responsible for the contract made by him while he was acting for you.  
 You may be held responsible for the acts of a person who customarily represents you even though he entered into a contract for you without your consent or approval.  
 For example, you may have a partner in a business, and you and he have agreed that certain contracts shall be made only upon the signature of both of you.  
 Unknown to you and without your consent, your partner signs such a contract with a third person involving partnership business. If the person with whom this contract is made has no knowledge of the terms of your partnership agreement, you are responsible for the contract which your partner has made.  
 You may have agreed between you that neither of you would buy, without the other's consent, any items of merchandise costing more than \$50. You did not give this information to salesmen who called on you. In your absence on a Thursday afternoon, your partner ordered merchandise for your store costing more than the \$50 limit.  
 When the merchandise is delivered, you can not refuse to accept it because you can be bound by the contract of your partner. This is true in many situations, and the salesman is not bound by your partnership agreement be-

cause you did not advise him of the \$50 limitation.  
 As the actions of your agent are considered to be your actions, you assume the responsibility of his doing them correctly.

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**IT'S THE LAW**  
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**AGENCY LAW EXPLAINED**  
 Suppose that you hire your neighbor's teen age son, Jimmy, to cut your grass, and he runs your new mower into another neighbor's hedge. The hedge is ruined. Are you responsible for the damages? Quite likely you are.

Or let us suppose that you find you need a loaf of bread for the evening meal. You ask a friend to take your car and run to the store for it. On the way, he runs down old Mr. Peabody, seriously injuring him. Can you be held responsible? It is possible that you can.

In both instances, an "agent" was acting for you. His acts while performing those duties are, in the eyes of the law, your acts. In legal terms, you are the "principal."

You may be liable despite the fact that you may have cautioned him to be extremely careful.

The average individual expects to answer for his own actions. He does not usually consider that he

may be responsible for the actions of other persons. That, however, is frequently the case.

Suppose you ask another person to do something for you, that is, to act as your agent. You may pay him, or he may be doing it without compensation.

You may ask him to buy or sell property for you. Or, his responsibility may be to negotiate an agreement for you with a third person.

If representatives or warranties are made by your agent in performing the task which you assigned to him, you are responsible. In a like manner, you are re-

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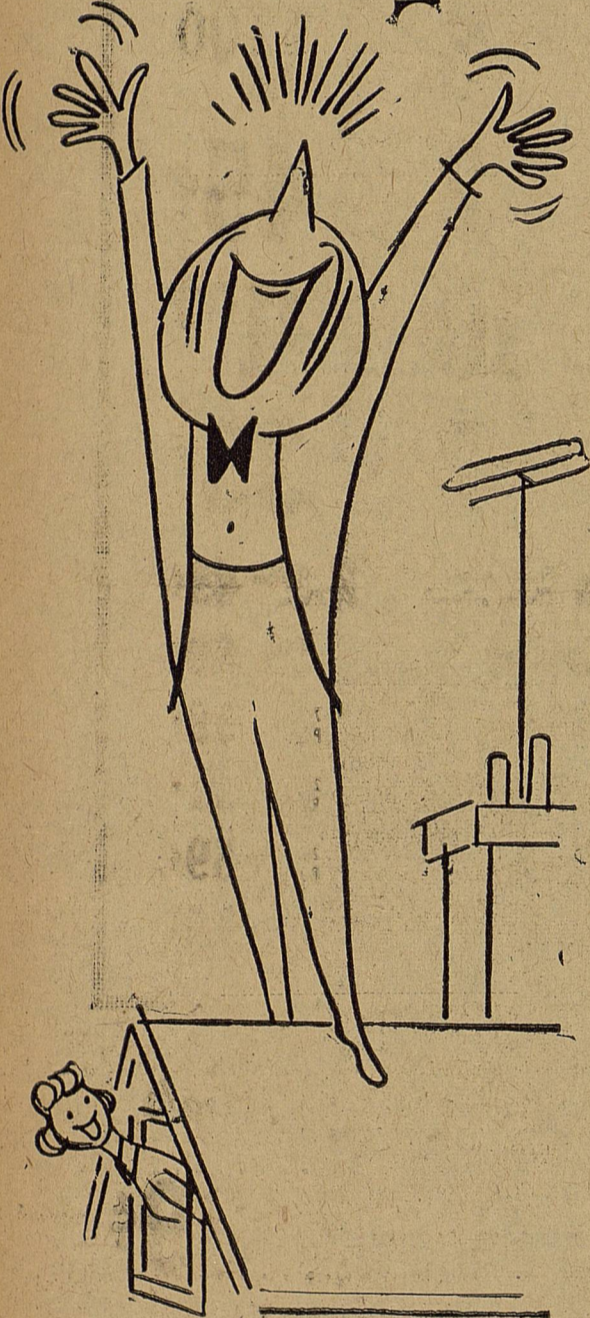

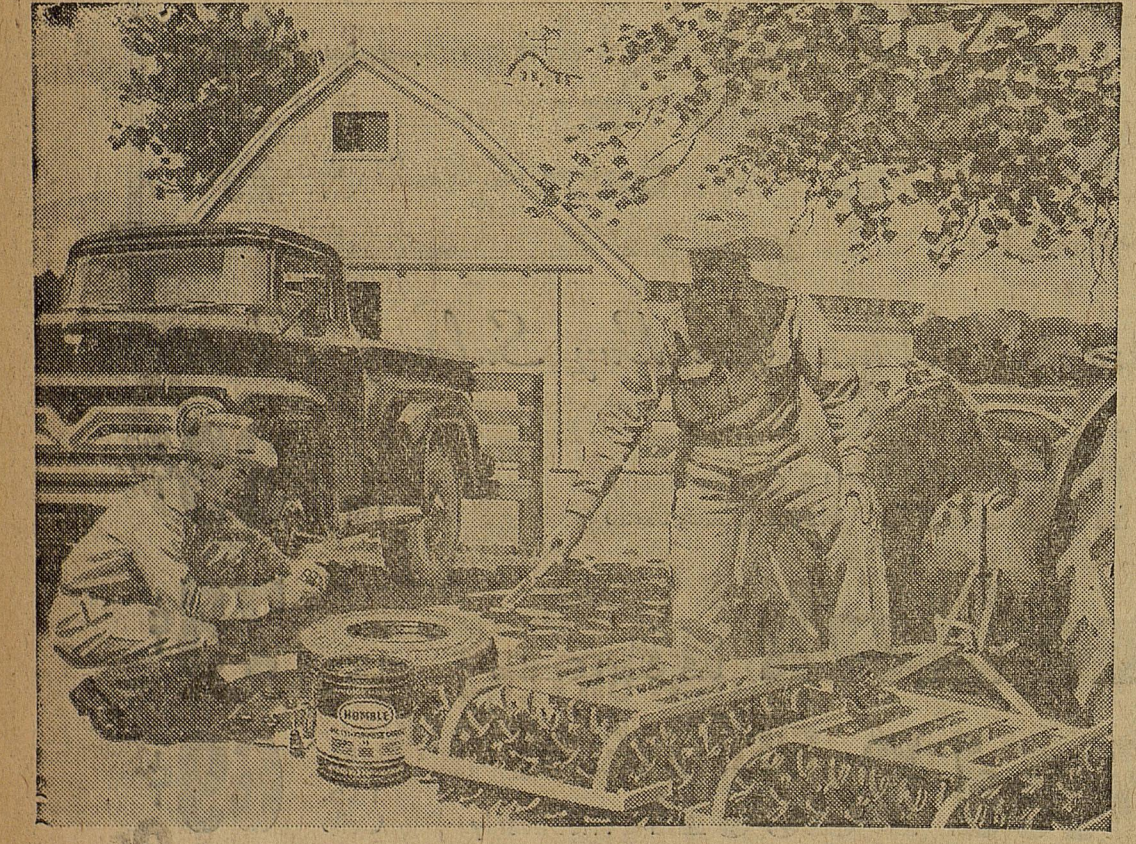

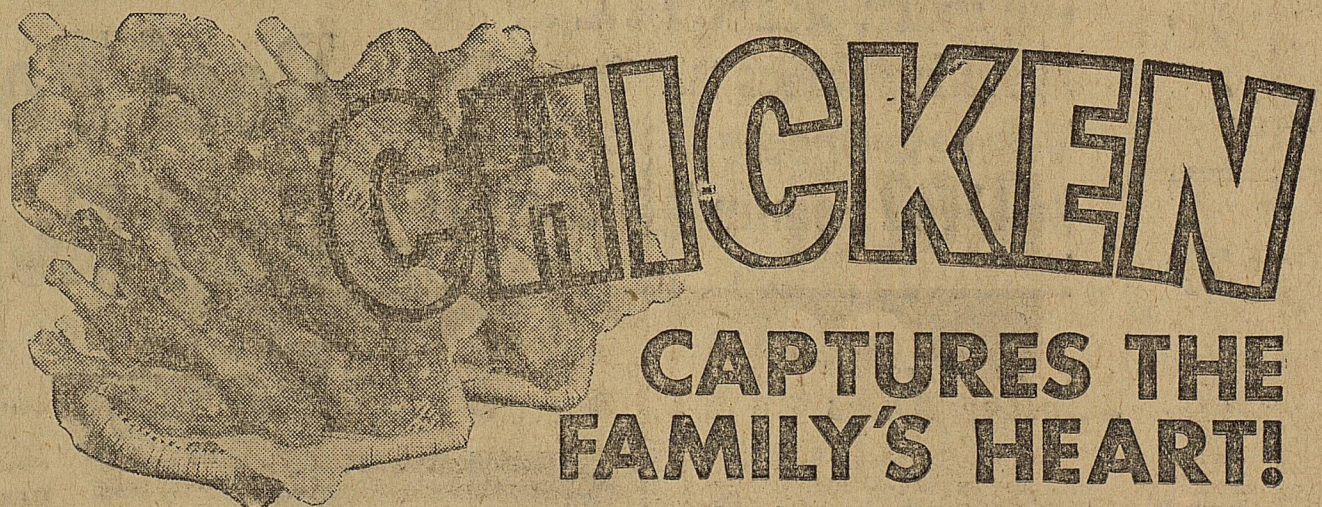
**I GIVE YOU TEXAS**

An experience to be prized: In the summer of '54 engaging in a storytelling spree on the King Ranch, during the Southwest Writers' Conference. After a barbecue on the famous ranch, the crowd of several hundred listened to several brilliant story-tellers and me.  
One was a renowned lawyer author, another a Mormon writer and another a New Mexico poet and fiction writer.  
"The best-laid plans—" A band of criminals was going to rob a bank. After the "joint had been cased" and each man assigned his place, the robbery was pulled and the outlaws made their getaway.  
It so happened that two little children were playing nearby and they noticed an automobile which was parked for a while. They wrote the licence number in chalk on the sidewalk. Policemen learned of this and they rounded up the gang. The license number was that of the get-away car.  
That was a classic retort that Walter O'Malley, president of the Brooklyn baseball club, made when a surgeon who had charged \$9,500 for an operation on a Dodger's hand said he was willing to leave the reasonableness of the charge up to a committee of doctors. O'Malley said in effect, "We will take our chances with a jury made up of men who are used to receiving doctor bills instead of those who are in the business of sending them."  
The poet wrote, "I am a part of all I have met." Wouldn't it have been more accurate, "All I have met is a part of me?" The places you've seen, the songs you have heard, the people you have known—all these have shaped your philosophy, colored your thinking, altered your life.  
You've got to admire a man who may be down and out and who asks for money but offers to do some work in return. Last summer in Fort Worth, such an individual said to me, "Friend, I need money; do you know of any lawn that needs mowing?" We were in the Hotel Texas lobby at the time and I couldn't see a lawn in any direction but I admired his willingness to work and so handed him a quarter.
