

The trial court decision was appealed by Allen, through his attorneys, Bill B. Hart and Virgil T. Seaberry Jr., both of Eastland, to the higher court.



Earlier identification is our goal right now in working with the disease of alcoholism, Mr. Earl Watts, executive director of the Abilene Counsel on Aicoholism, told ons Club Tuesday.

Speaking at the School meeting, Mr. Watts called the disease treatable, and stated the problem involves everybody because "all consumer goods higher because of alcoholism." The biggest problem, he said, is that alcoholism generally

Of the some 600,000 cured alcoholics, approximately half have been helped through Alcoholics Anonymou
