All young men who have just graduated from high school will be receiving 1-A classification cards next week, whether or not they plan to attend college in the fall, Mrs. Jewell Reaves, Executive Secretary of the Selective Service, announced.

The high school graduate will remain 1-A until the college has had the opportunity to inform the local Selective Service board that he is enrolled and attending classes full time. If a registrant is attending summer sessions in college, he should check to determine if he is eligible for student deferment now. College graduates will also be receiving 1-A classifications next week unless they have previously been disqualified for military service.

Registrants should report any change of status to the local board in writing in order that the information may be placed in his individual file.

New Air Freight Service Is the Result Of 2 Men's Longtime Dream, Work

Local Jaycees Pushed Too

What do Mineral Wells, Stephenville, Eastland, Abilene and San Angelo now have in common?

Scheduled air freight service, thanks to the ingenuity and drive of two young Mexican Americans—Mario A. Cadena and Raymond G. Sanchez.

Until these two and their company, Aztec Airways, Inc. began serving the five cities, they were without such taken-for-granted convenience. Formerly, air freight services were available only on a charter basis, which is too expensive for small shippers.

The inaugural flight takes place on June 1 when Cadena much decorated former Marine Corps pilot, taxied his big single-engine Cessna 207 to the active runway at Greater Southwest International Airport, fire-walled the throttle and took off for Mineral Wells and points west.

The first flight will be at Eastland airport between 4 and 4:30 p.m. Monday. The public is invited by Jaycees to attend.

The flight represented the realization of the two men's dream—a dream turned into reality with the help of three Dallas businessmen, plus UCC Venture Corporation—a subsidiary of University Comput-

ing Company that aids minority entrepreneurs with venture capital and managerial assistance—and the National Bank of Commerce in Dallas.

Several months ago Cadena, president of Aztec, and Sanchez, vice president, presented their idea of air freight service

Kidney Transplant Gives Countian His Own Miracle

"I can feel life coming back into me more and more each day. It's just a miracle," says Eastland County native Jackie (Goobar) Adams of the April 21 kidney transplant which gave him the opportunity to live life anew.

When Adams first became ill in August, 1966, he was sent to urologist at Parkland Hospital in Dallas. The illness was diagnosed as glomerulo nephritis (an incurable kidney disease). He was told then the transplant would become necessary, but an attempt was made to preserve existing kidney function with medication and diet.

In July of 1969, Jackie spent a month in the Eastland Memorial Hospital and then returned to Parkland, where he was placed on the artificial kidney program. The transplant time had come, but there was no suitable donor. (A relative is the first choice, but Jackie's brother was not a suitable donor and Jackie and his wife were faced with the choice of a home dialysis program or a cadaver or non-relative transplant.)

The dialysis program is a training program where the patient and another person in

this case, Jackie and his wife, the former Georgeann Sikes) are taught to operate an artificial kidney machine in the home.

The Adams chose the transplant. Months later, after several disappointing near-matches, a kidney which would be a good match was found in Houston. The safety-limit time from donor to recipient is only eight to twelve hours, so a

Parkland doctor took his private plane to Houston to carry the kidney back to Dallas.

The five-hour operation was started at 6 a.m. Wednesday, April 21.

Termed by doctors "an overwhelming success," the operation continued to be highly satisfactory. Within ten days, the kidney had begun functioning and a few weeks later, Jackie was allowed to leave the hospital.

Now home on a two-weeks leave, he will report back to Parkland in July for a check-up. Length between check-ups will be increased as Jackie gains strength.

Employed by Lone Star Gas Company for nine years, Jackie is a pipeline repairman at Plant Three out of Ranger. His hobbies are hunting and fishing and he hopes to be able to return to these activities.

"No one could live through an experience like this without being drawn closer to God," Mrs. Adams says. "We are so very thankful for Jackie's operation and for his improvement since then. We are looking forward to getting to move home and get back to our friends."

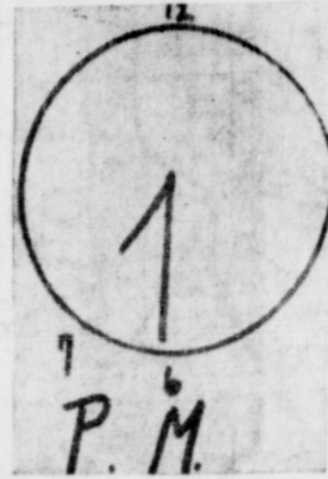

to Carl Schneider, Don Wood and Ron Kessler, all members of Minority Business Advisors, a voluntary organization of Dallas businessmen that has provided more than 1,000 hours of free management consulting to black and brown businessmen in the Dallas area.

Schneider, a stockbroker, Wood, an operations research analyst, and Kessler, an attorney, conducted a feasibility study for Aztec that proved the economic potential of the air cargo operation.

UCC Venture Corporation, after considering the MBA study, agreed to buy \$15,000 worth of Aztec stock, accord-

ing to Walter W. Durham, UCC Venture president. UCC Venture also provides management assistance to Aztec.

The MBA study convinced Wallace Emerson, a vice-president of the National Bank of Commerce, to lend Aztec \$25,000. This loan is guaranteed by the Small Business Administration.

Headquartered at Greater Southwest International Airport, located between Dallas and Fort Worth, Aztec Airways makes scheduled flights to the five cities every day except Sunday.

Aztec is starting with three single-engine Cessna 207's — two owned and one leased. Cadena pointed out that the 207 can carry more freight than any other commercial single-engine piston airplane. It can land in as short a distance as 2,000 feet. The shortest runway on Aztec's route is a 4,000-foot paved strip at Eastland. The 207 can be converted into an air ambulance in a matter of minutes.

Cadena figures the average monthly freight capacity for the three airplanes, outbound and inbound, is some 201,600 pounds. Freight flown by Aztec includes blood plasma, hospital supplies, auto parts, electrical equipment, farm equipment, plants, home appliances, musical instruments, and clothing.

Each flying day, Aztec conducts three flights from Greater Southwest, departing at 6 a.m., 11 a.m. and 3 p.m. All

In each town the flight are met by an Aztec agent, who supervises unloading, loading and delivery of the freight.
