Thurmond says the
to self-sufficien $y$ in nation must move in every way on oil from the Middle East as a basic necessity for the welfare of Americans. Oil drilling has increased rapidiy since oil prices. likewise as gas prices are gas drilling is expected to do increased and soon a major plant to extract mas fros coal will be operating in the Dakotas.
Nuclear power, too, must be pursued and hurmond offers a good answer to agitators who picket and oppose nuclear power development. He points out that not a single life has been lost in the years of
nuclear power production, while some two hundred coal miners have lost their lives in recent years mining coal The same example applies to oil and gas. A number of men recently lost their lives when an oil rig off the oast of Canada collapsed. That was not the first such resulting from oil and gas extraction.
But nuclear energy, thus far, has been safely
developed. Additional safeguards have been found developed. Additional safeguards have been foun necessary. But, overall, the record is good, better than
the record concerning coal or petroleum production.

Many Germans don't like this idea--they have bee
evastated twice by war in this century and aren enthusiastic about a nurcear climax as number three Thus, either NATO forces should be kept up to strengt American hostages in Germany becomes weak. From the classical historic standpoint, the presence of a tripwire is a worthwhile function, even if one look these troops as a collective sacrificial lamb nuclear weapons also, and if the world (and the Russians) know we will not launch a massive nuclear retaliatory strike in case of war (because the U.S. would
be devastated worse than Russia), then the tripwire value is negaied. Also, as mentioned, more and more Europeans don't favor a strike on Germany. We are, therefore, currently in the position of trying
persuade our NATO partners to let us arm our for with weapons which would allow them to put force effective defense, but there is growing European sentiment against deployment of neutron warheads and other U.S. nuclear missiles. If we are not able to do
