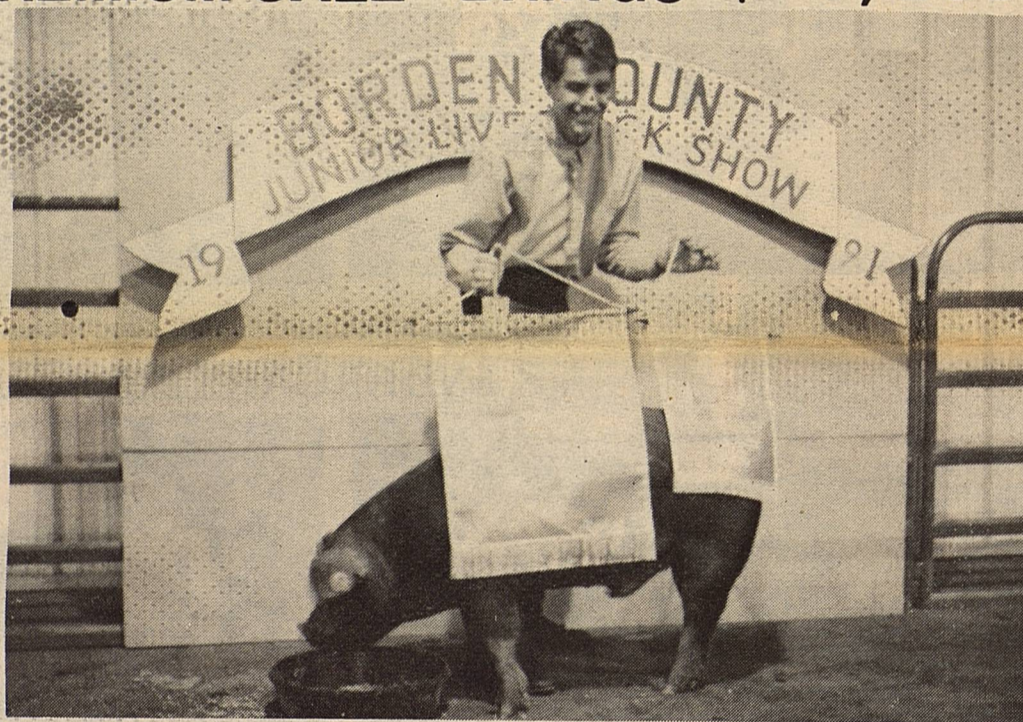

LIVESTOCK SHOW A SUCCESS!

PREMIUM SALE BRINGS \$34,200.00

A large crowd of participants, parents, grandparents and friends were on hand to view the annual Borden County Junior Livestock Show in which 72 lambs, 132 barrows and 27 steers were entered. By late Thursday, January 17, the animals and their exhibitors had been trimmed, scrubbed and fluff-dried until they were all ready to enter the ring and be presented to the judges.

Although the animals were the ones to be poked and pulled, the kids and all of the hard work they put in on these lambs, barrows and steers is mainly what the Junior Livestock Association focuses on. Their neat appearance, their

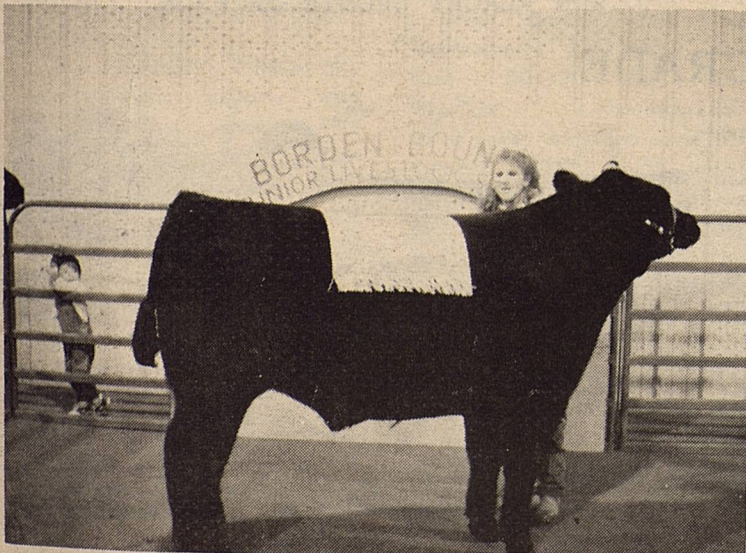


GRAND CHAMPION OF THE BARROW SHOW

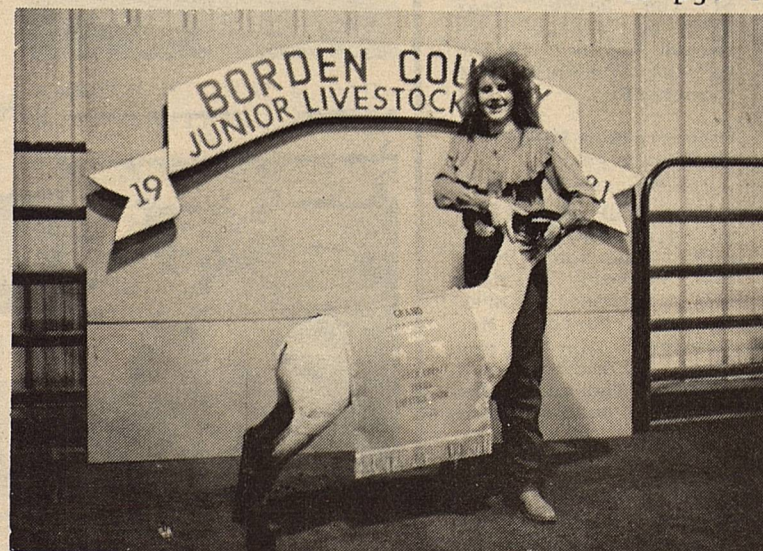

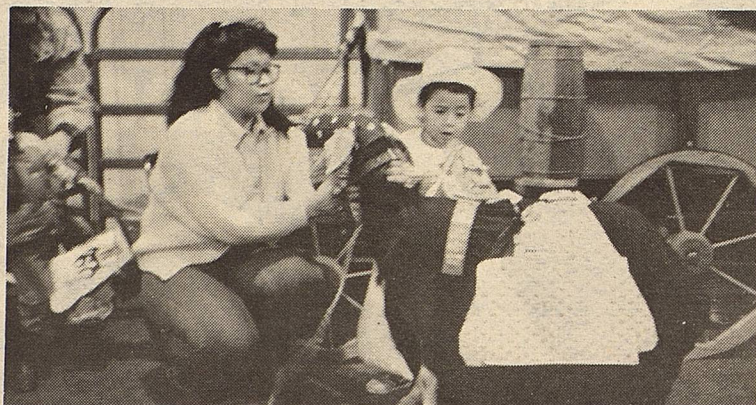
GRAND CHAMPION of SHOW LAMB

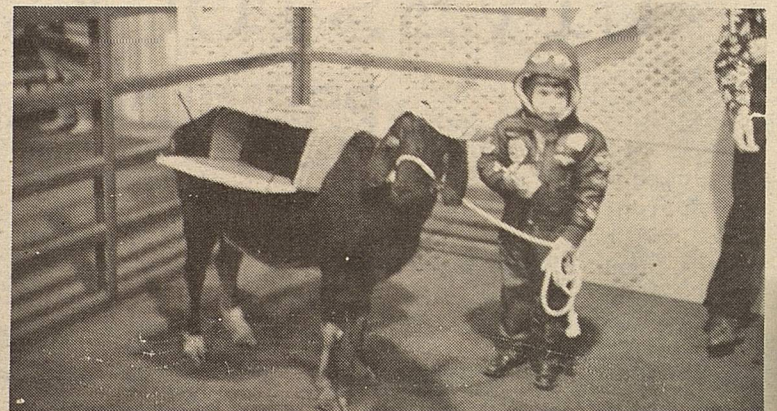

BARROW SHOW

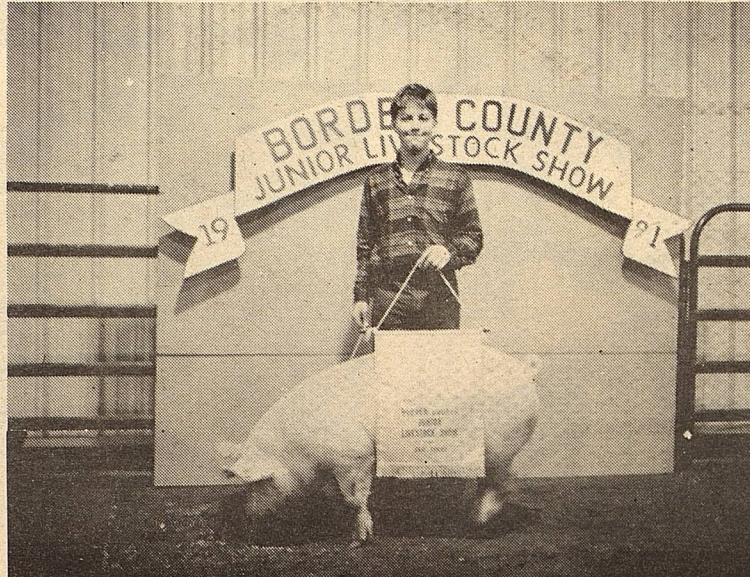
The early morning sun was hidden by clouds and rain Friday which made it seem earlier and colder than it really was. But when the exhibitors began final preparations for the barrow run that began at 8:30 a.m., things began to heat up.

Gary Patterson, CEA-AG, Parmer County, the barrow judge was prepared to have a difficult time choosing the Grand Champion of the Show from the 132 barrows that he would have to judge.

"Putting all the pieces of the barrow puzzle together is a challenge for anyone," Patterson said. And it is a special challenge to do it in such a way as to encourage, not discourage the young people. Mr. Patterson feels that this program is very important as it brings families and communities together in a concentrated effort for the good of the young folks. Gary said "Working on an animal together has brought me and my son closer". Having a common goal can only help to strengthen a family's relationship.

Mr. Patterson also has strong feelings for our troops in the Persian Gulf and asked everyone in the showbarn to bow and say a silent prayer for them.

STEER SHOW

The steer judge, Spencer Tanksley, CEA-AG, Bailey County, said he knew that our county must be very proud to be able to work and teach kids in

such fine facilities. Spencer feels that the exhibitors are all important. Whenever he has a chance to judge shows, he likes to visit with the kids,

and to see if they are learning as much as they can about these animals and if they are taking advantage of this experience.

He chose the heavy weight British-British Cross, shown by Shayne Hess as the Grand Champion of the 27 steers on exhibit. The heavy weight European-European Cross, shown by Amanda Anderson was judged the Reserve Grand Champion.

Plains Hog Co. of Lubbock, set the floor price for the barrows at \$.46.50 and Kenny Hart of Snyder set a \$.45 floor price for the lambs.

All 67 exhibitors won a ribbon and belt badge donated by friends of the stock show. Plastic feed buckets donated by Mr. and Mrs. Bill Phinzy, MoorMans Representative were also distributed among the top place winners in each class.
