Area receives rain; hail in Lazbuddie

Muleshoe received approximately one inch of rain before 10 p.m. on Thursday night, according to J.K. Adams. A rain storm in Lazbuddie on Thursday also included some

Claud Gregory, owner and manager of the North Lazbuddie Gin Company said, "As of right now, I know that some people lost some crops (cotton) during hail last week and some of them replanted cotton and some went back to soy beans. As far as I know right now though, we didn't have anybody lose anything last night (Thursday)."

With the inch of rain Muleshoe received Thursday, Adams said this brings the total rain count for 1994 up to 6.25 inches.

"I'd say we are in pretty good shape," Adams said.

"It was kind of nice to get this inch of rain so soon after the other rain. The moisture is in pretty fair shape now for crops, but they will need more moisture later," Adams said.

During the previous rainfall on May 26, the area received .8 inches of rain. Prior to that, Muleshoe had received a total of 2.1 inches of rain in May.

tied the state AA record. Scisson said that would have put Jon 4th in the state had the jump been made at a sanctioned track meet.

That wasn't a first for Miller though. Miller broke his school record at Lazbuddie High for pole vaulting his sophomore year when he cleared 15 feet. The old record was 14 feet.

Scisson has been Jon's coach for six years, starting with him when Jon was in 7th grade.

"I'm very excited for Jon. I started pushing him really hard last year. I told him that this could be his ticket out. With his height, he can pick any school he wants to go to."

Scisson said that Jon has already received many letters from colleges seeking to recruit him.

He added, "We have to work on Jon's consistency over the summer. Another problem we have is the weather, because you can 't just practice any day. Everything has to be perfect, with no wind. We are hoping the weather will cooperate."

"We're really happy for Jon though," Scisson said. "It is not everyday that we see a kid from Lazbuddie get invited to a national meet. He is one of the best in the nation."

Jon said that he hopes to use his pole vaulting skills to vault as high as he can go.

"I will accept any invitation I get to compete. I would love to someday be on the Olympic team. I'd probably have to clear 18 feet to do that." Jon said.

Jon isn't going to sit around and wait for things to happen though. He takes his vaulting seriously, working out as much ashe can. He practices in about two hour sessions with Scisson every other day.

Jon hopes his pole vaulting will earn him a scholarship to a university, where he is thinking about majoring in sports medicine or engineering.

Jon is the son of Mike and Pam Miller of Lazbuddie. Two of his brothers were also involved in track and pole vaulting.

Jon is an honor student at LHS, listed on the A/B honor roll. He is also active in the National Honor Society. He is also versatile in track, hoping to be in the decathlon, which is an event with five field and five running events.

Jon was named an All-Time Area Athlete by the Amarillo Globe News, meaning he was ranked number one in all classifications in this area, Scisson said. Jon was also ranked the #2 athlete in the area by the Lubbock Avalanche-Journal this past spring.





Justice Foundation awards grants

AUSTIN-The Texas Equal Access to Justice Foundation announced that \$5,728,776 in IOLTA funds was granted to 58 organizations that provide civil legal services to the more than three million low income Texans.

The amount distributed is approximately \$1.4 million less than the amount distributed last year and includes approximately \$600,000 in one-time grant supplements awarded to many organizations whose grants were sharply reduced because of the decline in revenue.

The decline in revenue was caused by the continuing drop in short-term interest rates during the past year.

The Foundation board oversees the administration of the funds and serves as the grant review committee.

All Christians Share In One Body

In their book Fearfully and Wonderfully Made, Dr. Paul Brand and Philip Yancey quote from St. Augustine: "Men go abroad to wonder at the height of the mountains, at the huge waves of the sea, at the long courses of the rivers, at the vast compass of the ocean, at

the circular motion of the stars; and they pass by themselves without wondering."

The human body, he was saying, is itself perhaps God's greatest creation!

Consider, for example, the wonders of DNA.

"Every cell," Brand and Yancey write, "possesses [in its DNA] a genetic code so complete that the entire body could be reassembled from information in any one of the body's cells."

In fact, our bodies *are* being reassembled every moment as old cells die and new ones are formed to replace them.

As Brand and Yançey point out, not one of us inhabits the same body he wore ten years ago. All of the cells except brain cells and nerve cells are entirely new. The human body, they point out, "is more like a fountain than a sculpture: maintaining its shape, but constantly being renewed." But because of identical DNA locked within each cell, the body remains a unified whole.

According to the authors, if the instructions written on each DNA strand were written out they would fill a thousand sixhundred-page books!

But they are not written in books; they are written inside each of the hundred trillion cells in our bodies binding each cell with every other cell to work for the good of the whole body.

So it is with the Body of Christ. As Dr. Brand writes: "Just as the complete identity code of my body inheres in each individual cell, so also the reality of God permeates every cell in his Body.... I sense that bond when I meet strangers in India or Africa or California who share my loyalty to the Head; instantly we become brothers and sisters, fellow cells in Christ's Body. I share the ecstasy of community in a universal Body that includes every man and woman in whom God resides."




