ASCS Year End Report Focuses On Programs

To close out 1987, Danny Noble, County Executive Director of the ASCS, has just released his final report for the year.

This release stated it would be starting out with a minor correction:

CORRECTION TO NOVEMBER NEWSLETTER
We stated that CU acres designated for planted and considered planted history may not exceed 35 percent of the permitted acreage for the crop in 1988. This should not be CU acres, it should be ONPC (Other Non-Program Crops.)

We also stated that: the bottom line is, you will lose some history credit if you plant less than 65 percent of your permitted acreage. This statement is not true, disregard.

Chief, Judge, Sheriff At 'Odds' On Violators Assessed Jail Time

For some time, a controversy appears to have been brewing between Bailey County Sheriff Bob Henderson, Muleshoe City Police Chief Wayne Holmes, and Municipal Judge Linda Huckaby -- and the controversy is over the sheriff refusing to jail traffic violators who have been ordered to jail by the Municipal Judge.

It all surfaced on Wednesday, December 9, when Sgt. Julian Dominguez arrested a man who had been sought for 'Failure To Appear' in answer to traffic citations. The man had been sought since 1985, according to Sgt. Dominguez.

Sgt. Dominguez arrested the man, and took him before Judge

Huckaby, who ordered him to jail to 'lay out the fines' as he said he either could not, or would not pay the fines.

According to a report found on the 'media board' at the Muleshoe City Police Department and dated December 9, 1987, Sgt. Dominguez said in part:

"...I then handed a copy of (deleted) warrant and the Judges' order to the jailer, Jan Pierce. Mrs. Pierce then told me that she had to check with Sheriff Henderson. She went into his office and he came out talking loud and telling me that he was not going to take prisoners on traffic violations. I told him that he had been arraigned in front of the City Judge and he said that he did not care. He said that he had already talked to Wayne Chief (Holmes) about it and I could take the prisoner with me and baby sit him at the Police Dept. I explained to him that I had a warrant and he again said that he would not take the prisoner. Sheriff Henderson was red faced and appeared to be very angry because I brought the prisoner in there on a warrant. Jan Pierce witnessed the incident of the Sheriff refusing the prisoner. (deleted) does not speak English so I translated to him what the Sheriff had said. (deleted) then left the Sheriff's Office.

"The Sheriff told me that until the City Judge settled down and the City Officers stopped writing everything that moved, that he would not take any more prisoners on traffic violations."

Thursday morning, *The Journal* attempted to talk to Sheriff Henderson about the incident, and his response was: "Don't worry about it. It's just a little something between the Chief and me."

In questioning Judge Huckaby about fining practices. She said that when she became Municipal Judge 10 years ago, she contacted all area towns and cities, and drew up a 'standard'

fine list. All the fines are the same for everybody, she explained, and she makes no difference when she is assessing

Commemorative Pewter Buckle Now On Sale

One Candidate Files To Date For Re-Election

At presstime, only one candidate had filed for an office in Bailey County, according to Bailey County Democratic Chairman Kay Graves.

R.L. Scott, incumbent, filed his intention to seek the office of Constable, Precinct One, for another term.

Also, other offices include Bailey County Sheriff; Bailey County Attorney; Bailey County Tax Assessor; Commissioner, Precinct Three; and Constables for Precinct One and Three.

Candidates will have until Monday, January 4, to file for office.

This year, the election will be on 'Super Tuesday' which is March 8. The primary election was formerly in May.

Partial Thaw On Friday Brings Wrecks And Falls

It was snow -- snow -- snow all week throughout the area, with a gradual thawing beginning by early Friday afternoon.

After getting a real good grip on the area last weekend, and continuing through Sunday, Sunday night and Monday, with constant snow, the area was briefly paralyzed on Monday morning.

School was dismissed in Muleshoe, along with other Area schools, for both Monday and Tuesday, and for the rest of the week, before dismissed for Christmas holidays, school started an hour later each morning, with buses running on the payment, only.

Surprised local and area residents saw lightning and heard booming thunder shortly after 10 p.m. Friday night, when a 'spring-like' thunderstorm moved through the area.

Around 3:30 a.m. Saturday, a second thunderstorm slammed into the area, with a total of .51 in rain being recorded.

Lightning and thunder moved out of the area, and by Saturday morning, the sky was mostly clear, and the sun was shining.

National Weather Service had predicted additional rain for Monday.

For the first five days of the very wet, icy weather, no one was reported to be injured from falling down on ice, but that all changed on Friday, when people

got braver and paid the consequences.

By early Friday afternoon, one local woman had been taken by ambulance to a local doctor's office for treatment after being injured in a fall in her yard -- and officers from the Muleshoe

Hot Check Writers

Municipal Judge Linda Huckaby and MPD Detective Sgt. Julian Dominguez, have delivered a joint letter to Muleshoe business concerns about the Muleshoe Bad Check Policy and Procedures.

According to the letter, "Checks to be filed must contain Driver's License number or other number of Positive Identification and a current address. The clerk (at the business) should initial the check as an identification process."


Secondly, "Notification must have been made of the returned check by Certified or Registered Mail with (return) receipt requested.

Then, at least fifteen (15) days after they receive notification of the returned check, the business owner/manager is asked to take the check and receipt to the Municipal Judge to present the case.

Judge Huckaby's office hours are Monday-Friday, 9 a.m.-12 noon at the Muleshoe City Hall.

"We ask that you keep in mind that we are not a Collection Agency," said the officials, "and that you are filing a Criminal Complaint against these people.

"Each case will be handled according to the laws of the State of Texas and restitution is not an automatic process."







GEM STATE SKILLET BREAD
1 pkg. (12 oz.) corn muffin mix; 1 C. dehydrated instant potato flakes; 1 C. milk; 1/2 C. water; 2 eggs, lightly beaten; 1 C. chopped pepperoni (about 1/2 pound); 1 1/2 Tbsp. salad oil.

In large bowl combine corn muffin mix and potato flakes; make a well in the center. In small bowl beat together milk, water and eggs; pour into well and stir just to combine. Stir in pepperoni. In 10-inch skillet, heat oil over low heat. Pour in cornbread mixture. Cover. Cook 25 to 35 minutes or until

cornbread is firm in the center. Cool 5 minutes. To serve, cut into wedges. Yield: 6 to 8 servings.

IDAHO POTATO SKINS WITH VARIATIONS

4 potatoes; 1/4 C. butter, melted; Salt & pepper
Wash potatoes, dry and prick with a fork. Bake in a 425 degree oven 50 to 60 minutes, until soft. Cool potatoes slightly; cut into quarters (wedge-shaped) and scrape out almost all pulp. Place skin-side down on baking sheet. Brush with melted butter. Salt and pepper to taste. Return to oven and bake 10 minutes longer or until crisp. Serve plain or with either of the following variations. Yield: 16 wedges.

PIZZA SKINS

16 wedges baked potato skins; 1 C. prepared spicy tomato pizza sauce; 1/4 C. grated Parmesan cheese; 1 C. Shredded mozzarella (6 ounces)

Brush or spread pizza sauce over each wedge, sprinkle with Parmesan cheese, top with

mozzarella. Bake 8 to 10 minutes in 425 degree oven until cheese melts. Serve very hot.

CHEDDAR ONION SKINS

16 wedges baked potato skins; 2 Tbsp. butter; 1/2 C. minced onion; 1 C. grated Cheddar cheese; 1/2 C. dry bread crumbs
Melt butter in small skillet; saute onion until golden. Chill. Combine cooked onion, cheese and bread crumbs; sprinkle on top of each wedge. Bake in a 425 degree oven 7 to 10 minutes until cheese melts and is golden. Serve very hot.

Friday morning, the temperature was hovering around the freezing point, and a light drizzle was falling through a very heavy fog. As the drizzle hit the ground, it was instantly freezing, creating a driving hazard.

a fine for a violation. Each violator is assessed the same fine -- regardless -- according to her fine list, she added.

Persons who either refuse or cannot pay a fine will be assessed a jail term to lay out the fine, the Judge explained. She very often allows violators to 'pay out' the fines in installments, in an attempt to not create 'undue hardships' on wage earners.

Sometimes, she added, there are persons who simply refuse to pay a fine, and in such cases, these violators are assessed jail terms.

Since October 21, 1980, an agreement has been of record which is between the City of Mulshoe and Bailey County.

According to the agreement, the City of Mulshoe will provide all radio dispatching and teletype service to Bailey County in exchange for jail privileges for city prisoners.

In the event there is controversy between the city and county, notification can be made in writing.

City Manager Dave Marr said he wrote a letter to Bailey County Judge Gordon H. Green on Friday, December 11, indi-

cating a controversy does exist.

At presstime, Judge Green had made no formal reply to the letter, according to the city manager.

Despite the fact that another reporter had told *The Lubbock Avalanche-Journal* that Sheriff Henderson could not accept city prisoners because the county will not give him enough money to feed them, Judge Green released the following figures:

In 1986, money spent to feed all prisoners in the Bailey County jail amounted to \$9,469.40. In 1987, for the year beginning October 1, 1986, and concluding September 30, 1987, \$9,000 had been budgeted to feed prisoners. Records show that an actual \$8,092.66 had been spent to feed prisoners, consuming only 90 percent of the budgeted amount, and providing an excess of \$907.34.

Budgeted for 1988, for the year that began October 1, 1987, Judge Green said \$9,500 had been set aside to feed prisoners.

Judge Green acknowledged that there appears to be a problem of some type, which he "will be addressing this week-end."

In the meantime, dispatching and teletype services are continuing for the sheriff's office and Chief Holmes said they have every intention of honoring the existing contract.

"The officers feel very frustrated," said the Chief. "They are doing their job, but when they see violators just being turned back onto the streets, they are becoming more and more frustrated."

In the meantime, the Bailey County jail has had '0' prisoners for most of the past 10 days or so, and the controversy does not appear to be resolved at presstime.

Fire Department Safety Tips

FIREPLACE HAZARDS
With the increased cost of fuel, people are using their fireplaces more often. And with chilly days and nights upon us it is a good time to update your safety habits. It is estimated that 6,000 people each year receive emergency treatment from injuries associated with fireplaces. Most of these injuries are cuts, and bruises caused by handling wood, irons and other equipment. The most serious injuries are burns, and most of the victims are children.

The typical accident patterns associated with fireplaces include:

1. Clothing ignition from the open flames.
2. Sparks from the fire landing on nearby flammable

material.

3. Flammable liquids to kindle or rekindle the fire.
4. Carbonmonoxide poisoning caused by inadequate ventilation.

5. Improper supervision of children.

The following suggestions are offered for the safer use of fireplaces

1. Check the fireplace to see if it is constructed for a fire inside it.
2. Never use fuels near a fire, explosive vapors can travel with the length of a house and even further.
3. Keep the damper open while the fireplace is being used to prevent accumulation of poisonous or explosive gases.
4. Don't use coal, charcoal, or polystyrene packing in a fireplace.
5. Don't let children play in or near the fireplace.
6. Make sure the fire is out completely before retiring for the night.

This is a small amount of things we can do to have a safer Holiday Season.
