Lions Hear Report On 'What Right With U.S.'

"We have the kind of government we want," Dale King told members of the Eastland Lions Club at their regular luncheon meeting Tuesday at the White Elephant Restaurant.

We're just going to have to decide that if we want more and more government protection and security, we're going to have to pay for it, the Field Representative for Cong. Omar Burleson told the Lions in his speech on "What's Right With America."

You read of strife, inflation, rising taxation and any number of other things that's wrong with our country, but I'm here to tell you that there's more right than wrong with our country.

"It's a sign of strength and to our ever-lasting credit that our country has never fought a religious war and never have we fought a war to gain more territory."

Sure we've got inflation, but the statistics show that our country's inflation has risen only by about 20 per cent in the past ten years—far less than any other country. "The main problem is our attitude," he said. "We all want more and more, but we sometimes forget that we have to pay for it."

Of discrimination, Mr. King said that no country in history has ever done more for each and every group. The violence we see is the result of a press for change.

Of taxation, he said, that we have the greatest deficiency of taxation of any country. The United States per capita tax burden is lower than any other country.

"We are the most affluent

and we've tackled some of the biggest problems that ever existed. Racial prejudices have been kept covered in our country for hundreds of years and now when we bring them out to try to solve them, we find a big, ugly festering sore.

We've tackled some big problems. We haven't solved them all, but at least we're trying.

The speaker drew several "Amens" and quite a bit of applause when he suggested that not only should those who object to our form of government be permitted to leave, but that the government might even pay for one-way tickets.

Quoting Benjamin Franklin's statement of 1787 proclaiming that "We've formed a Republic, if you can keep it," and Historian Will Durant's observation: "Democracy is the most difficult form of government," Mr. King reasoned that our system isn't perfect, but it's the best there is, anywhere.

Mr. King was introduced by Postmaster Marcus O'Dell who praised the manner in which the field representative served the people in the vast 31-county 17th District, represented by Cong. Burleson. Otis Coleman will have the program next week.

President Jeff Glazner presided and guests included Scott Bailey, Joe Weaver, Calvin Blankenship, Mrs. O'Dell and Raymond Blasingame.

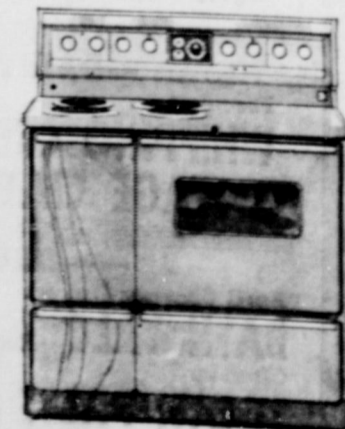

IT HAS BEEN

A dining table 3,000 feet long and three feet in width was built in White Way Park near the Texas Pacific depot at Eastland, where basket lunches were spread by thousands of visitors who came to Eastland for the dedication of the new Eastland County Courthouse, in May 1929.

More than 4,000 cups of coffee, fifteen barrels of lemonade and an abundance of ice water were provided for every one.

The speakers stand for the occasion was erected at the southeast corner of the square. On the stand there was room for some 200 people including the 75 Gold Star Mothers of the county, distinguished vis-

itors, newspaper men; civil war veterans and others. Loud speakers carried the voices of speakers to the audience.

At 9 a. m. a parade formed at the Prairie Oil and Gas Company building on South Seaman Street. Five bands marched with the parade. Decorated floats of all descriptions. Boy Scouts, Civic Clubs, Riders and Schools from all over the county made up the parade.

Open House was kept throughout the day in the court house so visitors could inspect the beautiful building.

Dr. R. G. Head, local dentist, was named Scout master of Troop 115 in Rising Star in October, 1929, after the resignation of Otha Venable. The resignation of Mr. Venable was accepted with reluctance. Due to pressure of business and other interests it became necessary for him to resign after serving as Scout master since the troop was organized in 1928, according to Scout Executive G. N. Quirl. Venable had made one of the most efficient scoutmasters in the Oil Belt area for the length of time. He had developed his troop and held it together better than any troop in this section.

Phil Berry was named Assistant scoutmaster. F. A. Lloyd, Fred W. Roberts, E. W. Howard and Fred Tunnell were the Court of Honor. E. T. Dawson and A. L. Martin were added to the Scout committee.

The first district field day was held in Rising Star, October 15, 1929. Cisco Boy Scouts nosed out on the local troop by three points. Total for the three competing troops were Cisco 98; Rising Star 93; Pioneer 23.

Individual winners for the Rising Star troop were: H. O. Bostain, James Rutherford, Charles Rutherford and Tillman Bryant. First in water-boiling, Fire by friction: Wel-

don Bryant, Obstacle Race; Erwin Byrley, undressing and redressing. Cisco troops won first in First aid stunt; Rising Star won second with Charles and James Rutherford, Eugene McBride and H. O. Bostain, participating. First place in knot tying went to Charles Rutherford.

After a time of fun came a barbecue supper served at the American Legion Hall, prepared by mothers of the local scouts. The menu was barbecue, beans, pickles, onions, cake and lemonade.

A big Council Fire on the football field was the center of the evening program. More than 100 Scouts and visitors ranged around the fire.

The Scout cheer was led by Executive Quirl. Three rousing Hows for the American Legion, Scout Mothers and for Rising Star were given.

Interesting talks, stunts and contests were "put on" by the boys around the Council Fire. A sing-song followed.

The meeting was dismissed with everyone standing with a hand on the shoulder of a boy next all around the fire while John Peter Huey of Cisco faintly sounded taps on a cornet.

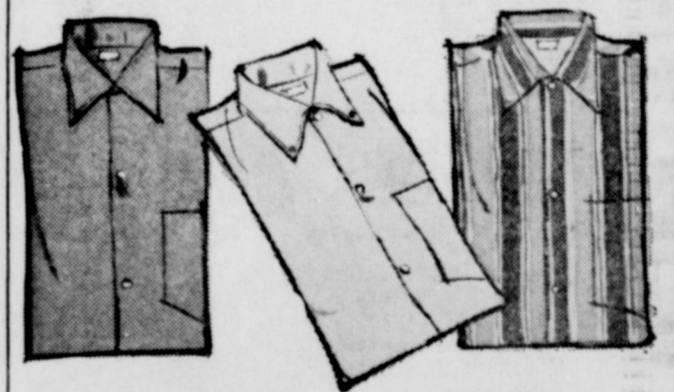

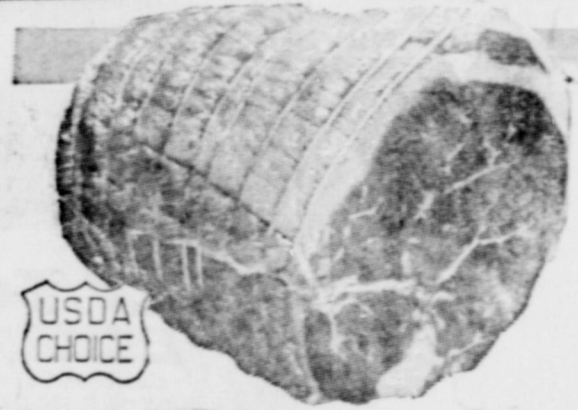

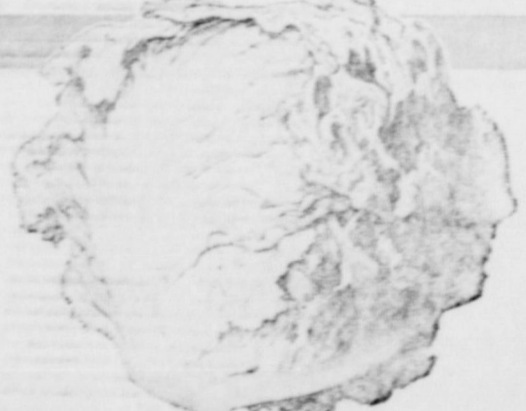
