## Texas Climate Good Says Hobby

Now that the history books are closed on 1981, I would like to join the people of Texas in looking ahead to the new year.

This past year has been one of uncertainty for most Texans.

We have seen inflation, high interest rates, poor housing markets, conflict and danger overseas, and general economic unrest. Even though these issues affect each of us directly in our everyday lives, most are national concerns impacted in one way or another by the federal government.

In our Texas government, we have a clearer picture and cause for considerable

optimism. We have gone through another session of the Texas Legislature without any state tax increase. We have lived through a decade of no tax increases while keeping the spending policies of this state within the confines of the income to the state treasury.

The business climate in Texas has protected our citizens to some extent from higher unemployment which has been a severe problem in other parts of the nation. A good business climate means jobs and payrolls to the people of Texas. It must be protected if Texas is to fulfill its

Our triumphs have been many.

Again, the state government has lived within its income. Yet it is highly significant that 46 states levy higher taxes, and Texas has still held the line against a state income tax.

"I appreciate the support and cooperation given me in

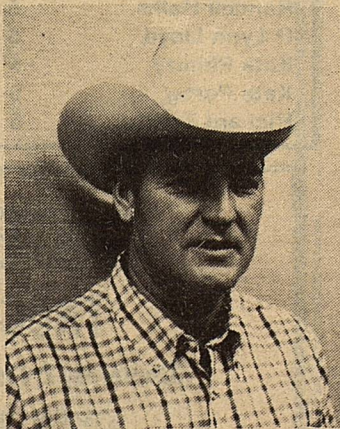

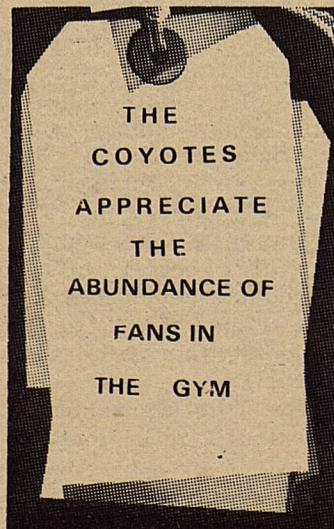

## COYOTES SLIP BY GRADY

The Borden Coyote boys staged a last quarter rally to beat the Grady Wildcats 42-34 in Gail Friday. The Coyotes trailed by as much as 12 points in the third quarter before outscoring the Wildcats 16-4 in the final quarter.

Jym Rinehart led all scorers with 14 and Doug Love followed closely with 13. The Coyotes could not find the range the first half as they could only hit 18 percent of their field goal attempts and 4 of 9 from the

free throw line. They trailed 19-14 at the half. The second half turned out better for the Coyotes as they shot 53 percent from the field.

Others scoring for the Coyotes were: Kevin Telchik 8, Sam Williams 3, Charles LaRue and Jeff Martin 2 each.

The Coyotes are 2-2 in district and play Wellman at Wellman Tuesday and then Union at home on Thursday.

## JR COYOTES LOSE CLOSE ONE

The game Monday between the Borden Junior Coyote boys and the Sands Mustangs was played in two different parts. Sands won the first and last quarters and the Coyotes won the second and third quarters with the final result being a 32-30 loss for the Coyotes. The Coyotes

led 28-23 going into the fourth quarter, but could only manage two points as Sands scored 9.

Chris Cooley paced the Coyote attack scoring 22 and Bric Turner added 8. The Junior Coyotes record in district is 2-3 and 4-6 for the season. The next game is in Grady, Monday night.

## School Board Meeting

The Board of Trustees for the Borden County Independent School district met in a regular session on Monday, January 18, at 8:00 p.m. Board President Ralph Miller presided over the meeting. After routine business of minutes and bills, the Board called a School Board election on April 3, 1982 for the purpose of electing two (2) School Board members. (The terms of Bob Dyess and Bill Phinizy expire on April 3).

The contract of Superintendent James McLeroy was renewed and extended through the 1984-1985 school year. A commendation was given by the Board for a job well-done. Action taken on the Superintendent's contract was by unanimous vote.

The Superintendent gave a financial report and a personnel report. Also attendance was reported at 229.

The Board dismissed at 9:30 p.m.

## BORDEN TAKES TWO WINS

A combination of balanced scoring with a pressuring half court defense forcing 26 Loop turnovers, enabled the Lady Coyotes to gain a 57-28 win over the host Longhorns Tuesday night, after a slow start, a 14-11 first quarter lead. Borden outscored their opponents 12-3 the second quarter and increased their lead to 40-20 going into the last quarter. Nine players scored for the Coyotes, now 11-7 on the year and 2-2 in district play, with Kelly Williams leading with 10 points. She was followed by Gena McLeroy and Roxie Wolf with 8, Lisa Smith, Teresa Wimberly, and Stephanie Herring with 6 each, Shellie Peterson 5, and Shawna Vaughn and

Becky Massingill with 4 each.

Friday night the Lady Coyotes once again displayed a balanced attack with a 40-25 win over visiting Grady. A 25-4 half-time lead was too much for the Wildcats to overcome as 13 players seeing action with 10 hitting in the scoring column. Leading the was was Roxie Wolf with 12 points followed by Lisa Smith with 6, Gena McLeroy 5, Kelly Williams and Shellie Peterson each had 4, Teresa Wimberly, Stephanie Herring, Shawna Vaughn, and Tanya Hollis had 2 each, and Becky Massingill had 1. Season record for the Coyotes is now 12-7 and district record 3-2 the first half.

## EASTER SEAL BASKETBALL SHOOTOUT

University of Texas Coach Abe Lemons is again serving as Honorary Chairman of the 1982 Easter Seal Basketball Shoot-Out, which is 'full steam ahead' for the month of January throughout Texas. The fund-raising event, which benefits programs for Texans with disabilities, raised over \$70,000 under Lemons' leadership in 1981. Each of the 1600 junior high and high school students shot baskets for a 3-minute time period, then collected pledges for the number of baskets made.

In this year's Basketball Shoot-Out which is well underway in Gail, Coach Maxwell will be conducting this fund-raising project for Easter Seals. Field Representative Cecelia Myers feels this year will even be a bigger success. Money is used by Easter

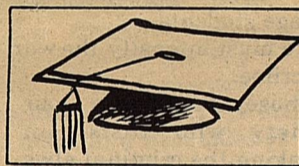

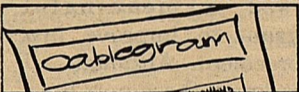

Take equal parts of religious, social and cultural differences, add economic and territorial conflicts, mix in the outrage of millions of uprooted, homeless Arabs, top off with Isreal's aggression and territorial expansion and what do you get?-the formula for an explosive mixture that could blow us all into the next world war. The Middle East today, with two-thirds of the world's petroleum reserved, fits to perfection the historical type description of a powder keg.

The United States, the principal creator of this concoction, keeps it stirred and fresh by constantly adding blind, unconditional economic and military support of Isreal, regardless of Zionist territorial conquests and the bombing-with American airplanes-of power plants or villages considered hostile or threatening to Isreal's security. What does the United States receive in return for annual gifts, loans and military supplies in the billions of dollars, the most extravagant expenditure from its foreign aid budget? What is the Zionist attitude toward Israel's sponsor, benefactor and protector? Lately it is defiance, ingratitude and contempt.

The state of Israel was created out of Palestinian territory by the United Nations, under pressure from President Harry Truman to find a refuge for

homeless European Jews. (Native Palestinian Jews were already living there in peace.) Since birth the Zionist state has survived only because of massive, continuous transfusions of military and economic aid supplied by American taxpayers. There is no announced plan to reduce or end this burden on the taxpayer or to set a limit on loans to this delinquent borrower. What is the result of all this American help? For example, what was the reaction to President Reagan's mild reproach of Israel for the annexation of Syrian territory, the Golan heights? What right, asked Begin, did President Reagan have to question or pass judgement on Israel's actions or suggest that Israel should be punished? One answer is that the United States, having created, nurtured, fostered and protected this foreign state is held by the world responsible for its behavior, particularly when it involves the use of American military weapons. Perhaps these new developments in American-Zionist relations stir up some additional disturbing questions that American citizens should ask their government.

Is it not the duty of the United States to ensure that Israel does not use American military ordnance for territorial expansion? What is the United States going to do if it discovers that Israel is making an atomic bomb? Israel, through its supporters, has habitually threatened American politicians with its control over American Jewish voters and financial contributors-is it not time for America's elected representatives to demonstrate their integrity, independence and

immunity from thistype of foreign influence and coercion? Considering that there are trade sanctions and diplomatic reprisals in effect against South Africa because of its racist, segregationist government, what should be done about the anti-Arab racist policies of the government of Israel?

Begin, the terrorist, with a record of murdering prisoners, doesn't like our attitude. Fine, Mr. Begin, maybe you ought to try hooking it on your own for a while-at least long enough for you to learn a little respect and for us to get some answers to some important question.

in capital investment in manufacturing, and we have added more manufacturing jobs in the last ten years than any other state.

The technical name for a young crow is "simp."



Have you ever heard of "Herman"? It is a unique yeast bread recipe that must be fed and grows. The "Herman" story and recipe follow, along with some ways to use "Herman".

The unique aspect of "Herman" is his chain letter method of operation. Friends give 1 cup of "Herman" to other friends, along with specific directions for "feeding" him. One of the main reasons for this widespread appeal is that he's simple to use and good tasting.

The starter for "herman" may stay in the refrigerator for two or three weeks without feeding-but no longer, or you will have to give him a funeral. But if you want to keep him going, and don't have time to use him, keep the starter alive by dividing and feeding. Never get down to less than one cup of this interesting recipe.

#### "HERMAN"

- 2 cups flour
- 1-4 cup sugar
- 2 cups warm water
- 1 envelope yeast

Mix in a plastic or glass container, cover and let stand overnight in a warm place. Cover should not be air-tight. Next day, cover and refrigerate, but stir daily. Five days later, measure out one cup of "Herman" for yourself, giving the rest to a friend. "Herman" must now be fed.

#### CARE AND FEEDING OF "HERMAN"

- 1 cup flour
- 1 cup milk
- 1-2 cup sugar

Stir these ingredients into one cup of "Herman". Keep refrigerated in a galss or plastic bowl and keep covered. Stir every day. On the fifth day, feed "Herman" again as above.

On the tenth day: Measure one cup of "Herman" to give away.

Because it has grown, you should also have enough to bake the coffee cake or other recipe and still have one cup left to start the process all over again.

#### "HERMAN" COFFEE CAKE

- 2 cups "Herman"
- 2 cups flour
- 1 cup sugar
- 2 eggs
- 3-4 cup milk
- 2-3 cup oil
- 1-2 t. baking soda
- 2 t. baking powder
- 1-2 t. cinnamon
- 1-2 t. salt
- 1 cup salt
- 1 cup chopped nuts
- 1 cup raisins

Mix at medium speed the following: "Herman", flour, sugar, eggs, milk, oil, soda, baking powder, cinnamon, and salt. Stir in nuts and raisins. Pour into a greased and floured 9" x 13" pan. Mix topping and sprinkle over the unbaked coffee cake. Bake at 350 degrees for 50 minutes.

#### TOPPING

- 1 T. cinnamon
- 1-4 cup soft margarine
- 1 T. flour
- 1 cup brown sugar

Blend together with a pastry blender.

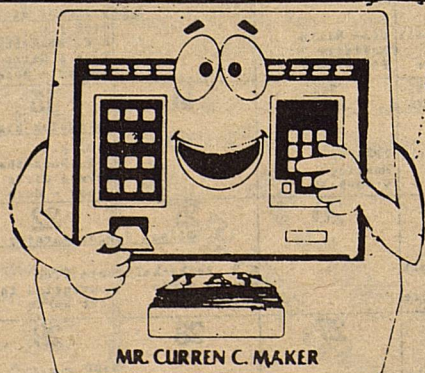

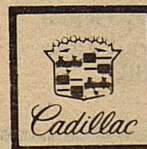

# ASCS News

## ACP SIGNUP UNDERWAY

The sign-up period for agricultural conservation program practices is currently underway at the local office of the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service. Applications will be accepted through February 1, 1982.

We ask farmers to sign up as soon as possible because their practices must be approved by the county committee before the work can begin. Farmers who start conservation practices before approval are ineligible for cost-shares.

Program funds are available for SL-a Establishment of Permanent Vegetative Cover, SL-2a Improving Permanent Vegetative Cover, SL-2h-Control of Competitive Shrubs, SL-4-Constructing Terrace Systems, SL-6-Constructing Wells, Pipelines, Storage Facilities and Earthen Tanks for Livestock Water. These practices will provide enduring solutions to the problems of farmland being a source of agricultural pollution or land affected by wind or water erosion.

The agency encourages farmers to correct soil and water conservation problems, and where needed, assists them with the cost of applying conservation practices. The ACP is a joint effort by farmers and the Government to conserve soil and water, and to reduce agricultural pollution.

## CCP-182 REPORT OF PAYMENT TO PRODUCERS

Payments made to farmers & ranchers during 1981 are reported to the Internal Revenue Service by the USDA-ASCS Field Office in Kansas City.

This notice is to advise producers that form CCC-182, Report of Payment to Producers, has been redesigned and will be mailed during the last two weeks in January, 1982.

The new form will group

payments by program using codes 1 through 22. For example: ACP payments will be coded number 1. If there is any question concerning these statements, producers should contact the ASCS Office.

## 1981 LATE FILED CERTIFICATION OF PROGRAM CROPS

Producers who failed to report wheat, barley, grain sorghum, corn and cotton acreages for the 1981 crop year have an opportunity to do so by February 5, 1982. This applies to crops planted for harvest in 1981, and does not apply to wheat planted for harvest in the fall of 1981. Producers must pay the cost of verifying the acreages and must have documented evidence of the existence of the crop. If you reported your 1981 crop acreage disregard this announcement; if you didn't report, it would be beneficial to come in and do so.

## ACREAGE REPORT FOR OATS

Planted acreage reports for oats for 1980 and 1981 crop years are needed so that producers will be eligible to participate in the 1982 farm programs. If you planted oats during either of these two years, you need to report the number of acres planted and the crop use (hay, grain, grazing, etc.) by February 5, 1982.

## WOOL AND MOHAIR

Producers are reminded to bring sales documents of wool and unshorn lambs, and mohair sales made during 1981 to qualify for an incentive payment by January 31, 1982.

All programs administered by Borden County ASCS Office are available to any eligible person, regardless of race, color, creed, sex, or national origin.

## WINDBREAKS CONSERVE ENERGY

Rising energy costs have made windbreak plantings real assets to rural farm families.

Fringe benefits of windbreaks can be protection for cattle and a refuge for birds and other wildlife.

A well-designed windbreak will reduce wind speed, prevent drifting snow and lower heating bills. Even a small windbreak can make outdoor living and working conditions more bearable during the winter.

The location of the windbreaks is the key to their effectiveness. Evergreen windbarriers on the north and west sides of the house can cut 10 to 40 percent off winter fuel bills. Junipers and pines provide the most protection.

Windbreaks should be planted four to six times the height of the windbreak away from the house. I recommend growing species that will mature to about one to one-and-a-half times the height of the house. Large trees should be located 100 to 150 feet from the north or west side of the house and roads to prevent snow drifts.

For maximum protection, three to six rows of trees are needed on farmsteads. Six to eight-foot spacings are appropriate for most evergreen plants used for windbreaks.

Trees for windbreaks are available from the Texas Forest Service and should be planted in late winter or early spring.

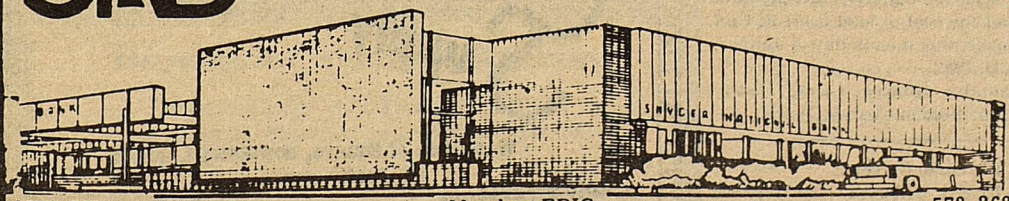

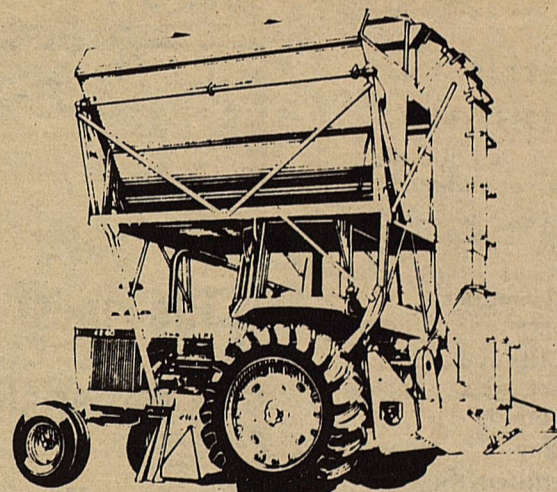
