Hopes For F-M Road Improved

Eastland County Commissioners Monday unanimously voted to take over the new Leon Lake road as a county road.

Representatives of both the Eastland and Ranger Chamber of Commerce and members of the East-land County Water Supply District appeared before the Commissioners Court asking commissioners to as-sume control of the road. Commissioners, after an hour long de bate, agreed to do so.

A spokesman said that since the county had agreed to take over the road, chances for making the road a Farm-Market road have been greatly improved. If the road is placed under the F-M program, it will be paved, giving a paved road all the way around the lake.

The group requested that the commissioners make a formal application to the State Highway Commission asking that the road be developed into a Farm-Market

If undecided as to breed, a visit to a dog show, where a variety of breeds are on exhibit, should prove helpful. If no dog show is being held in the vicinity, visits to local kennels of different breeds will help make up your print.

Don't get a puppy too young—not under ten or twelve weeks. The younger the puppy, the more care it requires.

If you are not sure the puppy is healthy, insist on a veterinary statement before purchase.


If you want to be sure the pup is purebred, request a registration certificate, which should also show a transfer to you as the new owner.

Before taking the pup home, be sure to select a spot in the house he will be able to call his own. Place his bed there—an ordinary box filled with shredded paper will do—and put near it a toy or rubber ball or bone to help him cut his teeth on and divert his attention from mischievous deeds.
