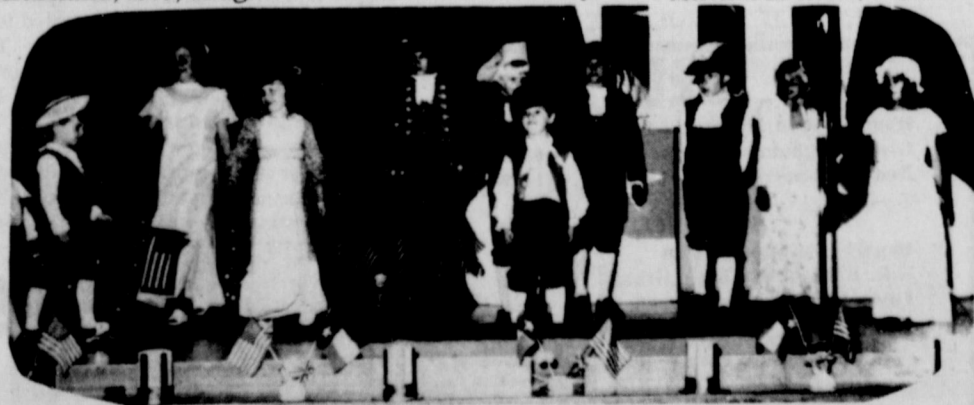

Fate Of Local T&P Freight Service Now Rests Hands Of Texas Railroad Commission

The fate of local T&P Freight service in Eastland now rests in the hands of the Texas Railroad Commission.

And a decision should be forthcoming sometimes within the next 180 days.

Eastland Countians presented their case for local service before a Commission Examiner Wednesday morning. It was the third time in seven years that T&P Railway Co. has asked to terminate the Eastland freight station and demolish the depot here. They've been denied permission by the Commission in two previous hearings.

T&P did bring out that they'd lost some money in 1975 but primarily their request was based on what they called

streamlining and modernization.

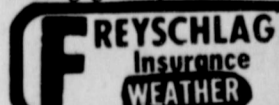

GORDON SPOT

Hand hoeing is still the most effective way to weed a small garden. It is inexpensive, accurate and even enjoyable and rewarding for some. Begin hoeing when weeds appear and keep it up throughout the growing season. Weeds that are close to the base of plants should be pulled by hand.

If you can't stand the strain of hoeing, mulches and herbicides (chemical weed killers) can be used to keep weeds out of the garden. Mulches, which prevent weeds from emerging by blocking out the sun, work best against weeds that come up each year from seed.

Compost, straw, leaves, hay, sawdust, wood shavings and bark all make good mulch materials. Plastic sheeting, newspaper and black polyethylene film can also be used for mulching. However, clear plastic is not an effective mulch because it lets in sunlight.

Before applying any mulch, moisten the soil. If you plan to use plastic sheeting, apply most of the fertilizer that plants will need beforehand. Apply organic mulches only when the soil temperature has warmed up. Otherwise, the soil will stay cool longer, thus slowing plant growth.

It might be necessary to add nitrogen to organic mulches because micro-organisms in the mulch use this element in the decaying process.

As far as herbicides are concerned, these are difficult to use in a small garden with many different kinds of vegetables. A herbicide that is safe for one kind of vegetable may not be safe to use on another.

Aphids are odd looking little insects with two tube-like structures on the end of their back that resemble exhaust pipes. They come in almost all colors - red, yellow, green, black, purple, and can play havoc with a vegetable garden.

Aphids, often called plant lice, vary in length from one-sixteenth to 1/4 of an inch and may have wings. They damage plants by sucking juice from leaves, stems and fruit and can also transmit diseases to

plants. Aphids will attack plants of any size and at any stage of growth - from seedlings to mature plants at harvest.

Since aphids numbers can increase rapidly, garden crops should be checked at frequent intervals.

Plants infested with aphids may look wilted, and the ends of leaves may curl up and look yellowish. Heavy infestations of aphids can cause severe plant losses.

Diazinon, dimethoate, endosulfan, malathion and naled are all effective insecticides to treat for aphids.

Before applying any insecticide, make sure it is safe to use on the crops in your garden and follow directions to the letter.

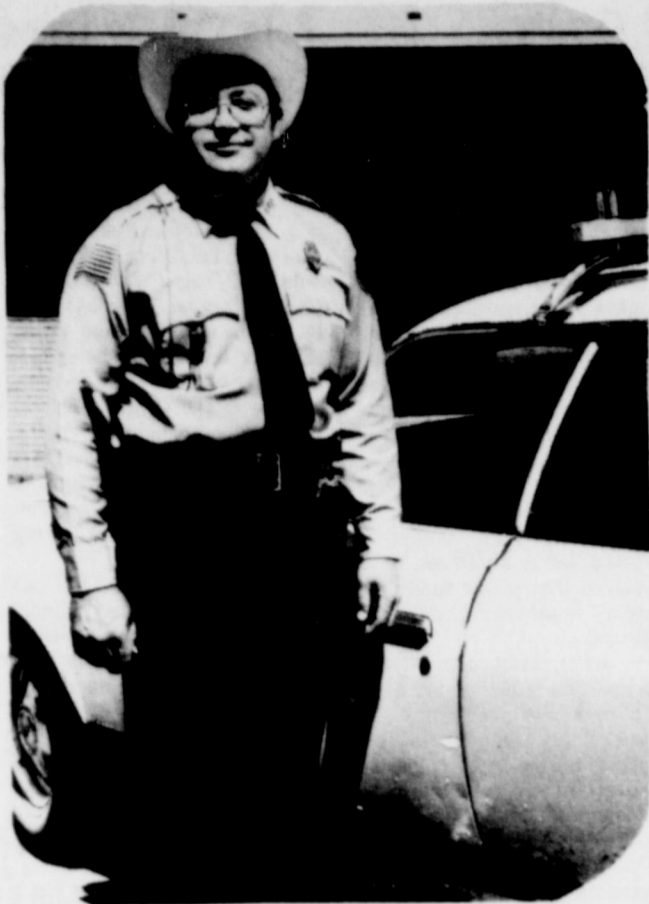
