

#### **Butcher Shop Boycott Is** Successful in Some Areas

Texas housewives' boycott of butcher shops ranged from success at some spots to business as usual at others. It was too early to tell the effect of the boycott declared by women in at least 18 Texas cities. The week-long protest against high meat prices started vesterday.

In Dallas, where the idea originated, a check of six groceries showed two reported sales off, two with normal business and two saying it was too early to tell.

The Orange Leader surveyed 29 groceries and gave these results: Eighteen reported fresh meat sales ranged from downslightly to zero; ten said about normal, and one reported an increase. Most said sales of poultry and canned meats boomed. Fort Worth groceries said there was no noticeable slowdown.
