 cided to come to the United States to further his education. This was a courageous decision, for he is the first member of his family to attend school out of Peru. His father owns farmland on which he raises cotton, which is "harvested entirely by hand, as machinery would be too costly", said Armando.
 The high cost of labor in the United States has brought about a complete reversal of this situation. Two older sons of the Diaz family are engaged in cotton growing along with their father, Armando being the first son to choose a professional career. From Ranger College, he intends to go to Texas University to complete his training and then plans to practice dentistry in his homeland.

A popular student, he is liked and admired by both classmates and faculty. This neat, attractive young man is friendly, courteous, and interested in everything about him.
 Many things in this country must seem strange to him, not the least of which will be cold weather at Christmas time, for in his country December is as warm as our July. He has made no definite plans for spending this first Christmas away from his family, but "It is too far for me to go home", he says.

Ranger College is glad to have Armando as a student and good-will ambassador and hopes he will encourage his fellow Peruvians to come here in the future.

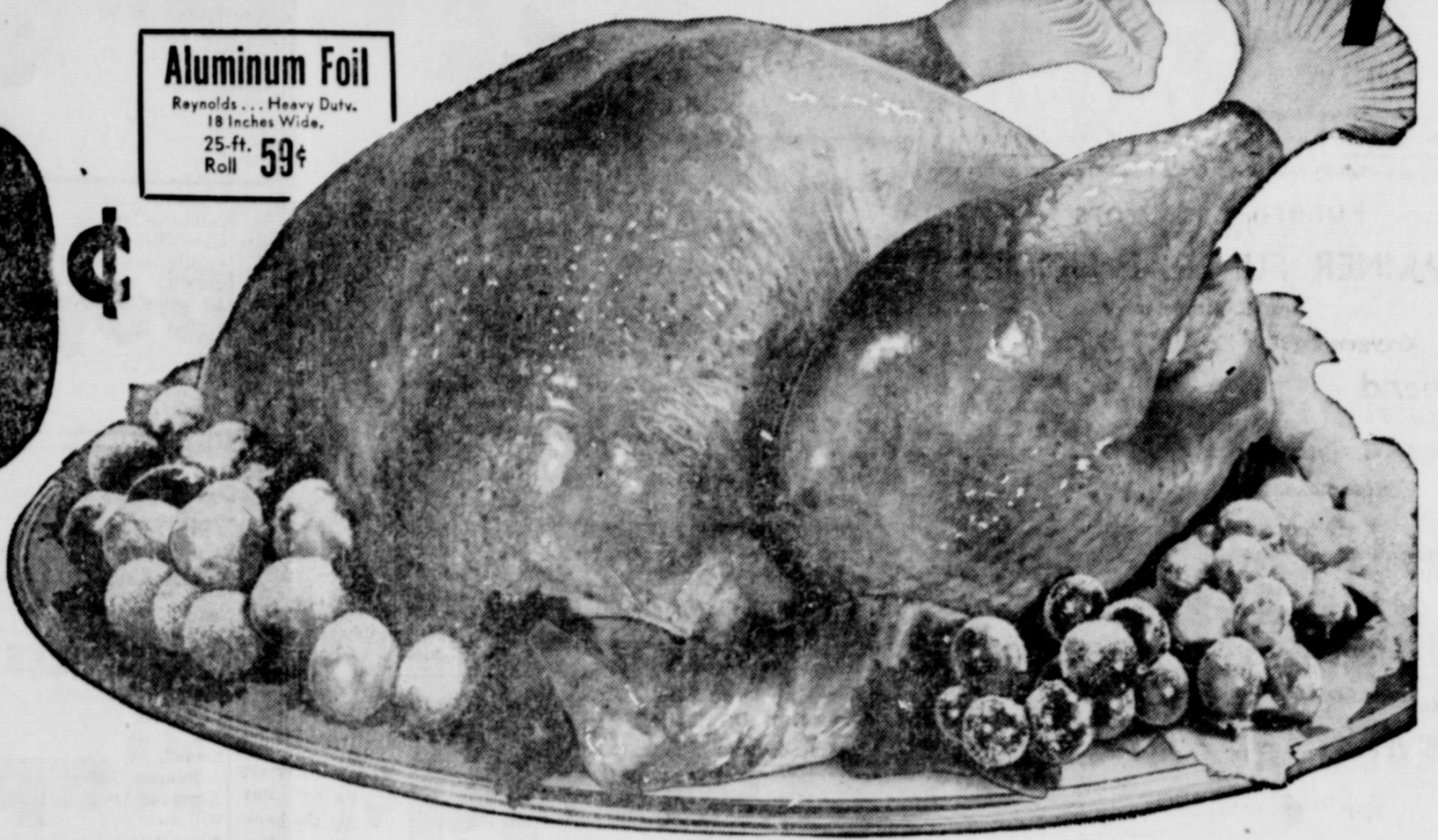
