Deposits Hit \$18 Million At ENB

Deposits at Eastland National Bank have topped the \$18 million figure, as all factors are up, in the first quarter report just released.

Signalling the ever-upward growth of the Eastland economy deposits are reported at \$18,537,058.07. Three months ago they were listed at \$17,824,420.25.

Loans are also up substantially, reported at \$6,663,585.86 at the end of March, up from \$6,250,652.63 three months ago at year's end.

Total assets at Eastland National Bank are shown at \$19,954,143.79, up from \$19,207,638.28 at the end of December.

Just ten years ago, the first quarter report for 1965 showed \$2,409,254.65 on loan; \$5,019,713.27 on deposit; and \$5,470,439.13 total assets.

Run-Off To Be April 23

In typical Eastland Democratic fashion, the voters of Eastland will decide the results of the tie vote in the recent city commission election.

The Eastland City Commission in an emergency meeting Thursday, April 3, canvassed and accepted the election returns for the Tuesday, April 1, City Commission election.

In that Tuesday election incumbent Dale Bakker was re-elected and new member Mike Siebert was elected. In one of the coincidences of the century, incumbents W.Q. Verner and H.V. O'Brien both received 266 votes. Three places were to be filled.

The City Charter calls for a "casting of lots" in cases of tie or to hold a run-off election.

Both Verner and O'Brien declined to have the matter settled with the flip of a coin and were reluctant to submit the city to the expense and bother of a run-off election.

Both Verner and O'Brien offered a withdraw in favor of the other, and O'Brien had announced his intention to do so.

However in the special meeting when the majority of the Commission held that a run-off election would be the fair manner of deciding the issue, both Verner and O'Brien agreed to abide by that wish and cooperate in the run-off.

In compliance with the Texas Election Laws, Chairman W.Q. Verner then declared void the portion of the election where the tie existed, and ordered that a special election be called for Wednesday, April 23, as specified by the law.

The election will be only for the one office between Verner and O'Brien and the election laws forbids any write-ins to be considered in such a run-off.

The Commission unanimously agreed that a special election be called as provided.

U.S. SENATOR LLOYD BENTSEN, DEMOCRAT, TEXAS. CANDIDATE, PRESIDENT, 1976

Lloyd Bentsen was born February 11, 1921, in Mission, attended the University of Texas and the University of Texas School of Law, receiving an LL.B. degree in 1942.

With W.W. II underway, Bentsen enlisted in the U.S. Army on receiving his law degree. He served in the Army Air Corps as a commander of a B-24 squadron, flew 50 missions over Europe and rose to the rank of major. He was promoted to colonel in the Air Force Reserve before completing his military service. Bentsen holds the Distinguished Flying Cross and the Air Medal with three oak leaf clusters.

After the war, Bentsen returned to the Rio Grande Valley of Texas to be elected County Judge of Hidalgo County at age 25, the youngest County Judge in Texas. Following a successful race for the U.S. House of Representatives in 1948, he became the youngest member of the Congress at 27.

After three successive terms of office Congressman Bentsen declined to seek re-election in 1954 and the following year he moved to Houston to enter business.

By 1970, when he decided to seek election as U.S. Senator from Texas, he had become President of Lincoln Consolidated, a financial holding institution, and was serving as a Director for a number of major corporations.

Bentsen resigned all management positions and directorships on election to the Senate. Shortly after his arrival in Washington he voluntarily released a financial statement listing all of his assets and liabilities. In 1973, Senator Bentsen placed all of his assets in a blind trust administered by the Texas National Bank of Commerce in Houston.

Senator Bentsen is assigned to two of the Senate's major Standing Committees - Finance and Public Works - and to the Joint Economic Committee. He serves as Chairman of the Public Works Transportation Subcommittee, the Joint Economic Subcommittee on Economic Growth and the Finance Subcommittee on Financial Markets.

Bentsen has served on the governing boards of: The Society for the Performing Arts, in Houston; the United Fund of Houston and Harris County; the Houston Chamber of Commerce; the Board of Trustees of the Texas Presbyterian Foundation; the University of Texas Development Board; the UMCA; Salvation Army; the Boy Scouts; and numerous other civic organizations.

Mrs. Bentsen, known informally as B.A., is the former Beryl Ann Longino of Lufkin, Texas. The couple has three children: Lloyd M., III, Lan Chase and Tina Ann (Mrs. Eric Maedgen).

The Monticello choo-choo.
A little train that's helping fight the rising cost of electricity.

You're looking at what may be the shortest railroad in Texas.

The Monticello choo-choo runs only 12 miles from start to finish, but it's doing a big job hauling lignite coal to Texas Electric's Monticello power plant near Mount Pleasant.

Cable And Channel IF --

"The FCC And What You See"

The purpose of this article is to inform the people in the communities we serve about the latest rules and regulations concerning TV cable. I realize that there are far more exciting subjects than CATV, but when laws and rules are made on something that is brought into your living room, you at least need to be aware of it.

The Federal Communications Commission is, by definition, a regulatory body. Its purpose is to regulate certain areas of communication, and in the past has done a fine job. The primary purpose of this body of men has been to regulate various technical aspects of the communications field such as issuing frequencies for radio and television stations in an attempt to prevent interfering signals in any given area.

But, as is true of most governmental bodies today, the FCC, in my opinion, has overstepped their boundaries.

For example, the FCC has recently created a sports blackout rule which states that if any town is within 75 miles of the "home town" of a professional team and that team is playing at home, then no cable system within the afore mentioned 75 mile radius can import a distant sporting event of the same nature. You may not think that this will affect us and it probably won't immediately. However, suppose that Abilene gets a minor league baseball team. Then on the days they played in Abilene we, as a cable operator, would have to black out the Houston Astros on channel 11 and - or the Texas Rangers on another station. Remember, I'm not talking about the same time, same hour, I'm talking about the same day, regardless of when the games were played.

And while this rule may not affect us a great deal it will have a tremendous impact on thousands of towns across the United States and will in fact cripple the cable industry to some extent.

Certainly a letter from interested parties to the FCC would help give this august body the public reaction to their action.

For the third straight year the fruit has been frozen in Eastland County. According to the records the fruit is usually killed by a freeze every eight years. Now we are beginning to wonder if we will even make another fruit crop.

There may be some on some trees still undamaged. We will have to wait a week or two to find out for sure.

If you are fortunate enough to have some fruit that got by the freeze, you should apply the insecticide and fungicide again.

Mix six tablespoons of 50 percent Malathion in three gallons of water. You may also add seven tablespoons of wettable Sulfur in the same solution for disease control. In place of sulfur you may use three and three fourths teaspoons of Benlate or three tablespoons of Captan. Repeat this twice more at 10 and 14 day intervals.

There are a lot of vegetables being planted again. The freeze also killed many early gardens.

A major problem causing poor stands is a disease complex known as damping off. Damping off involves several soil-borne fungi, which attack both seeds and young seedlings. Symptoms of damping off include rapid death of young plants, seed decay in the soil, and dead seedlings before they emerge from the soil.

Close examination of damaged plants will reveal a water-soaked zone at the soil line. Other plants may be damaged less but will break over with the first wind.

Damping off is most severe in cold, wet soils. So gardeners should not plant until the soil temperature is right for the crop. Seed packets contain information on when to plant.

Planting on a raised bed will help overcome damping off due to wet soils. Raised beds will provide for better drainage and encourage early drying of the upper soil layer. Beds should be three or four inches high.

Applying the fungicide Captan can help stem damping off if it is discovered in time. Captan should be used at the rate of two to five ounces per 1,000 square feet prior to planting and incorporated to a depth of three to four inches.

Allowing the soil to warm up in the spring and then planting on raised beds are the best means to avoid problems from damping off. If the problem persists, a fungicide must be applied.

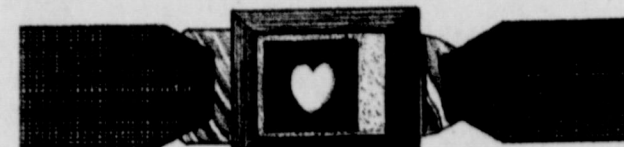

Do You Remember

BY HERMAN DEMPSEY

The school buildings in those days were generally built to provide two rooms. There would be two teachers. One for each room. The students were assigned to rooms as their age and grade directed. The number of children in the community was generally equally distributed between the two rooms. The community schools provided education through grammar school. High school training had to be obtained by going to the nearest town. If a boy or girl wanted to go to high school, the parents provided a bicycle or they could ride their horse to school the four, five or six miles distance.

There were no lunch rooms for the students during these times. The children had to carry their lunch in their lunch pails. These pails were a one gallon lard can with their name written on it. The lunch was made up of soda biscuits left over from breakfast with homemade sausage, ham or bacon. Homemade cookies, cake or candy made up

the sweets for the lunches. Fruit from the cellar storage was included in the lunch as long as the fruit was good. Water to drink was drawn from the well in the school yard. It was placed in an open enameled bucket in each room. An enameled dipper was placed in each bucket. At any time a student wanted a drink of water, he went to the water bucket, dipped the dipper into the water, drank the water he wanted, and returned the dipper to the bucket. Each student used the same dipper. There were no drinking fountains for providing water for the kids then. The toilet facilities were of the outside type in a small building marked "boys" or "girls".

The teachers roomed and boarded during the school term in a home in the community. They carried their lunches the same as the student. The school building was heated by a wood burning stove in each room.
