What the Mayor meant by that remark was that the franchise battle came to an end Armistice Day when Victor Cornelius published a statement to the effect that since he was unable to get the names of 500 persons on a petition calling for a vote of the people on the franchise issue...

Mayor Frost told Sayre that the company's ability to get 909 names on their petition showed "... a rare and high tribute paid to the company by citizens of Eastland."

With the TESCO matter out of the way and most of the crowd gone, commissioners finished their regular monthly meeting in their usual fashion.

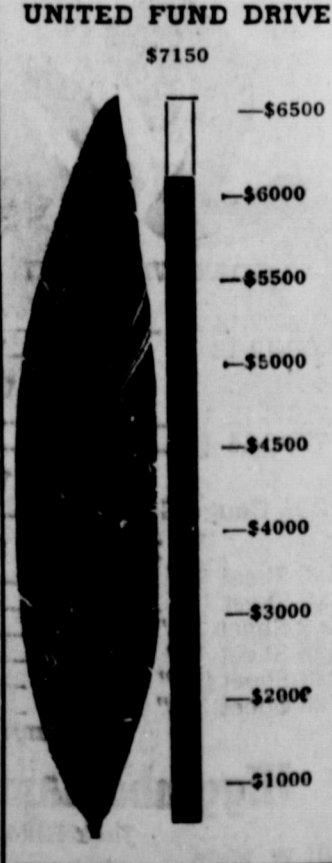

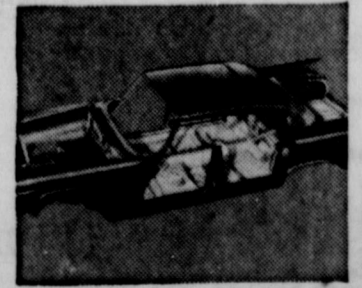
