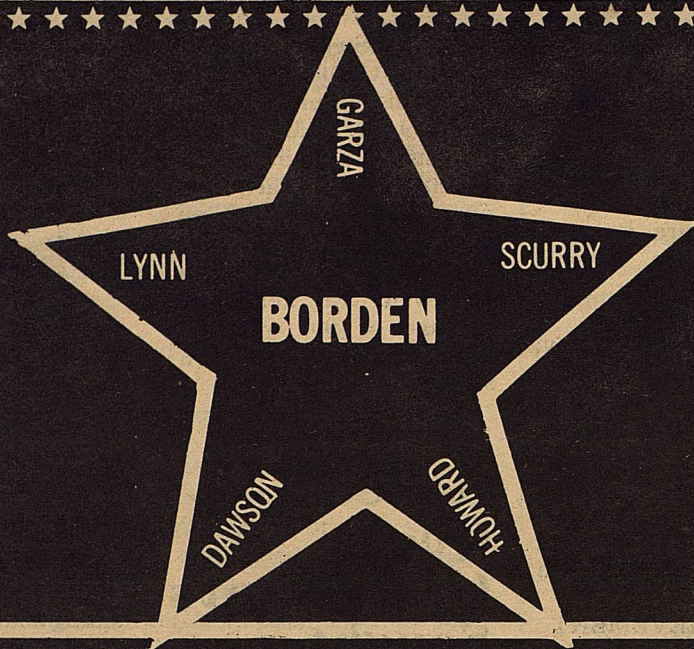

## Stephanie Stephens to attend Bluebonnet Girls' State

Stephanie Stephens, 17 year old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Steve Stephens, Route 1, O'Donnell, has been selected to attend the 1982 session of Bluebonnet Girls' State to be held June 15-25 at Texas Lutheran College in Seguin. This year 560 girls from across the state will be privileged to attend this largest extracurricular activity for girls in the state. It is sponsored by the American Legion Auxiliary as a public service to the community, state, and nation. Stephanie will be sponsored by Unit 355 of the American Legion Auxiliary.

The purpose of Girls' State is to educate young women in the duties, privileges, rights, and responsibilities of American citizenship. It is a mythical 51st state where the citizens organize their own city, county, and state

governments. They choose officials in accordance with regular election procedures. They learn the duties of the various city, county, and state offices. They introduce and debate their own bills in the legislature. Law enforcement agencies and courts are also put into use by the citizens of Girls' State. In general, the girls learn to do by doing.

It is a non partisan program, but is divided into two political parties to be as near to a replica of our democratic form of government as possible. Each girl is assigned to a party and to either the House of Representatives or the Senate upon arrival at Girls' State. One day while there, they are taken to the capitol in Austin where each girl functions in the capacity of the office to which she was elected or in her respective legislative body. The girls who have been elected to state offices are inaugurated in the rotunda of the capitol. This proves to be a very worthwhile program of citizenship and Americanism.

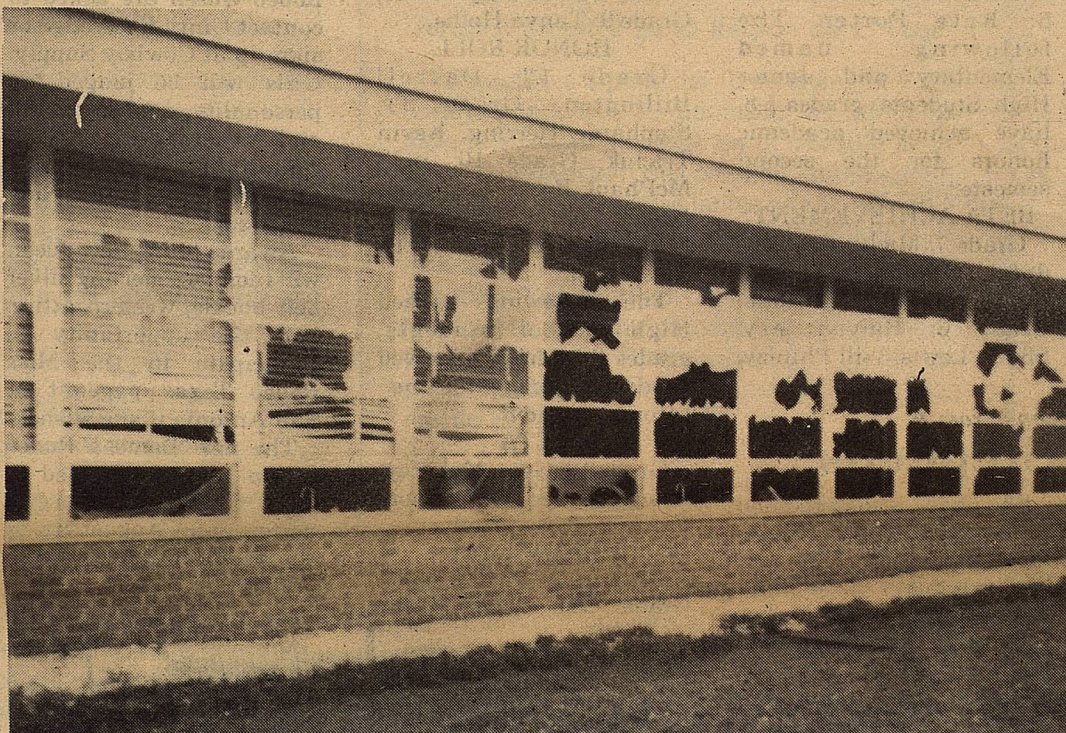
Girls attending must have just completed their junior year in high school. They are selected on merits of character and potential leadership as well as scholastic achievement.

Stephanie will be a senior at Borden County High School in Gail this fall, where she is the feature twirler for the Coyote Band. She has been a past class officer, County 4-H Gold Star Girl, and has participated in various FHA projects. She maintains an A average and has participated in UIL in both piano and literature.

## High winds, hail ravage Borden County buildings, homes, crops

Thunderstorms invaded Borden County late Friday afternoon causing extensive damage to homes, automobiles, businesses, crops, and the Borden County school and courthouse.

High winds, up to soft ball size hail and heavy rains took a heavy toll on windows in Gail.

It (the storm) knocked out nearly all windows in Gail from the heavy hail", said Borden County Sheriff Norman Sneed of the fierce thunderstorm that struck the area. A tornado reportedly touched down about two miles west of town, but no damage was reported.

Power was knocked out around 3:00 a.m. Saturday morning during the second

storm attack in which the town received estimate of 4 1/2 inches of heavy rain. Power was restored around 10:00 a.m. Saturday.

Sneed said hail and winds estimated at 75 mph combined for the damage in Borden County. Because hail had broken all the rain gauges in town rainfall measurements were estimated.

Observers of the debris said the scene fit the pattern of tornado damage, but the weather service never confirmed that a twister struck the town.

Farmers in the area whose crops were destroyed due to the storms have only one week to replant cotton according to Jerry Stone, ASCS director for Borden County. Heavy rainfall left

all the fields soaked making the drying process slow.

Monday's sunshine and 90 degree weather was a welcomed sight to the many homeowners with wet carpet and furniture. Roofing companies, insurance adjustors, glass repair and general clean up crews were a familiar sight Monday morning around the town.

A total dollar estimate has not been made however some homeowners have been told it will be as long as three weeks before damages can be estimated and adjustments made.

With June 21 being the first day of summer it is hoped by all that we had our share of spring time thunderstorms during the last days of the season.

## Notice of Application For Oil and Gas Waste Disposal Well Permit

RKP, Inc., P.O. Box 50277, Midland, Texas 79701 has applied to the Railroad Commission of Texas for a permit to dispose of produced salt water or other oil and gas waste by well injection into a porous formation not productive of oil or gas.

The applicant proposes to dispose of oil and gas waste into the Various formation in the Porter A, Well Number 1. The proposed disposal well is located 1 1/2 miles Northeast of Vealmoor in the Clara Good Field, in Borden County. The waste water will be injected into strata in the subsurface depth interval from 3200' to 8310' feet.

LEGAL AUTHORITY: Chapter of the Texas Water Code, as amended, Title 3 of the Natural Resources Code, as amended, and the Statewide Rules of the Oil and Gas Division of the Railroad Commission of Texas.

Requests for a public hearing from persons who can show they are adversely affected, or requests for further information concerning any aspect of the application should be submitted in writing, within fifteen days of publication, to the Underground Injection Control Section, Oil and Gas Division, Railroad Commission of Texas, Drawer 12967, Capitol Station, Austin, Texas 78711 (Telephone 512-445-1373).

## Public Notice

Southwestern Bell, in accordance with the rules of the Public Utility Commission of Texas, hereby gives notice of the company's intent to implement a new schedule of telephone rates in Texas, effective July 27, 1982, unless otherwise determined by the Commission.

It is expected that the requested rate schedule will furnish a 13.4 percent increase in the company's intrastate revenues.

A complete copy of the new rate schedule is on file with the Public Utility Commission at Austin, Texas, and with each affected municipality served by Southwestern Bell, and is available for inspection in each of the company's public business offices in Texas. The Commission staff has contended in the past that all rates are subject to change as a result of Southwestern Bell's rate application.

### Notice to El Paso Area Customers

Effective January 1, 1982, Southwestern Bell adopted the Mountain States tariffs in effect for El Paso County. Southwestern Bell proposes to merge the separate El Paso tariffs with its tariffs applicable to the rest of Texas. The resulting new rate schedule is on file with the PUC and the El Paso area municipalities served by Southwestern Bell, and is available for inspection at our El Paso business office.

### Notice to Customers of Other Telephone Companies

The filing includes, but is not limited to, proposals to increase rates for interexchange private line and foreign exchange (FX) service. Changes in such rates would also affect customers of other telephone companies because such companies provide interexchange private line and foreign exchange service in accordance with rates specified in Southwestern Bell's tariffs. While Southwestern Bell has proposed no increase in long distance rates, any change in those rates would also affect customers of other telephone companies.

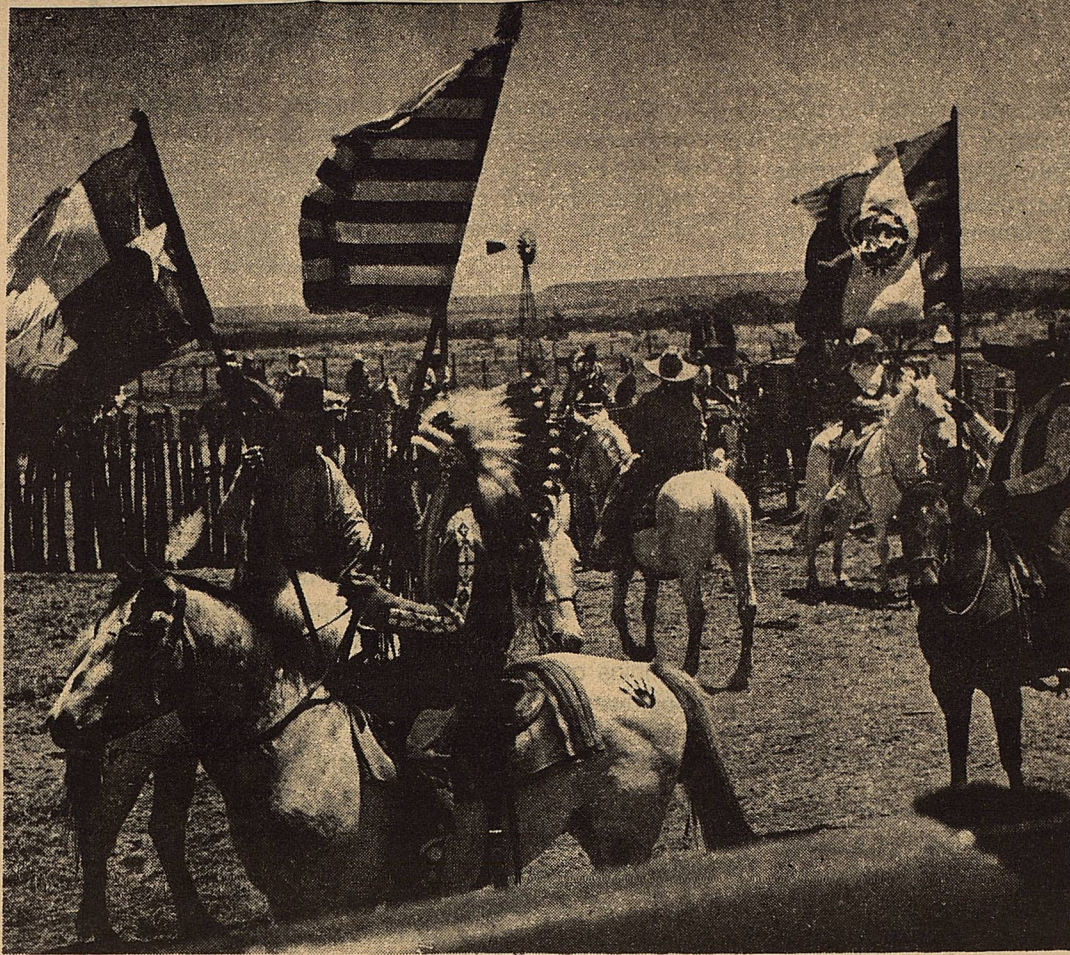

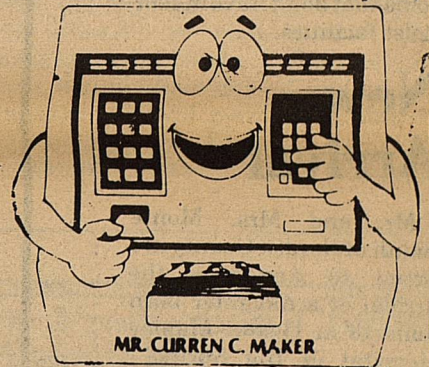
