**WIND AND SMOKE** - High winds and grass fires north and west of Eastland Tuesday plagued the sky and kept firemen jumping. Shown here between the pumping rig and a storage tank (about 50 feet back) is the burning remains of a shed building, one of two destroyed by the Petco compressor plant west of town. Volunteers and regular firemen did a job in containing the fires under very adverse conditions. In another fire, a barn loaded with hay and implements was completely destroyed by the blaze which began at 11:45 a.m. and which was not brought under control until 2:30 p.m. The barn, located on FM 101 five miles northeast of Eastland, was owned by Norman Richardson of Ranger. Richardson said he estimated his loss at approximately \$15,000. Destroyed was a tractor, auger truck, the barn and about 8,000 bales of hay. One unit from Eastland and two from Ranger answered the alarm.

A fire, located four miles west of Eastland and south of U.S. 80, endangered the Petco Company's gas compressor plant for 45 minutes as strong winds fanned a grass fire in the direction of the plant. Two storage sheds near the plant were destroyed, along with about five acres of grassland.

## Leading In United Fund

Eastland continues to get state-wide publicity in nice ways!

Throughout the state, the Texas United Community Services publication, the United Campaign Reporter, is

## Eastland Has Additional Mail Until Dec. 31

An additional out-bound mail dispatch for Eastland is in effect until Dec. 31, reports Postmaster Marcus O'Dell, who urges mail patrons to take advantage of the added service by having mail at the post office before 4 p.m.

The extra 4 p.m. dispatch goes directly to Fort Worth, and greatly facilitates earlier delivery, he said. Other dispatches are at 5:20, 6:15 and 11 p.m. Since these dispatches go either to Stephenville and - or Fort Worth for sorting, the postmaster reminds again that the destination "City" in addresses will not work, and will cause delays and possible losses of mail.

Best advice, he says, on all mail, is to put the town name, even and especially "Eastland" so that the mail eventually will go to the right address.

**Firearms Training Meeting Dec. 13**

All boys and young men over 12 years old are invited to attend an organizational meeting Wednesday, Dec. 13, at 7 p.m. at the Eastland National Bank Conference Room, in preparation for a firearms training course, it has been announced here.

Sponsors of the program are the National Rifle Association, the Eastland Veterans of Foreign Wars Post, and the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department.

Game Warden Kenneth Payne and Richard Johnson will be in charge of the training program.

**WHY A PROGRAM?**  
- To encourage safe gun handling and reduce hunting accidents.

- To teach hunter safety in the field and hunter responsibility.

- To inform young hunters of basic game needs and basic game laws.

- To promote good sportsmanship and a better relationship between hunters, landowners and the Department.

**THE PROGRAM**  
The Parks and Wildlife Commission, in regular session September 29, 1970, instructed the Executive Director of the Parks and Wildlife Department to develop a hunter safety training program and to present the program plan for Commission consideration at the earliest practical date.

The proposed program, a cooperative venture with the National Rifle Association, was accepted by the Commission on June 4, 1971, and the Texas Voluntary Hunter Safety Training Program has been initiated. The program is designed primarily for the

young hunter, however, all interested persons are invited to participate.

Volunteer instructors are being examined and certified to provide accurate instruction in the safe handling of firearms in accordance with standards established by the National Rifle Association.

Hunters, upon successful completion of the course of instruction, will be issued certificates of competency from the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department and the National Rifle Association. Permanent records of graduates and instructors will be maintained.

**Heat Spoils**

AUSTIN -- It's no wonder that so many people claim not to like venison, according to Texas Parks and Wildlife Department officials. They wouldn't like steak either if it was handled as badly as some venison.

"We still see hunters hauling their kill home on the hood of their car. This may be classical, but the heat from the engine spoils the meat," said one official.

According to experienced meat handlers, heat is the enemy of meat. It is so important to dissipate heat, even body heat, that a deer should be field dressed as soon as the hunter is able to recover and tag it.

The Texas Parks and Wildlife Department has a leaflet entitled, "Now That You've Killed It", which tells how to field dress a deer. It is free upon request.

Field dressing a deer entails removing the internal organs and draining as much blood as possible from the animal. Care should be taken not to puncture the organs since this will taint the meat.

The skin of the deer should be removed as soon as possible since this holds in body heat. The deer should be hung head up for about twenty minutes immediately after field dressing to allow the blood to drain.

However, when allowing the carcass to cool, the deer should be hung head down since blood collecting in the hams spoils the meat. The carcass should always be hung in the shade and covered with a sheet or cheesecloth after it is skinned.

If the weather is cool, the carcass can be covered and transported for short distances on the trunk or roof of the car. In warm weather, it is best to cut up the carcass and ice it down.

## Forts Trail Holds Meet

The Texas Forts Trail Association will meet Thursday, Dec. 7, 1972, at the Abilene Civic Center beginning at 9 a.m. The Texas Travel Trails Committee, which originally set up the 10 travel trails for Texas, will meet with the association to explain the roles of the various agencies involved in the committee and how the committee can aid the Texas Forts Trail Association.

Heading the Texas Travel Trails Committee is Frank Hildebrand, director of the Texas Tourist Development Agency. Hildebrand and the committee will present their program Thursday morning. At lunch the Texas Trails Chuck Wagon of Albany will serve a barbecue buffet (Dutch \$2.25). During lunch Professor Thurman Morrison and a musical ensemble from Hardin-Simmons University will present a program of music from the era of the forts along the Texas Forts Trail.

Joe Stark of Jacksboro, president of the Texas Forts Trail Association, will conduct a business meeting of the association immediately following lunch. Business will include establishing a promotional budget, consideration of association programs, and membership development. Other officers of the association are Merle Joyce of Albany, vice president; and Neil Fry of Abilene, secretary-treasurer.

Following the business session, bus transportation will be available to take participants in the meeting to Fort Phantom Hill, north of Abilene, which Jim Alexander, landowner, opened to the public in June.

Dr. Rupert Richardson, president emeritus of Hardin-Simmons University and prominent historian, who wrote *Along Texas Old Forts Trail* will be present during the meeting. Abilene artist H.C. Zachry, who illustrated the book will also be on hand with a display of the original drawings which were used in the book.

The Texas Forts Trail Association was formed in 1971, as the first travel trail association in the state. Its purpose is to complement the efforts of the state in promoting travel on the Texas Forts Trail; in doing so, it will work to

further preserve the historic aspects of the trail for future generations. All persons interested in furthering these goals are welcome into the membership and are invited to the meeting. The Texas Forts Trail includes a 38 county area of West Central Texas, centering upon the 691 mile trail designated by the state. The association seeks participation from all counties in the area.

## Dyess Announce Low Flying

The world wide commitments of the 463rd Tactical Airlift Wing (TAW) at Dyess AFB require continuous low level flying training. The highest possible degree of proficiency must be maintained and the 463rd TAW aircrews must be current in all modes of aerial delivery. As a result the Wing's C-130 Hercules aircraft are flown at low level altitudes on a daily basis.

These low level flights may be scheduled between 8 a.m. and midnight, Monday thru Friday, and less frequently on weekends. Daylight missions are flown at an altitude of 500 feet above the terrain while night low level activities are conducted at least 1,000 feet above any obstacle.

## Sabanno Neighborhood

In 1883, my father, John Moss and his brother-in-law W.B. Porter came to the Sabanno country and each bought 160 acres of land for their homes.

There were only two homes of any account, those of the Andersons and Judge Black.

Father bought part of the big Anderson farm, and Mr. Porter bought a part of it for Bob Kincaid. Father gave a lot for

the school house and cemetery, built the house, and I taught the first school, just 16 pupils who came from two to four miles in every direction. The man whom you buried there last year, Lee Bell, was one of my pupils, only 6 years of age.

Father held the first three funeral services, as there was no preacher near. Then Bro. Gattis, a Methodist, came to Scranton. He organized a church and gave us one Sunday each month.

Then a Presbyterian Church was organized either by Bro. Knox or Bro. Stocton, and they

gave us one Sunday each month.

In the meantime in 85, Sam Erwin and George Patton came out and Sam bought the last of the Anderson Farm. Then Father sold his part of it to Patton. Some eight or ten years later Grandfather Erwin came out and he bought Patton out.

Then the Methodists built a Church on Father's place about three miles north and the Presbyterians built their church beside the old Friendship school house, as it was called then. Finally they were both moved away, one to Atwell

and one to Sabanno. And you know the rest.

I left there in 1901 and lost connection with it all, but this is as nearly correct as I remember it.
