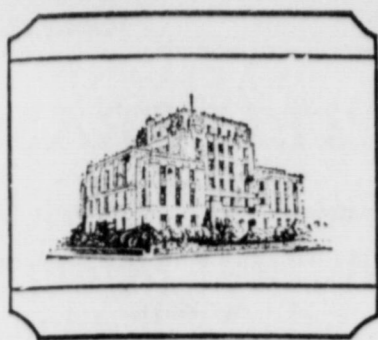

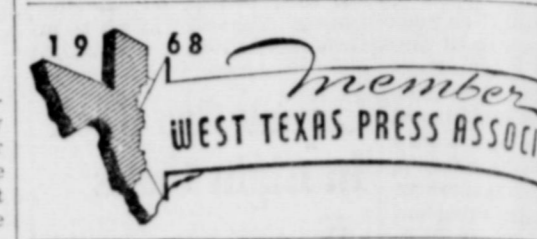

## MRS. FOSTER TO GIVE PROGRAM FOR LEAGUE

Mrs. John Foster will present "Seed For Heritage" at the Civic League luncheon at 10 a. m. Feb. 14 at the Woman's Club.

The Rosewood Plantation was built in 1835 by a wealthy planter, Daniel Turnbull. His wife, a remarkable experimental horticulturist, turned the gardens into the showplace of the Mississippi.

Restored in 1954, the plantation and gardens are open to the public. Mr. and Mrs. John Foster visited the gardens and many other antebellum homes. Mrs. Foster will give a short movie of the restoration in her program. The program is presented in the

hope that viewers will be proud of the "seeds of heritage."

Of the some 600,000 cured alcoholics, approximately half have been helped through Alcoholics Anonymous.

"Alcoholism has edged out cancer as the number three national health problem, following only heart disease and mental health problems," Mr. Watts said.

MRS. JOHN FEHL  
Has 90th Birthday

### Dear Resident Notes Birthday Saturday

On a dry day her 90th birthday Saturday at a mud puddle home at 1307 S. Seaman, Mrs. Fehl family, recalls, "My husband came here who observed Eastland in 1918 and sev-

eral months later he returned to Cleveland, Ohio, to move us down here. He told us that Eastland was a nice town except that it never rained here and the land was too dry. When the train reached Eastland, we stepped off into a big mud puddle. The whole town was muddy and it just kept raining. People used to say "the Fehl's brought the rain with them".

Cora Root was born Feb. 3, 1878 in Butler, Penn., and married John Fehl there in September of 1897. They had seven children, four sons and three daughters. Mr. Fehl's oil business took the family to Cleveland and then to the oil boom in Eastland County.

Mrs. Fehl describes her feeling about the move to Texas, "We brought everything on the train with us, our family, our furniture, and even our car. We never considered driving all the way here because everything was so unknown. But we were excited and kind of tickled to get out and see new and dif-

ferent things and be a part of the progress".

The family lived on Moss St. for about three months while their S. Seaman home time, the 13th block of S. Seaman was "in a pasture a long way from town", Mrs. Fehl says. Their home was the third one built there. And the mud was still present; the family car often got stuck on S. Seaman between the home and Mr. Fehl's offices above where the Tombs and Richardson Drug is.

Root & Fehl Oil Company had interests in Breckenridge and it took Mr. Fehl an entire day to get to Breckenridge from Eastland.

Mrs. Fehl remembers when the streets around the courthouse were paved and "the young folks turned them into a race track." She says, "Our children and all the others drove around and around on the pavement."

She narrowly missed seeing Old Rip emerge from a cornerstone in 1928. She says, "I was with my husband in

his office that day. He went across the street to watch the proceedings, but I stayed in the office and missed the big story."

Mrs. Fehl is a longtime Church of Christ, but cannot attend services because of the stairs.

Walking any distance and climbing stairs are the few things which she cannot do, however. She says, "I read and wash dishes and make beds. It's just those stairs that gets me."

She has four sons, Argie of Arbutle, Calif.; Clifford of Coop; Sherman of Crane; John of Livermore, Calif.; one daughter, Mrs. Eldred Allen of Eastland; six grandchildren; and 13 great-grandchildren. Two of her daughters have died and Mr. Fehl died in 1965.

In 1959, Mr. and Mrs. Fehl and Mrs. Allen toured Ohio and Pennsylvania. "We enjoyed it but it was just a trip," Mrs. Fehl says, "It wasn't what we called going home until we started back to Eastland. We're just plain Texan even though we weren't born here."

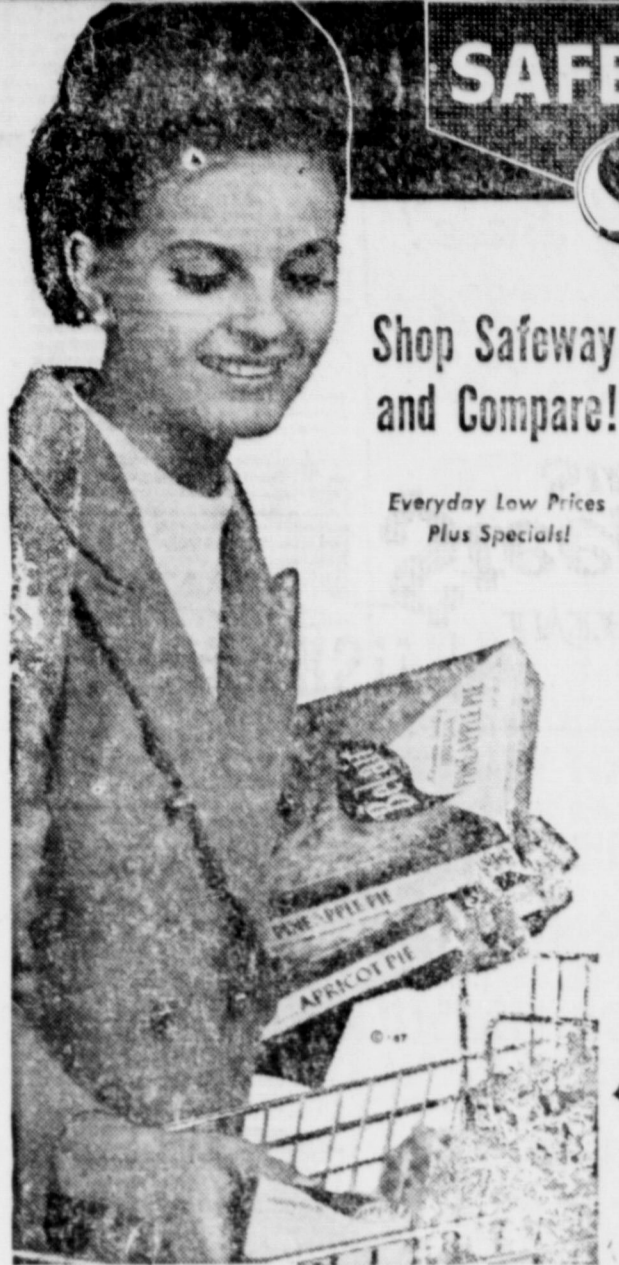

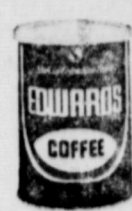
