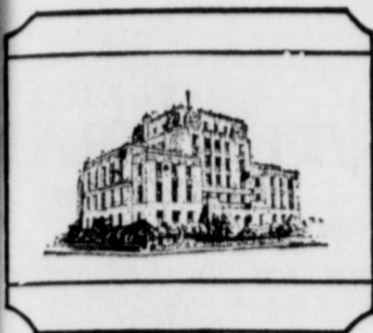

BOARD CONSIDERS ANSWERING SERVICE

It is felt that a public answering service will be greatly appreciated in Eastland, and the chamber directors will consider the possibility of utilizing the chamber secretary's time more profitably.

A \$15 monthly fee will be charged each customer, in return for which the chamber office will answer all, or any portion desired of the customer's calls during the normal office hours, five days a week.

This is especially helpful for businessmen, particularly service men and professionals who do not maintain regular offices, and who are forced by their occupation to be away from their own telephones for long periods. The customer merely calls the chamber and picks up his calls as soon as he is near a phone.

Persons interested in securing the service are invited to contact the chamber, phone 629-2332, for additional information. President J. T. Gregory has announced.

Several have already indicated their willingness to sign up for the service, and others are expected.

Gregory stated that the service will provide assistance to the public in making contact with servicemen and others quicker.

There will be no added expense to the chamber because the customers will be billed for the answering and will make their own telephone installation to set up the system. The equipment is such that the customer's telephone rings as well as ringing at the chamber office.

It will prevent local businessmen from missing important calls.

Services Set For Carbon Lad, 6, Accident Victim

Kenneth Regian, six years old, died at 1:20 p. m. Tuesday in an accident in Carbon. The child was found by his mother caught between the window and door of a car, in which he had been playing.

Arrington - Hamner Ambulance of Eastland carried the child to Eastland Memorial Hospital, where he was pronounced dead on arrival, though emergency first aid had been given by Jack Arrington as the ambulance came back to Eastland.

Justice of the Peace Wells Dalton of Eastland declared the death due to accidental strangulation.

Services for the child will be held at 3 p. m. Thursday in the First Baptist Church in Carbon, with the Rev. Bruce McNair, pastor, officiating. Burial will be in the Murray Cemetery in Carbon, under direction of Arrington-Hamner Funeral Home.

The child was the son of Steve and Betty Regian of Carbon. He was born Feb. 16, 1962, in Eastland Memorial Hospital.

Survivors include his parents, four sisters, Betty Faye, Blinda Carol, Cordelia and Barbara; two brothers, Steve Jr. and David, all of the home; maternal grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. C. C. Jones of Carbon.

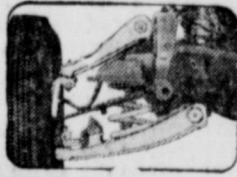

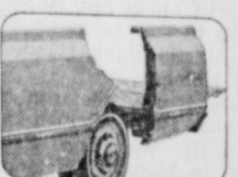

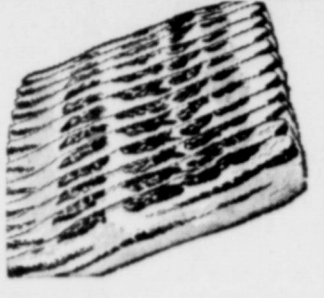

Safeway Stores Reports Record Sales for Year

Safeway Stores, Incorporated, today reported that for the 52 weeks ended December 30, 1967, consolidated unaudited sales were \$3,360,879,991, a record high for Safeway, fractionally above consolidated sales of \$3,345,186,668 for 1966. Consolidated unaudited net income for 1967 was \$50,892,927 or \$2 per share compared to \$59,747,957 or \$2.35 per share in 1966.

While the profit for 1967 was below the record figure of 1966, it was still the second best year in Safeway's history. A marked improvement occurred in the latter part of the year as evidenced in a profit figure for the 16-week period ended Dec. 30, 1967, of 20,366,626, or 80 cents a share. This was 14.2 percent above the net income of \$17,832,852, or 70 cents a share, reported for the comparable period of 1966.

Sales for the 16 weeks ended Dec. 30, 1967, of \$1,069,433,877 were 3.2 percent above sales of \$1,036,665,804 for the comparable period a year ago.

Reporting of consolidated sales for 1967 has been changed to include sales of overseas operations converted to U. S. dollars, not included in previous years, and to include Canadian sales converted to U. S. dollars rather than at dollar for dollar without conversion as in previous years. These changes in reporting did not have a material effect on 1967 sales, or on sales for previous years if restated.

There were 2,240 stores in operation at the end of 1967 compared to 2,222 at the end of 1966.



Appeals Court Denies Motions In Allen Action

Latest ruling in the year old Riedel-Allen case came Friday morning when the 11th Court of Civil Appeals overruled motions of rehearing which had been filed by each party.

Mrs. Patsy Riedel filed suit against Ivan J. Allen in February 1967 asking several thousand dollars damages in the November 1965 shooting death of her husband. She was awarded \$260,000 by a 91st District Court jury.

Allen sought reversal of the decision. The Appeals Court remanded the case for a new trial January 19. Mrs. Riedel filed for a rehearing Feb. 1 and Allen filed a similar motion Feb. 5.

A dissenting opinion on the Riedel motion was written by Judge Esco Walter. Either party is entitled to file another motion for rehearing in the same court within fifteen days.
