There are five groups scheduled on the program and it promises to be a very dedicated, soul-winning experience for those in attendance.

## Cisco Junior College To Offer New Program

Cisco Junior College will offer a new extension program at Clyde beginning with the coming fall semester, according to an announcement by Dr. Leland Willis, President of CJC. The courses will be taught at Clyde High School in cooperation with the Clyde Independent School District and the Clyde Chamber of Commerce, Dr. Willis said.

The initial program at Clyde will include five courses: They will be: English 113 (English Composition & Rhetoric); English 213 (Readings in English Literature); Math 113 (College Algebra); History 113 (History of the U.S. to Reconstruction); and Government 213 (American National Government). Willis said that any other courses would be offered if a sufficient demand is indicated.

Registration for the courses to be offered at Clyde will be held on Monday, August 27th between 6:00 and 9:00 p.m. at the Clyde High School auditorium. Dr. Willis stated that the same low tuition rates will prevail at Clyde as are maintained at the college's main campus in Cisco as well as its other extension locations. Tuition and fees for one course will be \$46.75; for two, \$7.50; for three courses \$89.25; and for four, \$109.00.

Class schedules may be obtained at the Clyde Chamber of Commerce office or at Cisco Junior College, Dr. Willis said. He said that up to 12 hours can be taken with classes meeting one evening per week, and that all courses are those which are required on any degree program. They will be transferable to any senior college since CJC is a member of the Southern Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools, Dr. Willis concluded.

Officials of the Clyde Chamber of Commerce and Clyde Independent School District have urged all interested persons in the Clyde-Baird area to contact them or Cisco Junior College for any additional information.

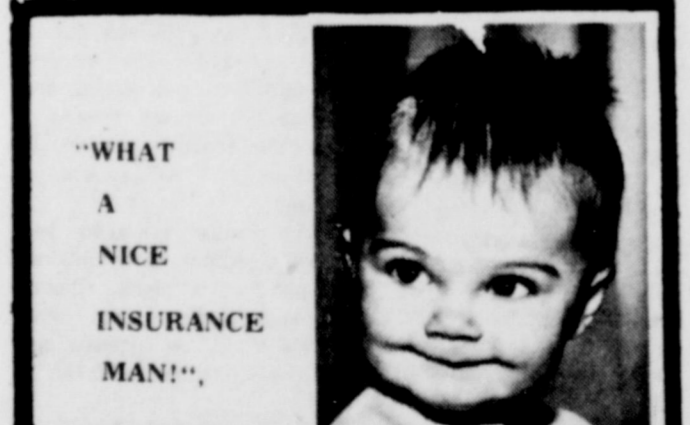

# You Must Register

Colonel Melvin N. Glantz, the State Director of Selective Service for Texas, reminded young men that they still must register with Selective Service even though there is no draft. Glantz urged those men who

have not registered to do so promptly, saying: "Failure to register is a violation of Federal Law and could result in prosecution by the Department of Justice." The President's authority to

induct men into the Armed Forces expired on July 1, 1973. The Nixon Administration does not plan to seek an extension of this authority, and the Defense Department is relying on volunteer enlistments to supply military manpower. Glantz emphasized that only the authority to induct expired. All other provisions of the Military Selective Service Act

remain in force. The annual lottery will be held, young men will continue to register, and their local boards will continue to classify them as to their availability for possible military service should Congress authorize the resumption of inductions in the event of a national emergency. The State Director said the law requires all male persons,

except certain nonimmigrant aliens, to register with Selective Service within 30 days before or after their 18th birthday. He said: "Young men have three legal obligations: (1) they must register at age 18, (2) they must notify their local draft board when they change address, and (3) they must carry their draft cards with them until their liability for

service expires, for most men this is age 26." The Colonel explained that Selective Service is undergoing a major reorganization and that as Selective Service goes into a standby operation, no inductions are taking place. Many local board offices are being relocated, with the result of fewer draft board offices in Texas. Glantz said there are

# Gordon Spot

Cattle producers in Eastland County are urged to attend a meeting in Brownwood on August 20th regarding upcoming new regulations on brucellosis testing.

The meeting will be in the ASCS office at 510 East Lee Street at 8 p.m.

A veterinarian with the Texas Animal Health Commission will be on hand to inform producers of pending changes in the present brucellosis regulations. Comments and feedback are being invited from producers and a statewide hearing on the new regulations will be held in Austin on September 18.

The new brucellosis testing program is expected to begin October 1 and is designed to eliminate the cattle disease from Texas, thus allowing the state to be declared Certified Brucellosis Free.

testing must be done to determine if the anaplasmosis parasite is present.

Herd owners should contact their veterinarians for testing and treatment recommendations. Measures such as vaccination or low-level feeding of antibiotics may be used to prevent the disease - depending on the recommended practices in a particular area.

Man, through carelessness during such operations as dehorning, castrating and vaccinating, also spreads the disease. Ticks are a possible source of infection as well but the disease is not spread through contact or wastes of sick or carrier animals. Humans are not infected by the disease.

Anaplasmosis is responsible for 50,000 to 100,000 cattle deaths a year in the U.S. Death losses may average 10 percent and can reach as high as 50 percent in affected herds where the disease is left uncontrolled.

For all cattle producers to benefit from the new testing program, it is important that they become familiar with the new regulations. Thus the upcoming meeting on August 20th will provide an opportunity for producers to learn about the new plans for brucellosis testing.

Texas cattle owners should also be alert for cases of anaplasmosis in their herds due to the increasing numbers of mosquitoes and horseflies which spread the disease.

Anaplasmosis is an infectious blood disease of cattle and deer. It is caused by a one-celled parasite which attacks and destroys red blood cells, causing anemia and some times death.

Cattle affected by anaplasmosis frequently stand alone, away from the rest of the herd. Early symptoms of the disease include lack of appetite, weight loss, and lowered milk production. Advanced symptoms include anemia, yellow skin and mucus membranes, difficult breathing and constipation.

If the disease is detected before the onset of advanced symptoms, animals can be effectively treated.

Since the disease symptoms are similar to those of other cattle ailments, laboratory

## As It Looks From Here

WASHINGTON, D.C. - A LAW WHICH IS UNWORKABLE and not generally acceptable to people is mostly unenforceable.

ALTHOUGH THE CEILING ON BEEF AT THE RETAIL LEVEL is not a law passed by the Congress, it is a regulation imposed by the Cost of Living Council. The Administration which the Cost of Living Council represents, is empowered under the law to impose price controls.

THE AFFLUENT SOCIETY IN WHICH WE LIVE is going to buy beef somewhere or somehow. Beef consumption in the last few years has increased from 155 pounds to 234 pounds per capita in the United States. With population increases and with individual incomes up, consumption has soared. This does not mean, of course, that everyone can afford it and is going to pay any price demanded, but it is the average and the average has to be depended upon.

SOME MEAT WHOLESALERS ARE CALLING THE MEAT SALES in some places as coming from the "black market". Others prefer to say it is only, as yet, a "gray" market but predict that transactions in this area will become more numerous. Other ways are being found in the trade to compensate for what they can sell a steak for and what it would bring without a ceiling price by simply letting the steak carry a tale that somehow appears on the scales.

BY WHATEVER NAME, REPORTS OF ILLEGAL BEEF SALES and purchasers are numerous and are

predicted to increase as cattle slaughterers and meat supplies shrink under the Administration's continuing beef price freeze.

ONE GIMMICK BEING WORKED IS THE PRACTICE of buying cattle in the United States, shipping them to Canada for processing, then selling dressed carcasses in the United States as "imported" meat which is uncontrolled by Phase IV ceilings. The legality of such transactions is under discussion at the moment. The chief legal advisor of the Cost of Living Council is reported to consider the finished beef brought back from Canada as illegal and not "imported" if it originates in the United States livestock markets.

THERE ARE OTHER "GRAY" MARKET TRANSACTIONS, some of which appear to be legal, others questionable and some apparently illegal. When no objection is raised by either the purchaser or the seller, it is pretty difficult to get at enforcement. It becomes sort of a "hear no evil and see no evil" approach. If the purchaser of a steak wants it enough and has the money, he is not likely to pester the retailer to bring the price down. Like some other unpopular laws, most everyone involved quietly avoids discussing the legality of the transaction and, in instances, does not really want to know.

OTHER METHODS OF AVOIDANCE ARE REPORTED, such as ordering 1,000 pounds of choice beef cuts at ceiling prices but being billed for additional poundage to make up for costs not allowed by the ceiling.

THE PRACTICALITIES OF

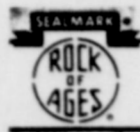
THE SITUATION must cope with ways to circumvent the price ceiling. Meat wholesalers are telling the Cost of Living Council numerous ways to get around their regulations. One, for instance, says that he can order choice, well trimmed brisket at a certain price. He will be told that they are out of it but that they have some

"special brisket" available at 20c over the ceiling price for well trimmed meat. So, the purchaser gets the brisket but it is the same well trimmed quality available before.

THE SERIOUS PART OF THE WHOLE BUSINESS is that cattle will be held off the market, beef processors will curtail plant operations to wait

to see what happens. Shortages follow and the scarcity runs up prices. Controls cannot go on forever but when they are lifted a short supply will run prices still higher.

THIS COLUMN WILL BE SUSPENDED UNTIL SEPTEMBER when Congress reconvenes after recess.

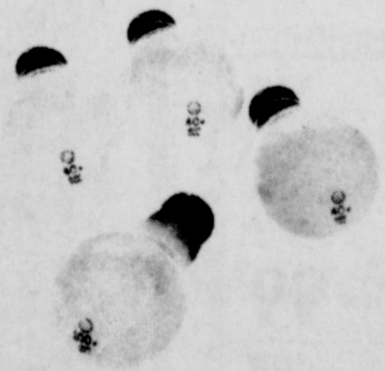

**A lighting specialist tells what to look for when you're buying light bulbs.**



Here are some suggestions that may help you in the wise selection of light bulbs for your home.

- All general service incandescent bulbs now have three ratings on their packaging. (A) Lumens tell you about the light output or performance of the bulb. (B) Watts tell you how much electricity is needed to produce that light. (C) Bulb life is stated as an average, and is an indication of the hours of use you may expect before the bulb burns out.
  - When the amount of light is more important than bulb life — for reading, studying or working — choose a standard bulb that provides the most lumens for its wattage.
