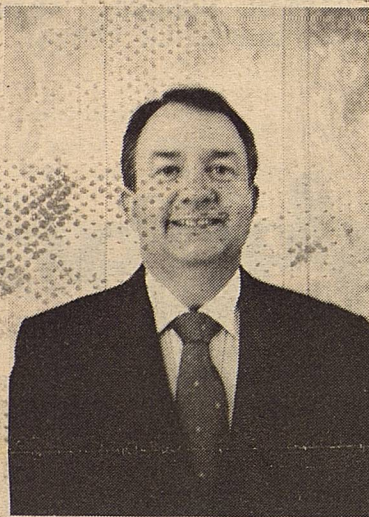

He has ranched in northwest Borden County since 1973. Scott has been a member of the Borden County ASC Committee for five years. He is also the secretary of



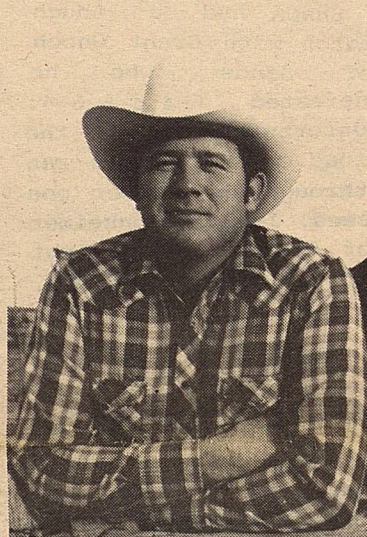

Shawn opened against Jason Cox also of Grady. After a slow start, Shawn prevailed 6-3, 6-2.

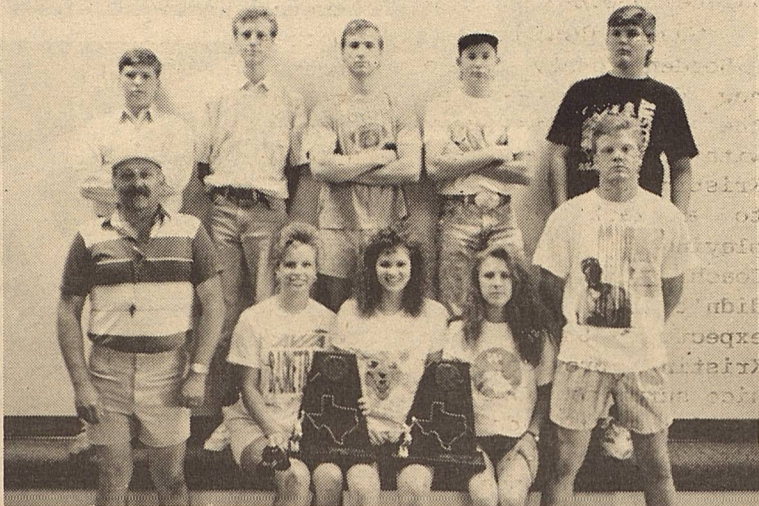
John Paul reached the semifinals by defeating Michael Vera of Dawson 6-3, 6-2.

High School Runs In Cougar Relays

On Saturday, April 6th, the Borden Coyote track team traveled to Klondike to participate in the Cougar Relays.

Even though they were few in numbers due to conflicting activities, the kids did a fine job.

In the boys division Joe Acosta triple jumped 35.8 and came right back and long jumped 17'1". He also ran the 100 meter in 12.4 and the 200 in 25.5. Chad Connors also ran the 200 meter in 27.3 and the 300 intermediate hurdles

in 46.9. Clay Miller ran the intermediates in 50.7 plus the 100 meter hurdles in 18.93.

In the girls division, Mendy Hensley ran the 800 meters in 3:41.6. Melody Harrison ran the 100 meters in 14.9 and the 200 meters in 31.6, plus long jumping 13'3 3/4". Kaela Van Vleet also competed in the 200 and 100 meters with times of 33.1 and 16.3 respectively. Heather Armstrong ran the 1600 meters in a good time of 7:37.3.

Jones and Harris Advance to Regional

John Paul Harris will vault in the regional for class A in Abilene on April 27th, after finishing second at the district meet with a vault of 11ft-6inches. He also ran on the 4x100 relay team, which placed fourth with a time of 48:26. Harris placed fourth in the 200 meters. Brandon Adcock, another member of the 4x100 relay team, placed fifth in the 100 meters with a 11.9 clocking. Adcock also ran the 200, but failed to make the finals.

Joe Acosta made the final seven jumpers in the long jump with a leap of 17ft-8½ inches, plus running on the relay team.

Cody Cox, the last member of the relay team, also pole vaulted 9 feet and ran 64.2 in the 400 meters.

Seth Vestal also ran the 400 with a time of 69.3 and 2:43.1 in the 800 meters.

Jason Sharp placed fourth in the high jump, clearing 5ft-6 in. and ran a strong 26.0 in the 200 meters.

Chad Conner ran the 300 meter hurdles in 44.7, while Clay Miller ran 48.88 and a 19.1 in the 110 hurdles.

In the girls division Jeana Jones triple jumped 31ft-7inches to finish second and she ran sixth in the 400 meters with a time of 68.1.

Melody Harrison long jumped 13ft-3in. and was one of seven to make the finals in the 200 meters.

Heather Armstrong ran the 1600 meters in 7:12:22 to place third for the Bronze medal.

Jacquelyn McPhaul ran the 100 meters with Kaela Van Vleet, but both failed to qualify for the final event.

Mendy Hensley got sixth in the 800 meters while Charlotte Ball jumped the gun in the 200 and was disqualified.

battle for 3rd place in boys singles, Lewis defeated Harris 7-5,6-3, Masonheimer easily won the championship over Zarate, 6-0,6-1.

Girls Doubles

Borden County put a new doubles team on the court this year with Shayne Hess and Kristin Monger. Due to a lack of time playing together, Coach Jones really didn't know what to expect. Shayne and Kristin provided a nice surprise, however, as they beat Hyde and Edwards of Blackwell 6-3,6-0 to advance to the semifinals. They came back the next day and beat Fryar and Franco of Sands with a 6-3,6-3 game. As a result, Hess and Monger landed in the finals against number one seeds Traci Hindman and Marla Self of Blackwell. This was one of the best matches of the tournament. In the first set, the teams battled darkness and each other, with Hindman and Self winning 6-4. We moved on to Coahoma, where Hess and Monger built up a nice lead in set two. Hindman and Self proved too tough for Borden County, however, as they came roaring back for a 7-5 win and the championship. "However, the way we played was very encouraging," said Coach Jones.

Boys Doubles

Borden County entered two teams in the boys doubles event. Cole Vestal and Richard Buchanan teamed up as the number one team and Guy Will Zant and Kirk Jones formed the number two team. Guy and Kirk defeated Riggins and Parsley of Klondike in the opener, while Cole and Richard stopped O'Malley and Waddington of Blackwell, 6-2,6-2. As a result, both of Borden County's teams reached the semifinals to play the number one and two seeds.

Billy Hindman and Will Davis, the number one seeds from Blackwell, defeated Zant and Jones 6-3,6-2.

Although they played hard, the experience gap was too much to overcome.

Vestal and Buchanan, however, were more successful, as they upset the number two seeds from Grady, Brad Gibson and Stephen Briseno, 6-4,7-5; in a very tough match. Cole and Richard battled Hindman and Davis on even terms as they split the first two sets 4-6,6-3. When the teams moved to Coahoma for the final set, Borden County lost their momentum and dropped the deciding set 1-6. Guy Will and Kirk played the 3rd place match on Monday at Lamesa against Gibson and Briseno of Grady. They were already down 4-6 in the first set. Zant and Jones put up a good fight, but lost 2-6 in the remaining set, to claim 4th place in doubles.

"I am quite proud of both our boys and girls teams this year," said Coach Jones. Both the singles and doubles teams worked well and played well as a team, even though the teams were new this year. He said, "I think they will continue to get better as they play more." "We advanced all 9 of our players as far as the District Semifinals, and both our boys and girls doubles teams, as well as Amanda in singles, will advance to the Regional in Abilene on April 24-25," commented Jones. He said, "We also brought the boys and girls District 13 team trophies home to Gail." It marked the first time in several years for the boys to win a district trophy. The final date to signup in the 1991 Farm Program is April 26, 1991. If you plan to participate in the program you need to come by the office as soon as possible. Due to the complexity of the farm program it will be to your advantage to signup as soon as possible and not wait until the last minute.

FINAL CERTIFICATION DATES

May 1, 1991 is the final date to certify all acreage of wheat, oats, barley, rye, and triticale. These acreage reports are necessary, regardless of whether the small grains were planted for grain, grazing, cover crop, windstrips, ACR, etc.. A "0" (zero) acreage report is also necessary for base protection.

Wheat or oats, planted for grain, must have had livestock removed by March 20th. You may file a request to leave small grain standing on ACR by May 1, if you wish to leave the crop and do not wish to have the crop considered as grain. There is a \$10.00 filing fee for this service. If a request to leave small grain standing is filled, you will not be able to graze or bale the small grain crop.

The final date to report and certify spring seed crops is July 15, 1991. All producers with cropland are urged to report.

MEASUREMENT SERVICE

Because of the importance of an accurate acreage report, ASCS offers a guaranteed measurement service for the nominal fee. Producers enrolled in the farm program are reminded that inaccurate reports can result in costly penalties. If you have any doubts about your acres, you are encouraged to use measurement service.

CRP MAINTENANCE

Producers who have placed their highly erodible land in the Conservation Reserve Program for 10 years are reminded that weed control must be maintained during the life of the contract. Cost shares are not available for weed control after the grass is established. The weed control is at the producers expense. This is just a reminder that spot checks will begin soon and if you have a weed control problem, appropriate action should be taken. Failure to maintain the control of weeds is a violation of the CRP contract and could result in costly penalties.

WOOL AND MOHAIR

The incentive payment rates for wool, unshorn lambs, and mohair has been announced. Payment rates for 1990 marketing are:

- 127.5 percent of net sales proceeds for wool
- \$4.08 per hundred pounds for unshorn lambs
- 387.3 percent of net sales proceeds for mohair

Promotion fund deductions are 6¢ a lb. for wool, 30¢ per CWT for unshorn lambs, and 4.5¢ a lb. for mohair.

Incentive wool checks have been mailed.

1990 CROP CORN AND GRAIN SORGHUM LOANS

The final date to request a loan on eligible 1990 crop corn or grain sorghum is May 31, 1991.

YIELDS

Cotton yields will be the same as they have been from 1986-1990.

CROP ACREAGE BASE

Crop acreage base for wheat and feed grains will be the average of the last 5 years planted and considered planted acreages.

Crop acreage base for upland cotton will be the average of the last 3 years planted and considered planted acreages unless the farm was not participating in the cotton program in both 1989 and 1990. Farms that did not participate in 1989 and 1990 will have the cotton base figured by the old method.

PERMITTED CROP ACREAGE

Participating crops planted will be limited to the base minus the ACR requirements. The only exception is when acres from other participating crop are flexed into the crop. This could allow the planted acres to exceed even the original base.

ADVANCE PAYMENTS

These payments have been authorized to be paid in cash. All signatures, information for payment limitation and conservation compliance for all counties must be present before the farm is eligible to be paid.

ACR (SET ASIDE)

ACR is figured as a percent of the base for each crop no matter how many acres of the crop is planted. This is different from past years. If you participate, the ACR is a percent of the base. (5% for cotton, 7.5% for sorghum, etc.)

There has been a change in the required cover crop on ACR for Borden County. Because Texas is considered an arid area, **NO COVER IS REQUIRED**. The County Committee still strongly recommends a cover, however, you are no longer required to plant one by June 1st. ACR must be maintained from weeds and erosion thru December 31, 1991. Vegetables, including peas, are still and **INELIGIBLE** cover on ACR and CU for Pay. Land planted to an agricultural commodity in 1 of the last 5 years is eligible for ACR or CU for pay. Minimum size and width requirements is 1 chain in width (66 feet) and contain at least 5 acres. Exceptions to this are: 4 row blanks in a normal, uniform patterns and entire fields or area between terraces (top to top).

AD-1026 CERTIFICATION

All producers participating in the 1991 annual farm program must file an AD-1026, "Highly Erodible Land and Wetland Conservation Certification" in their control county ASC office before the contract to participate can be approved, (advance payments can not be made until the contract is approved). This AD-1026 is also required for CRP, ACP, FCIC, Wool and Mohair, and FmHA loan participation.

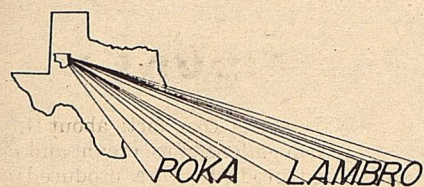
