## Senate overturns gas tax veto


#### Abstract

WASHINGTON (AP) - The Senate, following the lead of the House. today overrode President Carter veto and crushed his The vote was 68 -10, well above the two-thi majority needed to brush aside Carter's veto of a congressional measure repaaling the fee. - It was the first time a Democrati-controlled Congress has failed to sustain a Democratic president's veto since Harry S. Truman was overidden Carter vetoed the bill Thursday, saying the fee was needed to help conserve imported petroleum. But two hours later and with no debate, the House voted, 335-31, Today's Senate vote administered the final death blow. While either chamber of Congress can sustain a veto, two-third yotes in both houses are needed Argung unsuccessfully for the veto to be sustained Sen. Gary Hart. -C.Co., told the Senate that failure to reduce U.
