

Reading Dynamics Will Be Demonstrated Here

Free demonstrations of the Evelyn Wood Reading Dynamics course will be given in Cisco, Eastland and Ranger this week, according to a report.

The demonstrations will be given in Cisco Tuesday, Jan. 9, and Thursday, Jan. 11, at 7 p. m. each day in room 10 of the Administration Building at Cisco Junior College; Eastland, Wednesday, Jan. 10, at 7 p. m. in Bell Hurst Playhouse; and Ranger, Thursday, Jan. 11, at 9:30 a. m. and 7 p. m. in the Science Hall of Ranger Junior College.

Ask Uncle Sam

(Editor's note: Below are questions now being asked at draft boards. The answers are by Col. Morris S. Schwartz, State Selective Service Director, 209 W. Ninth St., Austin, Texas 78701. He will welcome your question.)

Q—I'm a college student. My draft board deferred me in Class II-S Nov. 25, 1966, until Nov. 1, 1967. I've been told that, because of this, if my wife and I should have a child, I could not be deferred for the child because I was placed in Class II-S. Is this correct?

A—It is not. The board took classification action before July 1, 1967. If the board takes action after July 1, 1967 to classify you again in Class II-S, then you may not be deferred thereafter in Class III-A as a father.

Q—Is there any written material available about appeals?

A—A pamphlet, "Taking Appeals from Selective Service Classifications," is available without charge at State Selective Service Headquarters, or at draft boards.

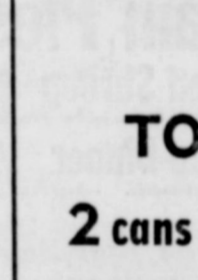

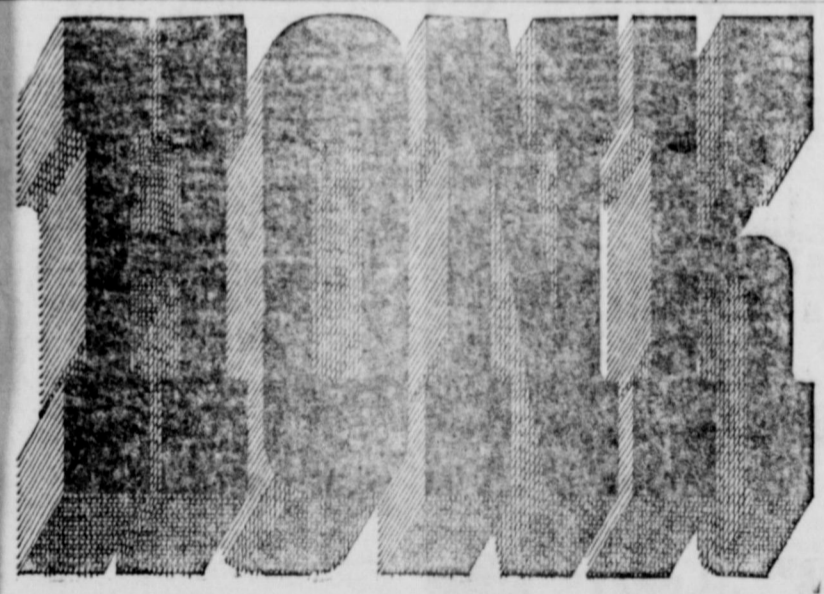

THE GORDON SPOT

During the winter we are not normally concerned with insects but this is the time of year to control scale insects on fruit trees.

Scale is one of the most destructive pests of fruit trees. Damaging infestations develop before growers are aware of the insect's presence, because of the small size of the insects.

They are tiny orange, sac-like insects beneath light gray

and waxy coverings. The round coverings of the full-grown females measure 1-16 inch in diameter. The scale are usually found on the bark, but may also get on leaves and fruit.

One of the first symptoms of scale infestation is a decline in the trees' vigor, characterized by thin, yellow foliage. If the scale are not controlled the leaves fall from the limbs, cracking and bleed-

ing of the limbs occur, and the tree dies. Many of the fruit trees in Eastland County showed symptoms of scale infestations during the past year.

Now is the time to effectively control scale. Fruit trees should be sprayed now with a dormant oil spray. It takes 3-4 pint of 97 percent miscible oil in three gallons of water or four gallons of 97 percent miscible oil in 100 gallons of water. The miscible oil can be purchased at most farm supply stores.

It would be a good idea to spray all your fruit trees between now and Feb. 1st with the dormant oil.

There were some growers who had trouble with brown rot on fruit last year. This was especially true with apricots. The best control for brown rot on fruit is a spray containing microfine wettable sulfur. This should be sprayed on the tree during the pink bud stage, again at bloom stage, and again when 75 per-

cent of the petals have fallen.

For more information on controlling fruit and nut insects and disease come by, call or write my office for a copy of the Texas Guide for Controlling Insects and Diseases on Fruits and Nuts.

Copies of the 1968 edition of the Farmer's Tax Guide are now available in the County Agent's Office. They are published by the Internal Revenue Service and are free for the asking.

The guide explains provisions of the tax law applicable to farmers, in everyday language. Many examples are used to show how the rules apply to farming situations.

Feb. 15 is the deadline for farmers to file their 1967 Federal income tax return and pay any tax due. However, you can file an estimated income tax return on form 1040-EF and pay the estimated tax by Jan. 15 and wait until April 15, 1968 to file your Federal income tax return on form 1040.

For the convenience of farmers in Eastland County we are planning a farmer's Income tax school for Feb. 5 in Eastland. Mark your calendar now so you can be sure to attend. More information on the place and time of the meeting will be given later.

AUSTIN — Sea foods on the market today are a far cry from the salt cod upon which the fishing industry was founded, according to Bai Schwartz, sea food marketing specialist for the Texas Park and Wildlife Department.

Schwartz says there are 216 commercial species of fish and shellfish marketed in the United States today, and more than 50 of these species are abundant in Texas waters.

"When you are looking for variety," says Schwartz, "fishing products give you more choice than any other food group. You can buy fish fresh, frozen, canned, dried, salted, smoked and packaged in convenience packs."

"Fish," he goes on, "are one of our most delicious and nutritious foods. They are an excellent source of high quality proteins since an average serving supplies the daily requirements for an adult as well as the minerals and vitamins necessary for good nutrition."

According to Schwartz, marine fishes are especially rich sources of iodine (required for the proper functioning of the thyroid gland), containing 50 to 200 times as much of this essential element as any other food.

He says that since fish are among the most economical protein foods which can be stored, housewives will find sea foods easy on the pocket-book.

"The preparation of fish is simple and never requires special equipment," according to Schwartz. "You can cook fish in a truly amazing variety of ways. There are baked fish, broiled fish, grilled fish, planked fish, poached fish, boiled fish, steamed fish, and the ever-popular fried fish."

LOOKING At Agriculture

By GILBERT MEREDITH
(This is one of a series of articles dealing with agricultural programs in Eastland)

We received word this week that the lease and sale of peanut allotments will apply for the 1968 and 1969 crop years. The acreage for transfer shall not exceed 50 acres per farm and is limited to transfer within the county. Leases may not exceed 5 years. Receiving farms need not have a peanut allotment. The transfer of acreage will be made on the per acre basis based on the

production of the farms involved. In other words a reduction in the number of acres for acres transferred from a low yield farm to a high yield farm would be made. Detailed instructions, and forms for making the transfer are not available at this time, but we expect to receive them by the middle or last part of January.

Watch for a additional information of this matter from this office. We expect the final date to be not earlier than April 1, 1968 for completing the sale or transfers.

1968 County ACP Handbooks were mailed to 932 Eastland farmers and ranchers on Dec. 28. Complete practice specifications and cost-share rates

are included in the Handbook. Producers interested in a conservation practice is reminded that a request must be filed in the county office beginning the practice. Special attention is directed to two new practices. The first new practice is the new irrigation reservoir practice which is applicable to old cropland. The ponds are for the interception of wells and are not for the impoundment of runoff water. We believe that this practice will be most beneficial in conserving irrigation water from weak water wells. Federal cost-share is 10 cents per cubic yard of dirt moved. The second practice is aerial control of mesquite which was used on a limited scale in 1967. We believe that this

practice will be most and reasonable in 1968. Federal cost-share is \$1.50 per acre which percent of the cost of practice.
