## Johnson Is Not An Aspirant

Dallas—Sen. Lyndon Johnson (D-Tex) says the political handicappers rating him a likely bidder for the Democratic presidential nomination in 1960 are all wrong.

"I do not know who the candidate will be," the Senate majority leader told the Dallas News last night, "but I have every conviction a man could conceivably have, that it will not be me."

The News quoted him further as stating at his ranch near Stonewall that the Democrats will be able to pick a nominee from an abundance of candidates.

There has been speculation that Johnson's leadership in effecting passage of a compromise Civil Rights Bill and other measures might make him a major contender at the 1960 Democratic convention.

The News quoted him as declaring, however, that he would not be a favorite son candidate, as was the case at last year's national convention.

"I have made it absolutely clear both in public and in private that I do not seek the nomination," Johnson told the newspaper.

"There are absolutely no reservations in my mind on that question. And I am not leaving the door open for any last-minute changes in attitude."

## LAW CITED ON SALE OF PISTOLS IN TEXAS

Following is the report of the Lynn County Grand Jury concerning the sale of pistols—

"During the course of our investigation, the Grand Jury has become alarmed at the indiscriminate sale of pistols to unauthorized persons.

Merchants are advised that strict compliance with all requirements of the law concerning dealers will be demanded. Article 489a of the Penal Code provides that no person may purchase a pistol unless he has secured a certificate of good character from a Justice of the Peace, County Judge or District Judge in the county of his or her residence. Strict adherence to this requirement will be expected.

Merchants are advised to familiarize themselves with certain provisions concerning the licensing of dealers in pistols and records required by law.

Due to the good crop prospects, a great influx of people is expected in our county this fall and the Grand Jury respectfully solicits the cooperation of all merchants and citizens in regard to this matter and expects to continue its investigation of this matter at its next meeting.

Attention is also directed to a new act by the legislature making it unlawful to carry certain types of knives in addition to others already prohibited.

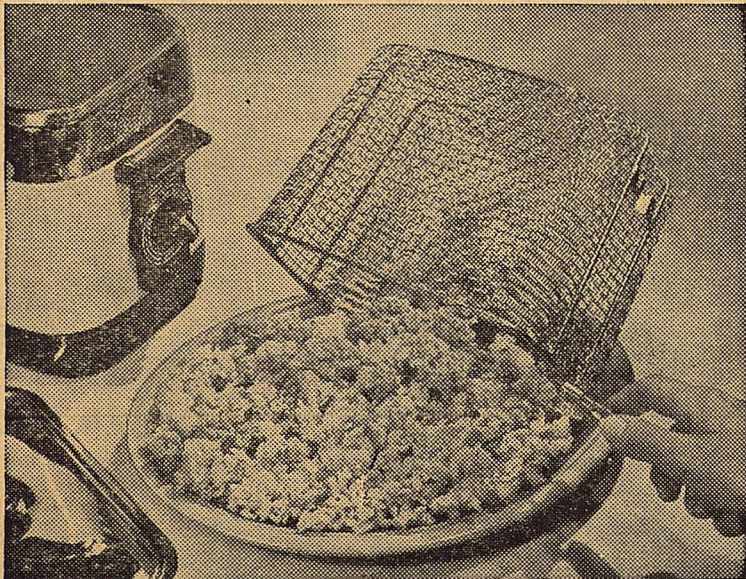

**INGREDIENTS:**

Cooled cooked rice  
Frying fat or frying oil

**METHOD:** If you don't have cooked rice in your refrigerator ready to use, put 1 cup of uncooked rice, 2 cups of cold water and 1 teaspoon of salt into a two-quart saucepan and bring to a vigorous boil. Turn heat as low as possible. Cover saucepan with lid and leave over this low

heat for 14 minutes. Do not remove lid nor stir rice while it is cooking. Turn off heat, remove lid, and allow steam to escape as the rice cools.

Heat frying fat or oil in a deep kettle, saucepan or in an electric or gas deep fat fryer. Place 2 serving spoons of cooked rice (more if large container is used) in a fine mesh basket, kitchen strainer or sieve. Fry in deep fat (375° F.) until a light brown, about 2½ minutes. Remove from deep fat and drain fried rice on absorbent paper.

The rice must be fried in a basket of FINE MESH. An inexpensive kitchen strainer or sieve of fine mesh is ideal. The handle may be bent to allow the strainer to be easily lowered into the deep fat.

Fried Rice is delicious as a party-snack food. It is something entirely new and different served with chow mein, chop suey, creamed meats, vegetables, meat sauces or gravy. It stays crunchy crisp even when covered with gravy. A new kind of candy is made by dipping clusters of fried rice into or pouring melted dipping chocolate over the fried rice. A fried rice brittle is made by pouring the syrup used for making peanut brittle over the fried rice and allowing the hot syrup to cool.

## Hypnosis May Solve Special Anesthetic Needs

CHICAGO — Hypnosis, not now recommended for general use as an anesthetic, may solve some special anesthetic problems, according to three Dallas researchers who have used it in several unusual cases.

They reported using hypnosis for delivery of a baby when the mother was a polio victim, for a dental procedure in a woman sensitive to chemical anesthetics, and in three other special cases. They reported their cases in the Journal of the American Medical Association.

They said they have been investigating hypnosis for anesthesia for three years, and have found it useful under these special conditions:

- 1) when a chemical anesthesia or depressants may be dangerous because of respiratory or heart disease;
- 2) when a patient is sensitive to regular chemical agents;
- 3) when repeated use of anesthetics weakens a patient who is already physically disturbed;
- 4) among patients whose fear general anesthesia is so great it presents serious risks;
- 5) when the cooperation of the patient may be needed during surgery; and
- 6) when the procedure may be so lengthy that the general anesthesia may be too weakening.

Use of hypnosis presented no difficulty in the delivery of a pregnant woman suffering polio, or in several dental procedures, lasting about two hours each—in a woman who suffered swelling of the face and body, hives, and nausea from general anesthesia.

## Bows Were Better Than Early Musket

WASHINGTON — The American Revolution might have been fought — on the side of the colonies — with bows and arrows.

They still were better weapons, in some respects, than the available muskets of the day—as emphasized by Benjamin Franklin in a 1776 letter to Gen. Charles Lee, who then was engaged in fortifying the port of New York:

"These were good weapons, not lightly laid aside: Because a man may shoot as truly with a bow as with a common musket. He can discharge four arrows in the time

of charging a musket. His own side. A flight of arrows coming upon them terribly disturbs the enemies attention. An arrow striking in any part of a man puts him hors-du-bombat till it is extracted. Bows and arrows are more easily provided everywhere than muskets and ammunition."

This is cited by Col. Berkeley R. Lewis, of the Frankfort Arsenal, Philadelphia, in a comprehensive treatise on small arms and ammunition, especially as used in the United States military service.

## Marble Games Sure Sign of True Spring

WASHINGTON—It hardly seems like spring until small fry knuckle down to a game of ringer.

This, of course, is the traditional game played with marbles. Depending on local jargon, the player takes a highly prized shooter, taw glassie, or stoney to knock common marbles—commies, mibs, or ducks—from the ring. Knuckles must touch the ground.

Time obscures the origin of marbles. Youngsters in ancient Egypt, Greece, and Rome tawed just as purposefully as today's boys and girls in T shirts and blue jeans. The Latin expression *relinquere nuce*—in effect, "putting away childish things"—probably refers to a form of marbles that Roman children played with nuts.

In years gone by, the small spheres of many colors have been made of many substances: marble chips (hence the game's name); alabaster (alleys); prettily banded agate (aggies); painted and glazed clay (clayeys); and colored glass.

## Exhibit Tells Story Of Early Telephones

WASHINGTON—An exhibit telling the story of the telephone has been opened at the Smithsonian Institution.

Planned by the staff of the Institution and Bell Telephone Laboratories, the exhibit was presented by the telephone industries of the United States. Beginning with the "Galvanic music" with which Charles G. Page of Massachusetts startled the learned world in 1837 the story is carried through the most recent applications to telephony of electronic devices.
