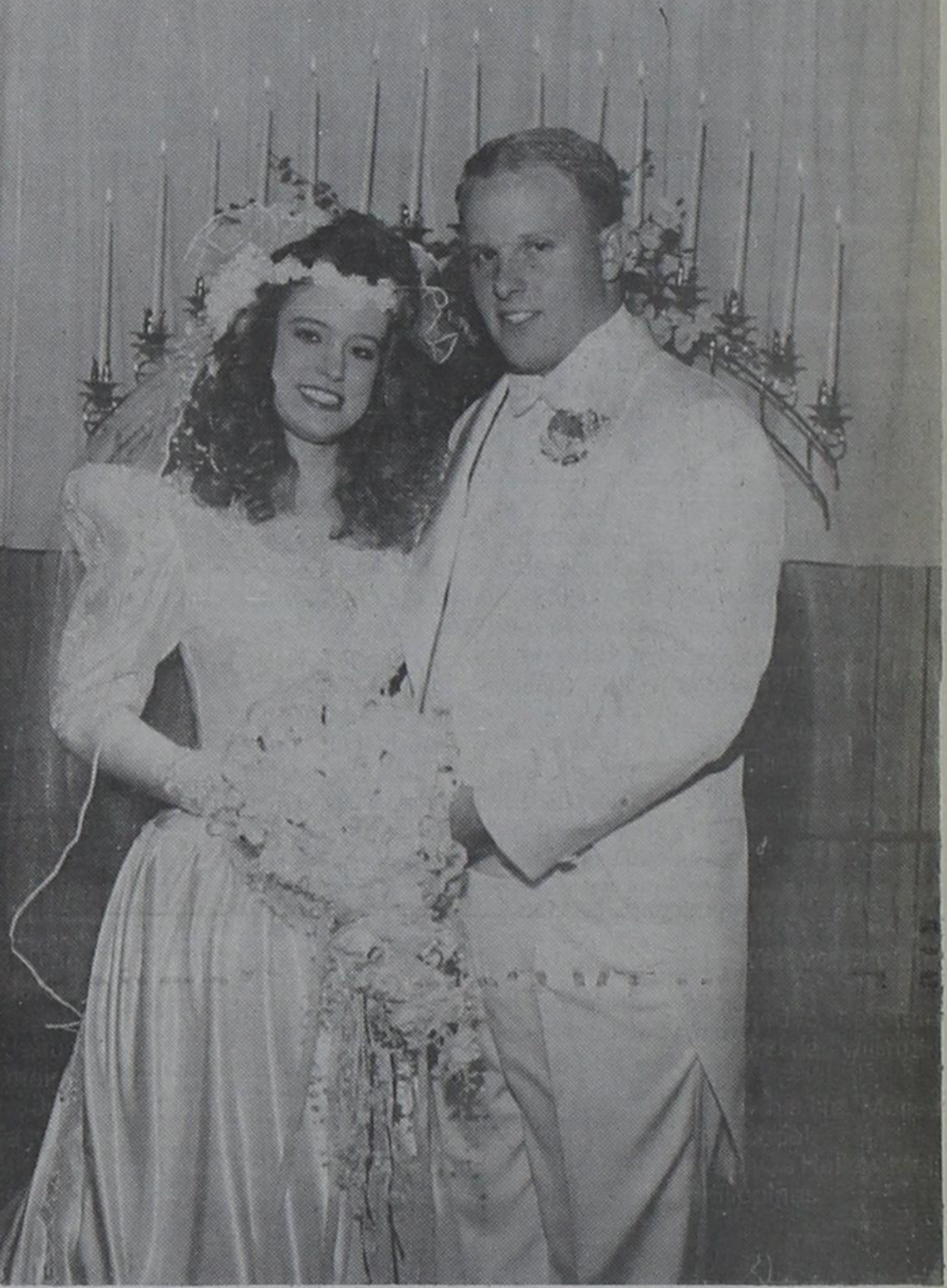
