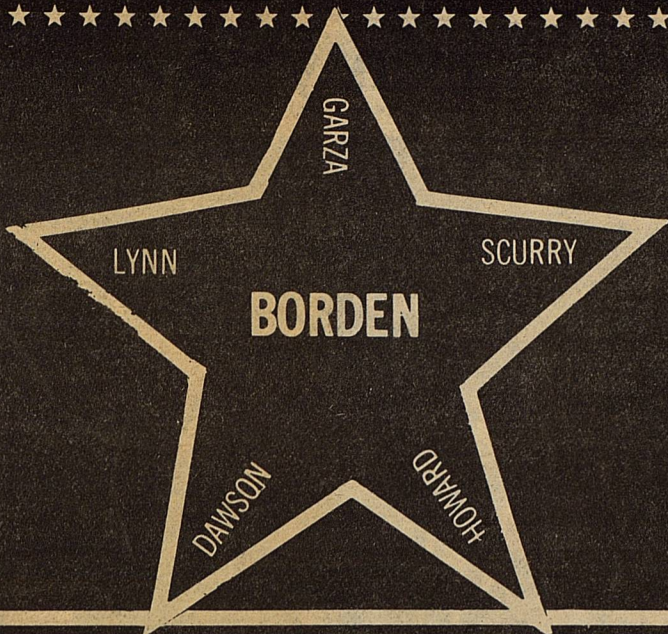

Show Sets New Record

Animals Average \$525

\$39,335.00 exchanged hands Saturday afternoon in the Borden County barn as the 1980 Junior Livestock Show and Sale came to a close. The overall show average for the sale animals was \$525. The total average in 1979 was \$378. Breaking it down, the steers averaged \$712, the lambs \$515 and the swine \$457.

Starting at 1:00 p.m., veteran auctioneer Monte Paxton asked for floor bids on the 75 animals to go through the sale ring that afternoon. W. C. Hart of Snyder was high bidder for the 43 lambs going for \$67, down \$1.00 from 1979. Twenty-two Barrows went to Tamco Company of Lubbock with their high bid of \$36.75, down \$17.25. Order buyer J. H. Davis of Tulia, Texas received the ten steers with his floor bid of \$69.50, up \$2.50.

Early on, it was thought that the Grand Champion steer shown by Joie Brummett brought top dollar when Key Cap Rock Gin and the First National Bank of Lamesa bid \$1,000 for the 1,285 pound champion. However, after heavy bidding for over three hours, the last animal to go through the ring brought \$1,025.00. This was a light weight cross lamb shown by Gerry Smith and bought by General Welding, E.P. Driver Insurance, Dr. Hank Thompson and Feagins Implement - all of Big Spring.

Everyone A Champion

With 294 animals being exhibited, the 1980 Borden County Jr. Livestock show was the largest in the associations 22 year history.

At 1:00 p.m. of Friday, February 22, the audience heard the friendly and familiar voice of E. L. Farmer as he announced the official opening of the two day show.

Beginning with the Swine, judge Paul Gross, District 1 county agent, had his work cut out for him as 94 animals were shown.

After much deliberation a 238 pound Heavy weight Cross was tapped as Grand Champion Barrow. This animal, bred by H. C. Gribble of Post, was raised and shown by Scott Jones.

A six year 4-H member, Scott had six other swine in the show. Scott is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Nolan Jones.

Doing real well as a third year 4-H member, Miss Julie Ridenour walked away with the Reserve Grand Champion Barrow. This was a Ridenour bred 249 lb. Duroc. Julie, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Fred Ridenour of Fluvanna, exhibited a total of ten swine with a first place light weight Duroc and first place light weight cross included.

Superintendent for the Barrow division was Banny Hancock, assisted in the ring by Randy Roemisch, Matt Farmer and Charles Green.

In an event almost as legendary as the swallows returning to Capistrani, the Nazareth Swiftettes return to Austin for their fourth straight year. The three time defending state champions did not make this trip without a little sweat however. The Borden County Lady Coyotes gave the Swiftettes all they could handle before falling 47-33 in the regional finals.

The game was much closer than the final score indicated. Nazareth rushed to a 16-7 lead at the end of the first quarter, connecting on 8 of 12 trips up the floor. That was enough pad to last Nazareth through the next two quarters as the Swiftettes scored on an amazing 18 of 33 possessions.

But in the fourth quarter,

Borden County's trapping defense started forcing turnovers and missed shots. Talley Griffin connected on a jumper at the beginning of the fourth quarter to make the score 33-27, then Karen Williams' jumper at the 5:40 mark made the score 33-29. With only 3:06 left in the game the Coyotes trailed only 35-29.

After that time, however, the Lady Coyotes had to begin fouling and the defending champs showed their poise and experience by connecting on 12 of 14 free throws in the final quarter.

Jana Edwards led the Coyotes with 11 points, Karen Williams and Talley Griffin 8 each, Jana Love, Gayla Newton, and Glynda Burkett 2 each. The Lady Coyotes, who ended the

season 31-3, shot 39 percent from the field and hit on 3 of 4 free throws. The Lady Coyotes were charged with 20 fouls while Nazareth was whistled 4 times, none in the 2nd half. The Swiftettes made 2 less field goals than Borden, but hit on 21 of 27 free throw attempts to take the win.

In a game that started out bad and got worse, Borden defeated Greenwood 44-41 in the semifinals. Neither team played as well as they were capable and even though the score was close throughout, the outcome was never in doubt. Talley Griffin scored 11 to lead Borden, Gayla Newton had 9, Jana Edwards 8, Janna Love 7, Glynda Burkett 6, and Karen Williams 3.

In the opening game of the tournament, Jana

Edwards displayed her offensive talents by dropping in 30 points against Ft. Hancock as the Lady Coyotes totally embarrassed the Mustangs 64-23. At After jumping to a 30-5 halftime lead, the Lady Coyotes coasted to victory. Behind Edward's 30 points came Talley Griffin with 12, Karen Williams 10, Jana Love, Gayla Newton, and Gena McLeroy 4 each.

The Borden County Lady Coyotes and Coach Larry Steele are to be commended and congratulated on an outstanding season and as the yell goes 'We Are Proud of You!'

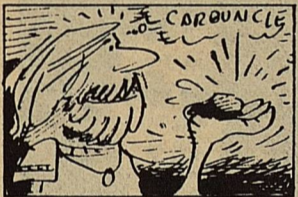
Girls Skin Westbrook - Qualify for Regional

The Borden Lady Coyotes jumped out to a 19-5 first quarter lead Tuesday night in Big Spring and Westbrook could never catch up as the Coyotes won 57-33. Borden completely outmanned and outclassed the smaller Wildcats from the very start. The win gave the Lady Coyotes a 30-2 record and a place in the Regional Tournament in Levelland.

Playing before a smaller crowd than the Klondike game, the Lady Coyotes used their size and outstanding team work to totally dominate both offense and defense. Racing out to a 37-14 halftime lead the Lady Coyotes used mainly the reserves the last half.

Although easily disposing of Westbrook, Borden did not have an outstanding statistical night. The Lady Coyotes hit on 42 percent of their field goal attempts and 55 percent of their free throws.

Jana Edwards again led Borden in scoring with 17 points, Karen Williams had 12, Talley Griffin 10, Janna Love 8, Gayla Newton 4, and Carla Jones, Glynda Burkett, and Lisa Smith 2 each.

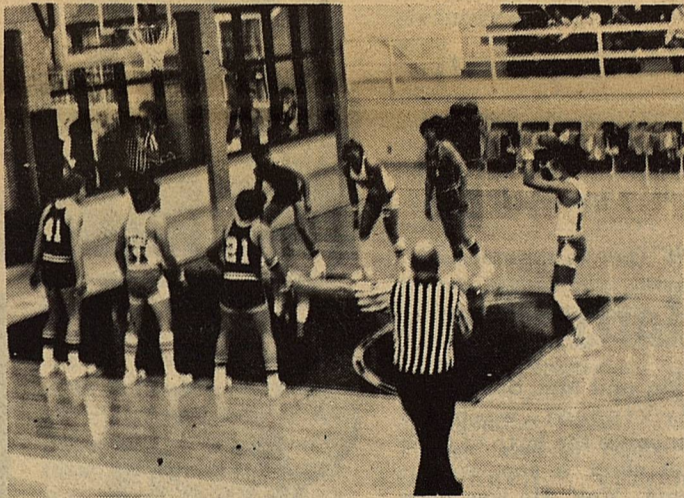

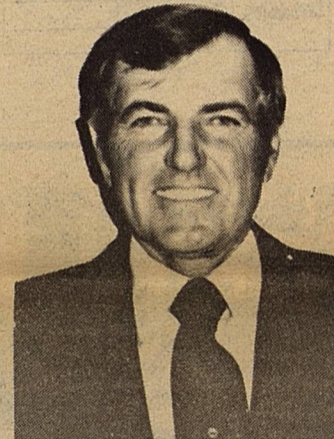



Borden County cotton producers and agribusiness men will elect a Businessman Director to Plains Cotton Growers, Inc. at a 7:30 p.m. meeting on Tuesday, March 4 in the Borden County High School meeting room, Gail.

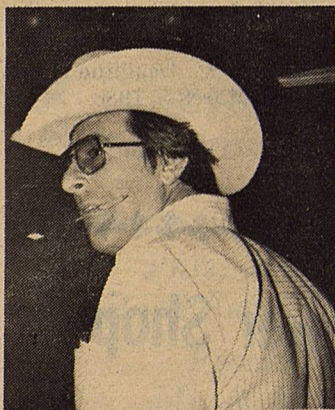

Saturday dawned another day as ten steers were paraded through the show ring.

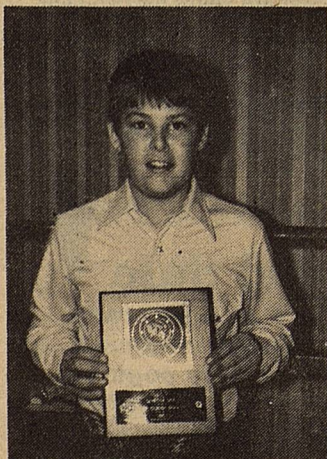

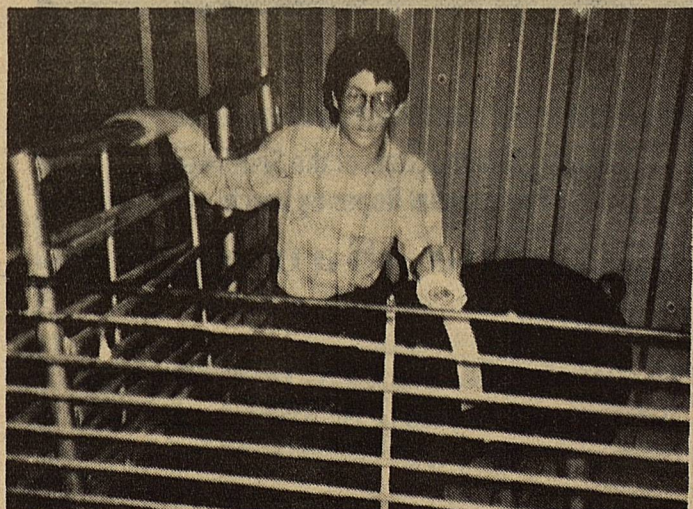
